**Narrative:**

On 11-4-08 Detective Brandt and I responded to the Cypress Springs Apartments at 7850 Cypress Ave in the City of Riverside to follow up on the Officer Involved Fatal Incident from 10-31-08. We contacted W/ Sidney Zamora who is the apartment complex manager. The following is a summary of the recorded interview.

W/ Zamora stated he was standing on the balcony of his apartment building and could see a subject, S/ Marlon Acevedo, standing in the middle of Cypress Ave with his hands up, blocking traffic and yelling incoherent things. W/ Zamora did hear S/ Acevedo yelling, "I don't care if you kill me" as he was standing in traffic. W/ Zamora stated he saw a female come from the residence across the street from the apartment complex (S/ Acevedo's residence) and try to get S/ Acevedo out of the street. W/ Zamora stated S/ Acevedo pushed her away and continue what he was doing in the middle of the road. W/ Zamora stated he was concerned for S/ Acevedo's safety, so he called 911.

W/ Zamora stated two officers arrived in a single unit and were in uniform. It was clear to W/ Zamora that the officers that arrived were with the police Department. W/ Zamora stated S/ Acevedo was very aggressive towards the police officers that arrived. W/ Zamora stated he did not see S/ Acevedo hit the police officer, but described his actions as aggressive. W/ Zamora stated S/ Acevedo moved when the police arrived to an area where W/ Zamora could no longer see the incident. W/ Zamora stated he could see the police officers hit S/ Acevedo in his legs with their batons. W/ Zamora stated he could not hear what the officers were saying to S/ Acevedo, but he could see that S/ Acevedo was not cooperating with them. W/ Zamora stated he did not see the officers use the taser. W/ Zamora heard that a taser was used from residents in the apartment complex. W/ Zamora could not see if S/ Acevedo was handcuffed or placed in a Hobble.

W/ Zamora stated the ambulance arrived about 8-10 minutes after the police arrived. W/ Zamora could not see what the medical personnel were doing.

W/ Zamora stated there were a few people standing on the balconies of their apartment while the police were contacting S/ Acevedo. W/ Zamora was not sure which apartments were watching. W/ Zamora stated he did not see anyone on the street watching the incident.

W/ Zamora stated he does have cameras throughout the complex, but they do not record in a very good quality. W/ Zamora stated there is a camera on the west side of the complex that faces towards Cypress Ave. W/ Zamora stated he viewed the video, but was unable to see anything from the incident. I advised W/ Zamora that we need to get a copy of the video. W/ Zamora stated he did not know how to download the video, but he would get someone who can copy the video to a disk.

Detective Brandt and I then contacted the apartments at the northwest portion of the complex (Closest to the incident). The following apartments were not home when we attempted to contact them: 1104, 1301, 1302, 1304, 1305.

I made contact with O/ Raymond Davis in apartment #1101. He stated he was not home at the time of the incident.

16 Q: Yeah.

18 A: Sidney, S-I-D...

22 A: N-E-Y.

24 Q: And your - your middle name.

25  
26 A: G.

27  
28 Q: G?

29  
30 A: (Gerrato), (Gerrado), (Gero).

31  
32 Q: And you last name.

33  
34 A: Zamora.

35  
36 Q: Zamora. And what's your address?

37  
38 A: Uh, 7851 (Cypress) Avenue, Apartment 8203.

39  
40 Q: 8203?

41  
42 A: Yes.

43  
44 Q: All right. And how about a phone number?  
45

46 A: Um [REDACTED].

47

48 Q: Mm-hm.

49

50 A: [REDACTED] That's my personal phone.

51

52 Q: Okay how about a work phone.

53

54 A: Office right here is 951...

55

56 Q: Mm-hm.

57

58 A: 637-7714.

59

60 Q: Okay um, where - where you at when you uh saw?

61

62 A: Okay first I wasn't there, uh at that time because it was uh uh Halloween, and

63 I'm not doing that much on Halloween. So I heard noise like woo - woo, little

64 bit noise I say it bother after me a while, it bother me, somebody is playing

65 around. So I went out. I saw the guy in the middle of the street and you can

66 see from the alley.

67

68 Q: Uh-huh.

69

70 A: With his hands up and stopping traffic.

71

72 Q: Okay.

73

74 A: And then I'm looking like - like that's not normal. So I saw too many cars stop

75 behind him you know.

