The following supplemental report is regarding the "Officer Involved Shooting" investigation at 9931 Willowbrook St., Jurupa Valley, California, on 03/08/18. The suspect in this case was identified as Ernie Saldivar, of Riverside, California.

The purpose of this supplemental report is to incorporate a (21) page transcript of Officer S. Lopez's interview on 03/09/18. The interview with Officer Lopez was conducted within the Executive Conference Room of the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station. Present during this interview, was Investigator Johnson and I, as well as RPOA Attorney Saku Ethir and Officer Lopez. A digital audio recording was made of the interview and then later downloaded onto the above listed Digital Media Disc (G001), of which was later booked into evidence at the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station.

Officer Lopez's interview was subsequently submitted to Bureau of Office Services Inc. for transcription. The transcripts were then later sent to me electronically, at which time I reviewed and compared the digital recording to the transcription for inaccuracies, of which I then corrected when necessary. (Refer to attached transcript for further details)

Prior to being interview, Officer Lopez was digitally photographed and charted by Investigator Barajas. The charting consisted of the digital photography and documentation of uniforms, equipment and service weapons, as well as the collection and packaging of any evidence items by Forensic Tech Muschell, at the direction and supervision of Investigator Barajas.

The charting of Officer Lopez was done for documentation purposes only, as he never discharged his service weapon during the incident. At the completion of the uniform/weapon chartings, the interviews with the involved officers were arranged and conducted within the same Executive Conference Room, at the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station. (Refer to supplemental reports for further details)

(The following is a summary of Officer Lopez's interview; however, the statements may not be in the order that they were given, as this was done to aid in the clarity of the report. For further details, refer to the attached transcripts and audio recordings for a complete account of the interview)

SUMMARY OF RPD OFFICERS. LOPEZS INTERVIEW ON 03/09/18:

In summary, Officer Lopez agreed to provide me a voluntary statement as to his involvement in the "Officer Involved Shooting." Officer Lopez stated he had 17 years of law enforcement experience and no military experience. For the last 8 months, he has been assigned to the Riverside Police Department's "Metro Team" the full time SWAT Team, but he had only been with them the last 3 days. On the date of this incident, Officer Lopez stated he was assigned to assist with a surveillance operation on a known and wanted East Side Riva gang member named Ernie Saldivar.

Officer Lopez stated he was familiar with Saldivar and how he was wanted for the attempted murder of his girlfriend and for being a "Parolee at Large" with a warrant from the Department of Corrections. In addition, Officer Lopez stated he knew the Metro Team had conducted several operations to locate and arrest Saldivar, who was believed to be armed and dangerous. Prior to assisting with the surveillance operation, Officer Lopez stated the involved Metro Team members were briefed on the known facts by Officer Wright, 44 the assigned case agent.

Officer Lopez confirmed the plan was to conduct a surveillance operation to determine whether Saldivar was at the residence in question. Once he was, to the plan was to either make contact or wait until he left the residence and conduct a traffic stop. The only other information Officer Lopez stated he had was in what Officer Wright provided, in the form of a Google Earth images of the residence, 9931 Willowbrook St., in Jurupa Valley, along with some digital photos of Saldivar.

Once the briefing was completed, Officer Lopez stated he drove out with Officer's Wright and Soria in an unmarked Dodge Caravan, while Officer's Pap and Park drove a marked black and white RPD patrol unit and Officer Monreal drove another unmarked Honda Accord. Once near the residence, Officer Lopez stated Officer Wright took point on the residence from the west, while Officer's Pap and Park were somewhere nearby and out of sight. As for Officer Monreal, he was east of the residence on Willowbrook St.

Once on scene and in position, they quickly got sight of two Hispanic males and a female in the open garage area of the residence and one of the males looked to be Saldivar. Officer Lopez stated he was unsure if it was Saldivar, but he didn't have the binoculars that Officer's Wright and Soria were using, and they seemed confident it was him and he appeared to have matching tattoos around his neck. Officer Lopez added that Saldivar was wearing a black T-shirt and shorts, while the other male was wearing a grey T-shirt.

As soon as Saldivar was confirmed to be in the garage, Officer Lopez stated the information was broadcasted over RPD's Channel 10, the tactical channel that was being used by the Metro Team during the surveillance operation. A short time later, Officer Wright directed Officer Monreal to take point and to relocate to where they were, so they could meet with Officer Pap and Park and come up with a plan to make contact.

Once Monreal was in position, Officer Lopez stated they drove over and met up with Officer's Pap and Park and the decision was to drive in from the east and make contact. Just before they got to the house, Officer Lopez's stated he heard Officer Monreal broadcasting he had sight of the Hispanic male in a grey T-shirt and it looked as if he was going to walk out of the garage.

According to Officer Lopez, this broadcast was made just as they pulled up and parked in front of the house, so they got out as quickly as they could and headed straight for the garage. Officer Lopez estimated that he was about 10ft behind Officer's Wright and Soria, when they turned and entered the garage and that's when he remembered hearing the commands, "Get your hands up. Let me see your hands." Once he was in the garage, Officer Lopez said he saw Saldivar moving from where he was sitting in the southwest corner of the garage and start running north, toward a door on the opposite side.

This is when Officer Lopez stated his attention was drawn toward the Hispanic male in the grey T-shirt and a Hispanic female, who were standing near the left center of the garage. This male and female were later identified as

From that point, Officer Lopez stated his focus was to get control of and and to have them go to the ground, so Officer's Wright and Soria were free to deal with Saldivar. According to Officer Lopez, this is when he heard what he believed were 4-5 gunshots, along with some commands and then a door opening and closing. As to the gunshots, all Officer Lopez would say was he had no idea if Saldivar had started shooting or if it was Officer's Wright and Soria, but he remembered seeing Saldivar running toward

12	later, Officer Park came out and stood watch as he moved in and handcuffed and and

14	Officer Lopez maintained he never saw the shooting and that his primary focus was to deal with the
15	other two subjects who were in the garage, while Officer's Wright, Soria and Park dealt with Saldivar. Once
16	backup units from the Riverside County Sheriff's Department arrived, Officer Lopez stated he entered the
17	laundry room and that's when he got his first look at Saldivar, as he lay face down in the hallway/laundry
	room handcuffed. From there, the only other thing Officer Lopez stated he did, was to assist with safety sweep
	of the residence and nothing else.
21	Prior to ending the interview, Officer Lopez was asked to provide a sketch of what he remembered
22	about the garage and its layout. This sketch was used for reference and clarification purposes only and not to
23	scale or used in any other interviews. A copy of Officer Lopez's sketch (G004) is attached to this report,
24	while the original was later booked into evidence at the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's Station. No other comments
