<p>On Monday, October 31, 2016, at about 0007 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in the City of Riverside. I was in the sergeant's office at the Lincoln Station when I heard Officer B. Brandt radio broadcast that he was in foot pursuit. Officer Brandt requested additional units to respond to the rear businesses behind the CHP station off St. Lawrence and Lincoln. I immediately responded from the Lincoln Station and turned onto St. Lawrence from Lincoln. Officer Brandt broadcasted that the suspect running from him was a male adult wearing a black shirt and blue jeans and he was about to jump a fence that led out to St. Lawrence. The suspect was later identified as S-1/Hayes.</p> <p>I drove slowly south on St. Lawrence expecting S-1/Hayes to run across the street in front of me. Just as I passed Mar Vista Ct. feet behind him. I was about one hundred yards away when I saw them run across the street. I accelerated south on St. Lawrence and stopped where I saw them run into the orange groves on the east side of the street. I could see that S-1/Hayes was walking south along the chain link perimeter fence that ran parallel with St. Lawrence. I shined my spotlight on S-1/ Hayes and positioned my unit just ahead of him. I got out of my unit and yelled at S-1/ Hayes to show me his hands and to get down on the ground. S-1/Hayes looked directly at me and said he could not breath. I again yelled at S-1/Hayes to get down on the ground. He then reluctantly got down on his knees. S-1/Hayes was sweating profusely and looked exhausted. I yelled at him to get all the way down on the ground and put his hands behind his back. S-1/Hayes got in the prone position and had his arms by his side. I held cover on S-1/Hayes as Officer Brandt came out from around the orange tree. I told Officer Brandt that I would cover him while he handcuffed S-1/Hayes.

I was a few feet from S-1/Hayes standing near his head as Officer Brandt positioned himself on S-1/Hayes left side. Officer Brandt tried to control S-1/Hayes hands, but when he grabbed his wrist I could see S-1/Hayes try to arch his back up and to the side. S-1/Hayes said he could not breath. At this point, S-1/Hayes had not been searched and he was wearing baggy clothing that could easily conceal a weapon. I yelled at S-1/Hayes to put his hands behind his back because we were going to handcuff him and then we could roll him over to help his breathing. Officer Brandt tried to handcuff S-1/Hayes but he would not keep his hands behind his back to be handcuffed. Officer Brandt told me he could not handcuff S-1/Hayes because he would have to let go of his one wrist to do so and we did not know if S-1/Hayes had a weapon. I quickly holster my duty weapon and grabbed the right wrist of S-1/Hayes. I immediately felt tension and his muscles rigid in his right arm. I twisted his right arm and used my bodily force to place his right arm behind his back. Officer Brandt was now able to successfully handcuff S-1/Hayes.

Officer Brandt immediately rolled S-1/Hayes over onto his left side. I could see that S-1/Hayes appeared unconscious. His eyes were closed and I could see that he was breathing. I told Officer Brandt to check his pulse and he said he had one. I immediately called for medical aid to respond to the scene and evaluate S-1/Hayes. During the next few minutes I could see S-1/Hayes was breathing and his pulse was continually checked by Officer Lopez. When RFD arrived S-1/Hayes's breathing seemed more labored but he had a pulse. RFD began treating S-1/Hayes for a cardiac arrest. I had Officer Lopez remove the handcuffs to assist the medical treatment. AMR paramedics arrived shortly after RFD and immediately transported S-1/Hayes to Parkview Hospital. Officer Brandt rode in the ambulance with S-1/Hayes.

S-1/Hayes was treated at the hospital, however he was pronounced deceased on 10-31-16 at 0054 hours. I had Officer Lopez provide crime scene security where S-1/Hayes was taken into custody and Officer Cuevas hold the scene where the original theft occurred. The foot pursuit path and the surrounding businesses were checked for possible suspects or evidence with negative results.

Detectives Jim Brandt, Mike Medici and Dave Smith from the Robbery/Homicide Unit and Deputy Coroner Ferris were called out to the scene to assume the investigation and process the scene. I briefed the investigators and the scene was turned over to them for further investigation.