76

77 Q: He was holding up traffic?

78

79 A: Yes he was holding traffic. So I - I called the cops and told them the situation.

80 I think before me somebody also called.

81

82 Q: Okay did you uh actually walk all the way to the street.

83

84 A: Not at that point, not at that point. Not at...

85

86 Q: Okay where were you at?

87

88 A: On the balcony. This is my apartment right there.

89

90 Q: Okay.

91  
92 A: The balcony right there.  
93  
94 Q: Okay so you were standing...  
95  
96 A: I could see when he was doing that stuff.  
97  
98 Q: Okay. Okay.  
99  
100 A: I saw when you guys show up.  
101  
102 Q: Okay and what did you see when the police showed up?  
103  
104 A: I see when the uh the police show up it was two officers. And they stopped  
105 and they went to him. I don't know what they said to him. I could hear them  
106 saying stop or whatever, or lay down on the floor or whatever, but I - I think  
107 he not response.  
108  
109 Q: Okay. And are you still standing on the balcony or you walked out?  
110  
111 A: Yes. No, I'm still on the balcony.  
112  
113 Q: Okay.  
114  
115 A: What I heard rumors, I don't see directly the guy hit the police but they say -  
116 he hit the police I don't - I didn't see that parts.  
117  
118 Q: Okay. What did you see him do?  
119  
120 A: What I see only when the police that uh he stopped and then I think they said,  
121 you know go to the floor, or something like that, the normal the police, you  
122 know, say. But he was a little crazy.  
123  
124 Q: Okay.  
125  
126 A: I know he was crazy. Now, I think I - the police moved on one side, it looked  
127 like he tried to punch him, I not see that part also. But I think he was kind of  
128 aggressive people, aggressive man.  
129  
130 Q: The guy that was standing out in the street was aggressive toward the police?  
131  
132 A: Yes.  
133  
134 Q: Okay. He was kind of aggressive. Again one that he-he-he went down and-and  
135 the police went to stop him and handcuffs, I don't see that. Just you can go on



136 my balcony the thing already happens, that - that - that little blue house right  
137 here. This one right here. You can not see more over.  
138  
139 A: Uh-huh okay.  
140  
141 A: But ) I don't know what happens. But I heard rumors, people say about the  
142 whole issue.  
143  
144 Q: Okay.  
145  
146 A: And then uh about one hour officer one - one officer came to me, asked me  
147 the some question. If my camera's working all the way there.  
148  
149 Q: Mm-hm.  
150  
151 A: My camera's not even strong. It cannot go all the way nighttime. It's only go  
152 through the metal, the gates right here.  
153  
154 Q: Mm-hm.  
155  
156 A: And more maybe like 10 feet more over.  
157  
158 Q: Okay.  
159  
160 A: It's much as you can see at the night time. It's really, really, really bad video  
161 we have the cameras.  
162  
163 Q: Okay so when you're standing on your balcony you see two police officers  
164 arrive.  
165  
166 A: Mm-hm.  
167  
168 Q: Um you see the guy in the - in the street, prior to that he was standing out  
169 there holding up traffic.  
170  
171 A: Mm-hm.  
172  
173 Q: Did you see him being aggressive with any of the people out there or just?  
174  
175 A: Well the way he was standing - he saying a lot of weird things about to care to  
176 kill, I don't care if you kill me. I don't care, uh, something like stupid things.  
177 You know, like normal things. He wants - he wants somebody confer to him,  
178 put it this way.  
179  
180 Q: So he was saying, "I don't care if you kill me," and stuff like that?

181  
182 A: Yes, something like that. So I didn't want to go there, because he probably kill  
183 me.  
184  
185 Q: And is that when you called 911?  
186  
187 A: Yes that's when I called 911. I told the lady who I am and my phone number  
188 to.  
189  
190 Q: Okay.  
191  
192 A: And then the police arrive - arrived?  
193  
194 A: The police arrive and I want to say they said get out and...  
195  
196 Q: Okay.  
197  
198 A: And I think I could of - little see what the people- police are trying to hit the  
199 guy in the knees, the guy but him was not - I think he was not listening to  
200 them to go down to arrest him. He didn't want to respond that.  
201  
202 Q: Okay so that he - the - the guy that was out there, he wasn't listening to the  
203 police to get down on the ground so you saw them hit - hit him with?  
204  
205 A: What - what I exactly I mean uh I don't want to see the hun - because I didn't  
206 see 100 percent the view, to be honest with you.  
207  
208 Q: Uh-huh.  
209  
210 A: I know the guy was aggressive. I know the guy (unintelligible) something in  
211 his mind, I don't know maybe drugs or alcohol. I don't know what he has in  
212 his system at that moment.  
213  
214 Q: Okay.  
215  
216 A: But he was aggressive. He was going crazy.  
217  
218 Q: Okay.  
219  
220 A: I believe he was kind of aggressive with the police officer also.  
221  
222 Q: So you didn't see him actually strike the police officer but you saw the police  
223 officer strike him?  
224

