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Description

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Assignment:

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On Friday, July 20, 2018, at about 2045 hours, Sergeant LeClair contacted me by telephone and directed me to assist with this investigation. I responded to the I-215 north, at the Van Buren Blvd. exit and met with Sergeant LeClair. Investigator Mejia was also present when I arrived. This location is in the County of Riverside, in the State of California.

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Details:

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Sergeant LeClair directed Investigator Mejia to search the northbound on-ramp to Van Buren for evidence, such as expended cartridge cases and projectiles. Investigator Mejia processed the scene with the assistance Riverside County Sheriff's Forensics, refer to his supplemental report for details.

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Sergeant LeClair told me that Sergeant Morovich and Deputy Ray assisted the Hemet Police Department that night, while they pursued a vehicle that was possibly related to a shooting in the City of Hemet. He explained that Sergeant Morovich and Deputy Ray were shot at by the suspect, but they both said they did not fire their guns at the suspect. Sergeant LeClair also told me that Deputy Thomas was stopped at the northbound on-ramp to Van Buren Blvd. when the suspect drove by. The suspect shot at Deputy Thomas and the other units as he drove by, but Deputy Thomas did not return fire. I did not interview Sergeant Morovich, Deputy Ray, or Deputy Thomas that night. 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I spoke to Sergeant Morovich, Deputy Ray and Deputy Thomas while out at the scene and directed them to show me their firearms and magazines, so I could conduct a visual inspection. I took photographs of the firearms and the magazines as I inspected them. I then handed the guns

and magazines back when I finished my inspection. I subsequently placed the photographs onto a CD and placed the CD into evidence as indicated in the evidence section.

Sergeant Morovich:

Sergeant Morovich had a Sig Sauer V-tech, 9mm, semi-automatic handgun (serial #58C200069). He had one (21) round magazine in the gun, and two additional (21) round magazines on his Sheriff Department load bearing vest. The magazines were loaded to capacity, and there was a round in the chamber. There were no rounds missing, which is consistent with the statement that Sergeant Morovich did not fire his weapon that night.

Deputy Ray:

Deputy Ray had a Sig Sauer P220, .45 caliber, semi-automatic handgun (serial #37B009364). He had (1) eight round magazine loaded into the gun with a single .45 caliber round in the chamber. Deputy Ray had (2) additional eight round magazines on his duty belt, and an additional (4) eight round magazines in his Sheriff Department load bearing vest. Every magazine was loaded to capacity. There were no rounds missing, which is consistent with the statement that Deputy Ray did not fire his weapon that night.

Deputy Thomas:

 Deputy Thomas had a Glock 21, .45 caliber, semi-automatic handgun (serial #GFZ965). He had (1) thirteen round magazine loaded into the gun with a single .45 caliber round in the chamber. Deputy Thomas had (4) additional thirteen round magazines on his duty belt. Every magazine was loaded to capacity, there were no rounds missing. This is consistent with the statement that Deputy Thomas did not fire his weapon that night.

I left the scene that night at approximately 0030 hours and did not have additional involvement in this investigation.
