1 **Narrative:**

2  
3 On 10-31-17, at approximately 1112 hours, partner Officer Wright and I were in an  
4 unmarked vehicle in the area of Central and Streeter, when we heard a call come out  
5 of a possible hostage situation and Castle View Elementary School. Officer Wright and I  
6 immediately responded to Castle View Elementary School. See initial report for call  
7 details.  
8

9 Upon arriving on scene, there was an emergency react team comprised of patrol  
10 officers set up behind cover directly across from classroom A1. Classroom A1 was  
11 identified as the classroom where the suspect had taken the victim hostage. I inserted  
12 myself into the emergency react team, and became the designated less lethal option.  
13 I was equipped with a 40mm launcher with sponge rounds. As additional SWAT  
14 personnel arrived on scene, they began to replace the emergency react team.  
15

16 When the ARV arrived on scene, I was designated to move to the ARV to become part  
17 of the primary tactical emergency react team (ERT 1). I coordinated with Sgt. Angulo  
18 and made him the designated less lethal option, and left to join SWAT personnel at the  
19 ARV.  
20

21 Once at the ARV, officer Pap and I were designated as the primary breachers for ERT 1.  
22 All SWAT personnel that were part of ERT 1 made entry into the ARV, and the ARV was  
23 moved to the front of classroom A1. The ERT comprised of patrol personnel was  
24 replaced by ERT 1.  
25

26 While at the ARV, I maintained my assignment as designated breacher in the event of a  
27 crisis entry.  
28

29 At approximately 1416 hours, I was assigned to the throw phone mission team. The  
30 throw phone mission team was comprised of Officer Park, Officer Macias, Officer  
31 Monreal and I. My task was to provide lethal cover while we executed the throw  
32 phone mission. The throw phone mission was successfully executed; the phone was  
33 placed near the front door of classroom A1.  
34

35 After completing the throw phone mission I resumed my role as the designated  
36 breacher for ERT 1.  
37

38 At approximately 1745 hours, after unsuccessful negotiations, a plan was made to make  
39 entry into classroom A1 to rescue the victim. ERT 2 was designated as the primary entry  
40 team, and ERT 1 was the secondary entry team in the event of a failed breach.  
41

42 Upon Sargent McCoy's command to divert, the crisis entry commenced. I heard the  
43 sound of a light and sound diversionary device being deployed followed by what

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1 sounded like several gun shots (unknown exact number) coming from inside the  
2 classroom. Immediately after, Sgt. McCoy said "failed breach" over the radio. I moved  
3 from behind the ARV up to the front door of the classroom with ERT 1. Officer Pap  
4 attempted to open the door with keys, but the door would not open. Officer Pap  
5 immediately transitioned to a forced breach and set the pick inside the crack of the  
6 door between the lock and the door frame. Using the ram I hammered the pick  
7 between the lock and the door frame. Once the pick was hammered in, Officer Pap  
8 pried open the classroom door.

9  
10 With the door open, I made entry into the classroom. Once inside I could see the room  
11 was filled with smoke and there were desks and chairs moved around in what looked  
12 like an attempt to obstruct our passage through the classroom. I immediately began to  
13 look for the victim and suspect. While moving through the classroom I heard someone  
14 yell that the suspect was near the far corner of the classroom (south/west corner). I  
15 worked my way towards the southwest corner and observed the suspect lying face  
16 down on the ground between the sliding/retracting wall and a pile of desks and chairs.  
17 I immediately noticed there was a large pair of scissors on the ground to the left of the  
18 suspects head. I held lethal cover on the suspect while officers detained him and  
19 check him for injuries.

20  
21 Medical personnel were summoned to the scene, and the suspect was immediately  
22 provided medical aid.

23  
24 After the incident, I was instructed to go to the Magnolia Police station to await further  
25 instructions. I responded to the upstairs training room of the Magnolia Police station.  
26 After approximately an hour, Sgt. McCoy cleared us from the incident.