225 A: Yeah. Yeah I - I because he was on that side of the site and I could not see  
226 him. I could see only the police on this side.  
227  
228 Q: Uh-huh.  
229  
230 A: But I believe he was abusive-he was aggressive with the police.  
231  
232 Q: Okay.  
233  
234 A: Because everybody in the neighbors say that, he was a little crazy.  
235  
236 Q: Okay did you see what the police, you - you said that you saw the police hit  
237 him in the legs. Did you see what they hit him with?  
238  
239 A: No I don't know what they call those, batanas. Whatever they call them?  
240  
241 Q: Batons?  
242  
243 A: Yeah, that's what I saw.  
244  
245 Q: Okay. Okay. Um did you see how many times that they hit him?  
246  
247 A: No.  
248  
249 Q: No.  
250  
251 A: Maybe like three.  
252  
253 Q: Okay. Um did you see anybody else standing out there watching what was  
254 going on?  
255  
256 A: At that time it was a lot of a few people. And the moment he was in the street,  
257 there was not any people. People from my property and the balcony, they  
258 were watching, yes. I think a few people called. I don't know who really  
259 called. And uh - and at that moment there was not many people. When the  
260 police showed up, yes most people came to the street and corners.  
261  
262 Q: Okay. After - after the police had already arrived and the ambulance had took  
263 the guy or while the police was contacting him?  
264  
265 A: No that was when the police came to stop the guy, I see more people on the  
266 corner.  
267  
268 Q: Okay.  
269

270 A: Both sides. Both corners.  
271  
272 Q: Okay. Was there anybody across the street that you saw?  
273  
274 A: Okay. Oh by the way, I saw - I saw you know the lady across the street. I don't  
275 know if it was his mother, it was his sister, or his wife, I don't know. To go up  
276 to him.  
277  
278 Q: Uh-huh.  
279  
280 A: He was crazy. Tried to pull him in to the house.  
281  
282 Q: Okay.  
283  
284 A: But he no respond. He didn't want to listen to her.  
285  
286 Q: And this - was that before the police arrived?  
287  
288 A: Yes, that's police, yeah probably like three or four minutes before the police  
289 showed up.  
290  
291 Q: Okay.  
292  
293 A: Yeah, she went up. Again I don't know it was his sister or mother or  
294 somebody, uh related to him. Try to pull him to the house but he didn't want  
295 to listen to her.  
296  
297 Q: And you saw her - you saw this person come out of that house?  
298  
299 A: Yeah. Yeah. And then try to hold him, you know pull him down. And he was  
300 not - he pushed away and he stayed doing the same thing. He stand - he stands  
301 - he stands up, try to stop the traffic and he let everybody make you know the  
302 - the car noise.  
303  
304 Q: Uh-huh.  
305  
306 A: Then he say, "Fuck you." You know all that stuff annoying.  
307  
308 Q: Okay.  
309  
310 A: And then I see he is (unintelligible), so other people is when I call the police.  
311  
312 Q: Okay. Um now you - you mentioned something earlier about um the - the  
313 electric gun.  
314

315 A: I heard rumors.  
316  
317 Q: Okay you never - you never saw the police do that.  
318  
319 A: I never seen that, sir. I never seen that.  
320  
321 Q: Okay.  
322  
323 A: I see the rumor (unintelligible), the brakes, honest with you, (unintelligible) is  
324 what I heard. I never saw that sir.  
325  
326 Q: You didn't see that. Okay. Um now when the police were arrived did - were  
327 you did you - were you still standing out there when the ambulance arrived?  
328  
329 A: Yes. Yes.  
330  
331 Q: Okay what would you estimate the time is between the time that the police  
332 arrived and that the ambulance arrived?  
333  
334 A: The ambulance take like, it's hard to say, but uh eight, 10 minutes maybe.  
335  
336 Q: Okay from the time the police arrived. How - how - how long would you  
337 estimate that the police were actually fighting with this guy.  
338  
339 A: From the moment - with the moment I called or the moment that they showed  
340 up? Uh...  
341  
342 Q: Yeah when they - when they - when they (unintelligible).  
343  
344 A: Maybe like ten minutes, maybe 18 minutes.  
345  
346 Q: Okay they were fighting with him that long?  
347  
348 A: Yes, I think so.  
349  
350 Q: I mean that's a long time.  
351  
352 A: Again I don't - I don't see when he went down.  
353  
354 Q: Okay.  
355  
356 A: I don't see that part sir. But I see what was little because more police - more  
357 car police show up.  
358  
359 Q: Right.

