**Evidence:**

**Narrative:**

On 02-20-2017, 2330 hours, I was contacted over the phone by Detective Mike Medici who informed me of an officer involved shooting that occurred on MacArthur Road in the City of Riverside. Detective Medici requested that I respond to the scene to assist with the investigation.

I arrived on-scene and met with Detective Rick Cobb, Detective Jim Brandt, Detective Rick Wheeler, Detective Adrian Tillett and Sergeant Troy Banks. The shooting incident was still in progress and a crime scene had been established by responding patrol officers. METRO Officers had begun to arrive on-scene to conduct a search for the outstanding suspect who had fired a handgun at Riverside Police Department patrol officers. Detective Rick Cobb was assigned as the case agent of the incident. Detective Cobb provided the investigators with a brief explanation as to what had occurred up to our arrival. Detective Cobb requested that partner Detective Adrian Tillett and respond to the Magnolia Street police station to interview several witnesses to the incident.

Upon arrival to the Magnolia Street Station, Detective Cobb informed Detective Tillett and I that W-1 [REDACTED] was a front passenger in a parked vehicle that was talking with the suspect just prior to the shooting. Detective Cobb also informed us that an additional female witness, later identified as [REDACTED] was standing outside [REDACTED] vehicle just prior to the shooting. Detective Tillett and I were assigned to interview [REDACTED]

The interviews with [REDACTED] took place in the Magnolia Station interview room which was audio and video recorded. Detective Tillett prepared a supplemental report regarding the interview with [REDACTED]. This supplemental report will cover the interview with [REDACTED]. The following is a summary of the interview with [REDACTED]

Detective Tillett informed [REDACTED] that he was not under arrest and was free to leave the station at any time. Detective Tillett told [REDACTED] that we were investigating an officer involved shooting and we believed that he [REDACTED] may have witnessed the incident. [REDACTED] was not handcuffed during the interview. The door to the interview room was closed and unlocked.

Detective Tillett started the interview by asking [REDACTED] who the subject was that was standing on the driver's side of his vehicle, in the street, and who appeared to be talking to his friend that was sitting in the driver's seat. [REDACTED] said, "I don't know that guy like that. I was there with [REDACTED] that was it. I brought [REDACTED] to the house to drink and stuff like that. I don't know who that dude is." [REDACTED] said he and [REDACTED] were waiting outside in the car for [REDACTED] to show up. [REDACTED] and the suspect arrived at the house together and walked to their car. [REDACTED] began talking with [REDACTED] who was standing outside the passenger side of the car and the suspect began talking to [REDACTED] who was sitting in the driver's seat of their car.

█ estimated that they had been talking for about five minutes when he noticed the marked black and white police car turn left onto MacArthur Road from Hawthorne Street. █ told everyone at the car that the cops were coming.

█ continued to deny knowing the name or moniker of the suspect. █ described the suspect as being "a big dude" wearing a black hat. █ did not know if █ knew the suspect or not. █ said the suspect was talking with █ while he talked with █ are currently in a dating relationship.

I asked █ if he saw █ arrive to the residence in a vehicle. █ saw several vehicles arrive at the house but did not know which car █ had come from or if the suspect was a passenger in one of the vehicles. █ believed █ and the suspect arrived to the residence together because they (█ and suspect) walked to their parked vehicle together.

As the police car approached their parked car, the officer driving the police car got out of the car and began walking toward the suspect. █ heard some words exchanged between the suspect and the officer driving the police car. █ saw the suspect began running away towards the front of their parked car near a driveway to a house. █ saw the officer driving the police car begin shooting at the suspect. █ saw the suspect fall on the ground in the driveway. █ said he ducked after the shooting started and did not see anyone else shooting other than the initial officer driving the police car. █ said he did not see the suspect with a gun. █ first heard about 3 to 5 gunshots, a pause and then another volley of several gunshots.

