Narrative:

On 10-31-17 at about 1112 hours, I was assigned to the Riverside Police Department's METRO/SWAT Team. On the above date and time, I heard Riverside Police Dispatch broadcast a radio call of a subject at Castle View Elementary (6201 Shaker Dr.) causing a disturbance about staff not releasing his daughter to him. The subject was identified as S/Kennon. Shortly after the initial broadcast, Police Dispatch advised S/Kennon had made his way into the school, battered teachers and forced the victim into classroom A1. Police Dispatch advised S/Kennon had taken the victim hostage in classroom A1, was barricading the doors and deploying smoke inside the classroom. S/Kennon was described as a Black male adult, in his 20's, tall and thin, with short hair and tattoos on his arms. He was last seen wearing a dark colored shirt, dark pants and carrying two backpacks with unknown items inside.

Based on the above information, Sgt. Dehdashtian and I retrieved the Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) from the RPD Hangar and responded to Castle View Elementary. We arrived on scene at about 1145 hours with the ARV and met up with other members of the METRO/SWAT Team at the back gate to the school. Detective Serrato took over the operation of the ARV and he drove it into the school with METRO/SWAT personnel aboard. Detective Serrato positioned the ARV to the front of classroom A1.

As a member of the METRO/SWAT Team, I was assigned to the emergency react team (ERT) utilizing the Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) to the front of classroom A1. That designated emergency react team comprised of Sgt. Dehdashtian, Officer S. Macias, Officer Monreal, Officer Soria, Officer Wright, Officer Pap, Officer Carmona, Officer Glover, Officer Weddle, Officer Moulton, K-9 Officer Larkin and I. Our objective for the emergency react team was to react to any exigent circumstances inside classroom A1, where S/Kennon had taken the victim hostage. Due to the nature of the crime and the potential for S/Kennon being armed, we utilized the ARV for ballistic cover during the incident. As a part of the ERT, I was tasked with deploying a light sound diversionary device in the event a crisis entry needed to be made into classroom A1.

As the incident unfolded, Emergency Negotiators attempted to establish communication with S/Kennon. At about 1416, a throw phone mission was planned and put into effect. I was assigned to carry a ballistic shield and provide ballistic protection for operators on the throw phone team. As we moved up to the front door of the classroom, I saw an approximate 20 feet trail of blood leading from just outside the classroom door to the lunch tables. After successfully deploying the throw phone just outside the front door to classroom A1, the team moved back to the ARV and transitioned back to a member of the ERT.

For several more hours, Emergency Negotiators continued to establish communication with S/Kennon and resolve the situation through negotiations. Eventually communications broke down and at about 1720 hours, I learned from Emergency Negotiators that it had been about an hour since the victim had been heard inside the classroom and they believed she continued to be in danger. As a result, a plan was made to make entry into the classroom and rescue the hostage from harms way.

I was assigned to deploy a light and sound diversionary device at the front door of A1 on the command of "Divert." The deployment of the light and sound diversionary device was intended to cause a distraction at the front door as another ERT forced their way into the classroom through the accordion style door between classrooms A1 and A6. I was also assigned to the secondary ERT, in the event the other ERT had a failed breach. The secondary ERT was tasked with making crisis entry into classroom A1 through the front door in the event of a failed breach by the other ERT.

At about 1745 hours, I heard Sgt. McCoy broadcast the command of "Divert," at which time I deployed a light

and sound diversionary device towards the front door of classroom A1. Shortly after, I heard several gunshots coming from inside the room. I then heard Sgt. McCoy broadcast "failed breach" and we moved up to the front door of the classroom. Along with Officers S. Macias, Monreal, Soria and Pap, I made entry into classroom A1. Once inside the classroom, I could see the room was clouded by smoke, and the desks and chairs had been moved around in an attempt to barricade the access points into the room.

I searched the room for the victim until I heard someone from the other ERT say, "The victim is out." At that point, I searched the room for the suspect and heard Officer Monreal say that he had located S/Kennon on the ground by the accordion wall separating classrooms A1 and A6. I observed Officers Monreal and Pap take S/Kennon into custody and request medical aid over the radio.

I went outside and began assisting with setting up a crime scene. After the incident, I gathered my gear and responded to an area near the cafeteria for instructions from supervisors. I was instructed by Lieutenant Dinco to go to RPD Magnolia Station for further instructions. At about 2030 hours, I was directed by Sgt. Dehdashtian and Sgt. McCoy that we were clear to leave the station and go home.