360  
361 A: And at that -that time more car show up, he already had the handcuff, includes  
362 the second car.

363  
364 Q: Mm-hm.

365  
366 A: It was behind other car, he went to the trunk, I don't know what to get in the  
367 trunk and he went to the front. Again, I don't see what he give it to the cops or  
368 what he did. I don't know.

369  
370 Q: Okay, um so from - from where you were standing you weren't able to see  
371 anything that was going on when the officers and that - and that - and that guy  
372 were on the ground.

373  
374 A: The only (unintelligible) two cops and then (unintelligible) by that time I  
375 didn't see the guy anymore.

376  
377 Q: Okay. Okay.

378  
379 A: And at that time he went down, what they did, they put the handcuff, maybe  
380 they did that. But, again, the shooting, no.

381  
382 Q: Okay.

383  
384 A: I cannot respond that.

385  
386 Q: Um and the - the video cameras around the complex. Do you have any video  
387 cameras out in front? In the front of the complex?

388  
389 A: No sir, no we don't. The only one is, I can show you where they are- what  
390 they are. The big one go down that is like this one you can see that this lens  
391 we have. That lens not too strong, even I speak my - the owner here, change  
392 the future because when somebody has reported stealing cars or parts.

393  
394 Q: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

395  
396 A: The lens you don't see the plate. You see the body, you don't see the plate  
397 number for the cars. It's hard to recognize that.

398  
399 Q: Okay. Okay.

400  
401 A: So they might be change the future but not right now because they spend so  
402 much money to build this property.

403  
404 Q: Sure.

405  
406 A: But they want to change the future. But that camera that was outside, I can  
407 show you my camera here, how far did it go.  
408  
409 Q: It went - we need - we -we need a copy of that video, whether or not it shows  
410 anything or not we just a need a copy of that um - um...  
411  
412 A: That day.  
413  
414 Q: That day during that time of the camera that faces out into the street.  
415  
416 A: I can show you right now what the camera looks like. It's not good.  
417  
418 Q: Right.  
419  
420 A: I look at, I can barely see lights and everything but not (unintelligible) focus  
421 everything.  
422  
423 Q: Okay and that - that - that's fine. I trust you. I believe you on that. And we'll  
424 look at it later. So we don't really need to look at it now. Um but I do need it -  
425 if you can get, make me a copy of that. Um...  
426  
427 A: I don't know how it is. It is a new system. But I will - I will try my best.  
428  
429 Q: Okay.  
430  
431 A: To get a copy for you guys. No problem.  
432  
433 Q: Okay. And I'll leave you my card because if - and if you can't - and if you're  
434 not able - if you can't figure it we have a guy that...  
435  
436 A: The company they come and try to put new cameras in the (unintelligible).  
437 They might be, show me how to do it, copy. It's - it's a DVD.  
438  
439 Q: Yeah.  
440  
441 A: I think you put it there to be played but I have to see, when to the channel  
442 where the camera is. And you know look at the date too.  
443  
444 Q: Right. Right.  
445  
446 A: Okay.  
447  
448 Q: Um yeah if you can, if you can make a copy of that. Is that the only camera?  
449 The just one camera that faces out there.

450  
451 A: The that direction. Yes sir.  
452  
453 Q: Okay if you can make it probably from about 9:30...  
454  
455 A: 9:00.  
456  
457 Q: ...to?  
458  
459 A: Two o'clock?  
460  
461 Q: Was it 9:00 - 9:30.  
462  
463 Q1: What time was the call 2140?  
464  
465 Q: 2146 I think.  
466  
467 Q1: Yeah 9:30 would cover it.  
468  
469 Q: 9:30 to say 10:30 or 11:00.  
470  
471 A: Okay.  
472  
473 Q1: Yeah 10:30 would be good.  
474  
475 Q: 9:30 to 10:30 from that camera. I know it - it probably it - it - even if it doesn't  
476 show anything um we just need the video just so that nobody says later that  
477 we didn't have - we didn't get a copy of that video and then say yeah that it  
478 everything.  
479  
480 A: That's fine. No problem.  
481  
482 Q: Anything else?  
483  
484 Q1: The officers that showed up, you talked about two at first that showed up and  
485 were - were dealing with the guy? Did the officers show up in one car or two  
486 cars?  
487  
488 A: No one car. Two officers one car.  
489  
490 Q1: Okay and the car was, it was obviously a police car? Was it black and white  
491 and looked like a police car?  
492  
493 A: Right.  
494