At this point in the interview I showed █ a hand drawn map (evidence item JBS001) that I had made during the interview with █ showed me on the map where their car is parked in relation to the officer's vehicle prior to the shooting. █ also showed me where he had first observed the police car turn from Hawthorne Street.

I began talking with █ about the identity of the shooter. I asked █ when the last time he met the suspect. █ said he has seen the suspect before hanging out in the driveway of █ residence. █ continued to deny knowing the name or moniker of the suspect. I continued to question █ about the suspect's identity.

At about 24 minutes into the interview █ told us that the suspect is █ and goes by the moniker of "Mars" which is short for his first name. I asked █ what gang "Mars" is from. █ said that he is from "Arlanza". I asked █ if his true name is Marcelino Garcia. █ said he only knows him as Mars.

I was previously a gang detective at the Riverside Police department for 7 years. Prior to becoming a gang detective, I worked as an officer in the gang unit for 2 years. I also grew up in the Arlanza community and have testified as a gang expert on the Arlanza gang over 20 times. I am very familiar with the Arlanza gang and know many of their members. I have previously contacted Marcelino Garcia on several occasions and knew that his gang moniker was Mars. I am not aware of any other Arlanza gang member that has used Mars as a moniker, other than Marcelino Garcia.

I asked [REDACTED] why Mars was out running around with a gun. [REDACTED] said Mars is a two striker and he doesn't know why Mars had a gun. [REDACTED] said that Mars has made previous statements that he was not going back to prison. I asked [REDACTED] if Mars said anything just prior to the shooting when [REDACTED] saw the police car and told everyone that the cops were coming. [REDACTED] heard Mars say, "I am not going back to jail." I asked [REDACTED] if he heard the cops say anything before Mars started to run away. [REDACTED] said he heard one of the officers say, "stop" but couldn't make out what else the police said. [REDACTED] believed they were giving Mars some commands but he could not hear what the commands were. It was obvious to [REDACTED] that the police officers had focused their attention on Mars because he began to run away from their car.

I asked [REDACTED] if it was obvious to him that they were Riverside Police Officers. [REDACTED] said it was obvious they were police officers because they were driving a black and white police car and he could clearly see that they were wearing regular patrol officer uniforms. [REDACTED] also remembered that one of the officers used his spotlight to shine in their direction. [REDACTED] said he was the first one in their group to notice the police officers. [REDACTED] then stood up and also noticed the police by saying, "hey it is the cops." [REDACTED] said that he did not know Mars had a gun. Mars never showed him a gun or ever mention that he had a gun. [REDACTED] was confident that Mars knew it was the police based on him saying the cops were coming and then Mars saying that he was not going back to prison. [REDACTED] said Mars then began walking away from the police towards the front of their parked car when the police began giving him commands like "stop." [REDACTED] also believed he heard Mars say something about being rolled up on." When the shooting first started, [REDACTED] said he saw Mars fall to the ground and begin crawling in the driveway of the residence directly in front of their parked car. It was at this time that [REDACTED] ducked and heard the second volley of gunshots. He was not looking at this time and did not know who was shooting but assumed it was the police officers.

[REDACTED] said he remained inside the car a few minutes until police officers approached their car and ordered them out. [REDACTED] did not know if it was the first initial officers or other officers that had arrived on-scene that took them out of their parked vehicle.

[REDACTED] again mentioned that he has previously heard Mars say, "I am not going back. I am done. I am not going back." I asked [REDACTED] if Mars ever said that he would shoot it out with the cops. [REDACTED] said, "I assumed that because several times he said I am not going back to jail. He is still in the game and that only means one thing. I have had homeboys do that though."

At this point in the interview I stepped out of the room in order to obtain a recent photograph of Marcelino Garcia. Detective Tillet continued to speak with [REDACTED] about his [REDACTED] background and previous arrest history.

