1 **INVESTIGATION:**

2 **Interview of Officer Brittney Reimer**

3 On 07-23-18 at approximately 1400 hours, partner Detective Beler and I interviewed Officer
4 Reimer in the Conference Room at the Magnolia Police Station. The interview was recorded on
5 my Department issued digital recorder and later downloaded. The following is a summary of that
6 interview.

8 Officer Reimer said on the day of the incident she was assigned to the West PAC Team and
9 was riding with partner Officer Aaron Hernandez in an all-black Police Explorer with take down
10 lights. Her uniform of the day was black BDU's, black t-shirt, and a pull over vest. She said at the
11 time the call came out over the radio she was in the PACT Office. She heard Air1 put out over
12 channel one that a shooting had occurred in Hemet and that officers were in pursuit of the suspect
13 on the 215 freeway heading towards Van Buren Blvd.

15 Officer Reimer said she and her team believed that the suspect may be heading towards the
16 city so they got their gear ready and when they heard that the suspect had in fact exited Van Buren
17 Blvd. they headed out to assist. She grabbed her rifle and jumped in the front passenger seat of
18 the unit that Officer Hernandez was driving. Officer Reimer said they monitored the pursuit and
19 tried to anticipate where the suspect may have been going. They traveled from Tyler St. to Van
20 Buren Blvd. to westbound Victoria Ave. where they heard the suspect was in the area Dufferin
21 Ave. and Van Buren Blvd.

23 Officer Reimer said they came to the intersection of Victoria Ave. and Harrison St. They
24 stopped at the intersection because they heard the suspect was heading northbound Harrison St.
25 towards Victoria Ave. At the intersection both she and Officer Hernandez got out of their vehicle
26 and stood in the doorways. She had her rifle and Officer Hernandez had his handgun. They
27 covered down on the intersection in case the suspect started to shoot at them. She knew that the
28 suspect had shot at officers in Hemet and in the area of Van Buren Blvd. and Barton Rd.

1 Officer Reimer said during the pursuit the suspect was driving extremely erratic, in speeds in
2 excess of 100 mph, swerving into lanes, running stop signs and red lights, and driving down the
3 wrong side of the road. Officer Reimer believed the suspect was very dangerous and posed a
4 dangerous risk to the community and to other officers. After the suspect drove through the
5 intersection of Victoria Ave. and Harrison St., multiple police units passed through the intersection
6 as well. Officer Reimer and Officer Hernandez continued to try to anticipate where the suspect
7 was heading so they could intersect him. They continued northbound Jackson St., to eastbound
8 California Ave., through Jefferson St., and to the area of California Ave. and Arlington Ave. near
9 Streeter Ave.

10
11 Officer Reimer said as they were getting closer to the intersection she heard that the suspect
12 was heading westbound Arlington Ave. in the eastbound lanes which to her was a huge danger
13 because the suspect was driving straight into a traffic jam. Detective Beler asked Officer Reimer
14 what she had meant by intersecting the suspect and what their plan was. Officer Reimer said they
15 wanted to stop the suspect from hurting anybody. They knew the suspect was armed, and had
16 shot at officers, so they didn't want the suspect to shoot at any other officers or members of the
17 community. Officer Reimer described the suspect vehicle as a newer model silver Chrysler
18 convertible.

19
20 Officer Reimer said she saw the suspect vehicle heading westbound on Arlington Ave. in the
21 eastbound lanes of traffic. As they approached Arlington Ave. she saw a crown Victoria police unit
22 in the right turn pocket near Del Taco. She again saw the suspect vehicle traveling westbound in
23 the eastbound lanes. She then saw that it was Officer O'Farrell's vehicle that was parked in front
24 of them. They stopped twenty feet short of Officer O'Farrell's vehicle. Officer Reimer said she saw
25 Officer O'Farrell get out of his car and she heard a shot. She couldn't remember if it was
26 immediately before, or right after Officer O'Farrell got out of his car, but she heard a shot. She then
27 saw Officer O'Farrell running. She and Officer Hernandez exited their unit and ran to meet up with
28 Officer O'Farrell near the suspect vehicle.

1 Officer Reimer said at that point she went to Officer O'Farrell's left. She said she could see
2 multiple cars in front of her. They (she and the other officers) were taking cover behind a silver
3 Camry. She saw a larger SUV, maybe a suburban, in her peripheral vision. She brought her rifle
4 up to see where the suspect was because at that point she believed the suspect vehicle was
5 stopped. She heard commands being given but she couldn't remember exactly what was said, but
6 it was something to the effect of "Let me see your hands. Let me see your hands." As she was
7 bringing her rifle up she stopped for a second and then heard a shot. She then heard someone
8 say the suspect was down.

9
10 Officer Reimer said at that point she could see that the driver in the suburban was trying to get
11 away, which was understandable because all of the cars were jammed together. Officer Reimer
12 said after she heard the shot she did not see the suspect. She held her position to see if the
13 suspect was going to pop back up. Officer Reimer said she believed it was Officer O'Farrell who
14 had shot because he was standing right next to her and that was where she heard the shot coming
15 from. Officer Reimer said she heard two shots total.

16
17 Detective Beler asked Officer Reimer if she had seen any other civilians. Officer Reimer said
18 there was a jam of cars because the suspect had went the wrong way on Arlington Ave. There
19 were also cars going the correct direction on the westbound lanes of Arlington Ave., so there were
20 a lot of cars in her view. She also specifically saw the male driver of the suburban who appeared
21 to be scared during the incident. Officer Reimer said when she initially brought her rifle up to
22 acquire the suspect her attention turned toward the driver of the suburban so she never got a good
23 look at the suspect other than possibly his silhouette in the driver's seat.

25 Officer Reimer said when she heard the first shot and saw Officer O'Farrell running towards the
26 suspect, she didn't actually see who fired the shot; she only heard it. Officer Reimer said she did
27 not fire her weapon during the incident. Officer Reimer said she did not have her body camera on
28 because it was in the charging dock in her office at the Magnolia Police Station when the call when
29 out. She just grabbed her rifle and ran out of the office. This concluded the interview.