I stepped back into the interview room and showed [REDACTED] a previous booking photograph of Marcelino Garcia. [REDACTED] identified Marcelino Garcia as the person he knows as Mars. [REDACTED] said he has only known Mars for a few weeks and knows that he is [REDACTED]. The interview was ended at this

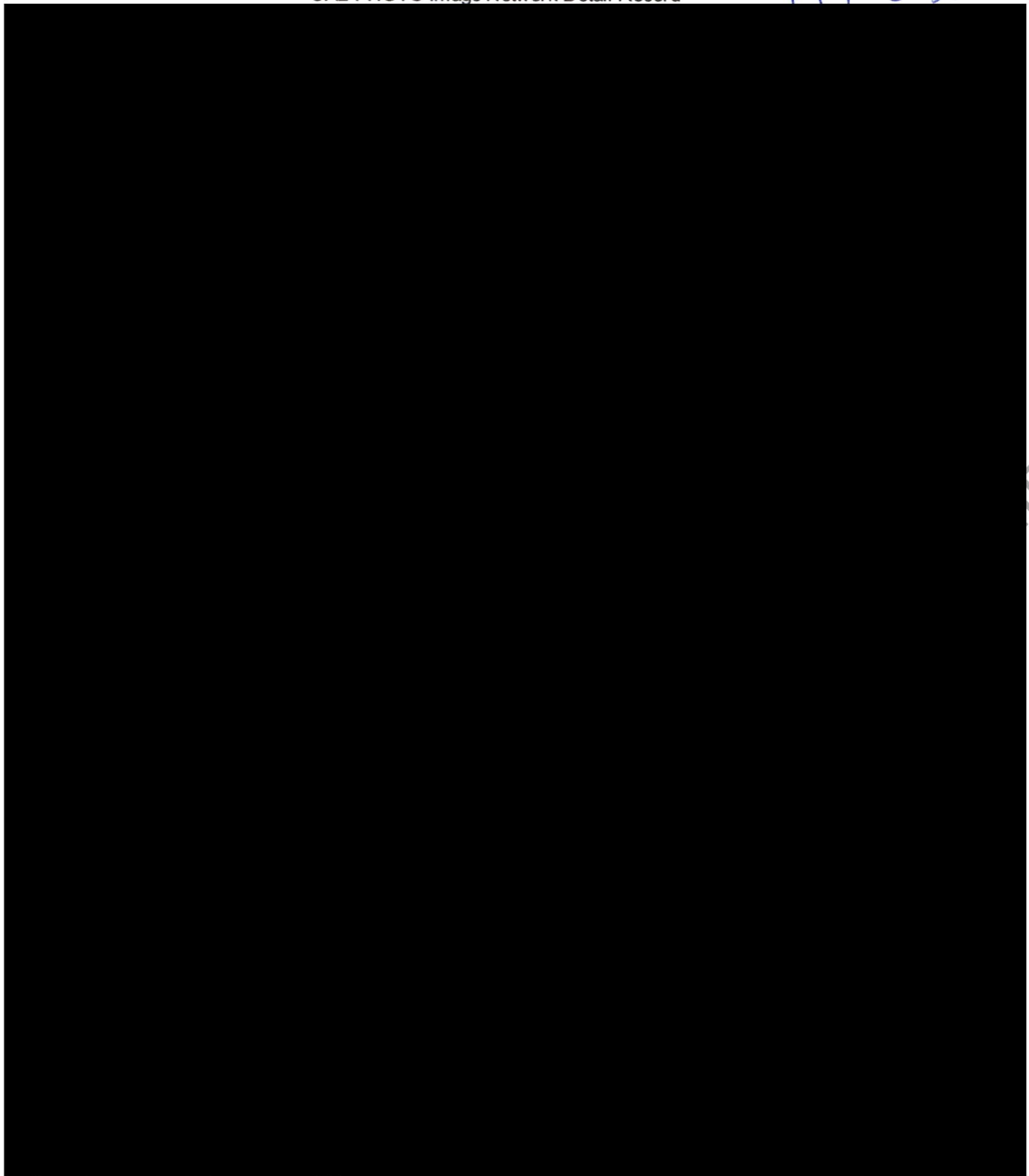