495 Q1: And their officer's clothes?  
496  
497 A: Yeah it was blue or dark, like blue, navy blue.  
498  
499 Q1: It appeared to be a police uniform to you.  
500  
501 A: Well (unintelligible) yeah officers no question about that.  
502  
503 Q1: Okay and did you ever see that guy with anything in his hands? Anything kind  
504 of weapons in his hands?  
505  
506 A: At that moment, no sir. He was again, he stands up here - well I heard some  
507 rumors, not from me that he's trying to put in his pocket like he have a gun  
508 because he want to do something to his neighbors around here when the car  
509 passed by. Is what my neighbor tell me about it, because I was - yesterday I  
510 heard from a lot of people, what they saw, this is what they know. Because I  
511 know you guys were coming to talk to me about it. Again, me see him to do  
512 that, no. Only see him with the hands up and stopping people and calling f-ing  
513 puto.  
514  
515 Q1: And that was before the police arrived.  
516  
517 A: Oh yeah. That was - the noise was maybe like - maybe 10 - 15 minutes before  
518 people call the police. I was watching TV in my room I heard the- had the  
519 window open all of the time. That way noise (unintelligible) Halloween and  
520 that knucklehead guy-keeps playing games with people, you know. But that's  
521 - but not only after a while I get tired of hearing the noise so I went out there  
522 and I see the guy. I see the other people on their balcony watching him. I say  
523 this guy is weird - why nobody call the police because we know about that.  
524 Especially if you see to much stuff at my house.  
525  
526 Q: Mm-hm. Now and you said at that time you saw him with his hands up.  
527  
528 A: Yes.  
529  
530 Q: When the police arrived did you ever see him with his hands up like  
531 complying with what the officers said.  
532  
533 A: No, no, no, no. He was like - okay when the police show up he was like this in  
534 the alley like this straight in front of his house. And the police park in front  
535 the mail box you can see from my balcony. He walked a little bit backward,  
536 back, from the police (unintelligible). Again, I no see, after that nothing else.  
537  
538 Q1: Nothing, okay.  
539

540 A: But everything I know is from the rumor how the people explain or tell me  
541 about it. You see that I will never (unintelligible) because they will take the  
542 guy to jail and that's okay. You know what I mean I was not I don't see what  
543 the reason was (unintelligible), because it was not - not my business to - to go  
544 there. So if they want to take it over, then after a while when they tell me he  
545 pass away, I was that - I didn't know what happened then. See (unintelligible)  
546 I know - I know in my own mind he has something. This guy has...

547  
548 Q: Right.

549  
550 A: Any kind of drugs I don't know if you know that. Because in the past we have  
551 crime free in the building, you know we go to school with you guys and  
552 everything.

553  
554 Q: Mm-hm.

555  
556 A: His house (unintelligible) in the house, because a lot of people go in the back  
557 in the bushes and - and I don't know what kind of drugs they're into  
558 (unintelligible).

559  
560 Q: Have you had problems with the people over at that house before?

561  
562 A: Yeah, not me directly. But I did see a lot of - a lot of garbage there. I even told  
563 the Officer Dodson- Dixon? He comes here for our meetings sometimes and I  
564 go to the meeting because we are a new apartment. When the lady - I  
565 explained the situation so... They asked me one time to take pictures to a cars  
566 parking here. I thought that was to aggressive for me to do that. They watch  
567 me do that they probably attack me. Because those two guys, one  
568 (unintelligible) over here. I was not aware of that, I come later on  
569 (unintelligible). I know those guys was or they do some drugs. I cannot prove  
570 it to you. I cannot. You know how it is.

571  
572 Q: Yeah.

573  
574 A: They (unintelligible).

575  
576 Q: Do you know of any of your tenants here that you talked to in the last couple  
577 days that actually saw what happened that we could talk to?

578  
579 A: Well the - the people (unintelligible), uh (unintelligible). Mr. uh Rescorl -  
580 Rescorl - Rescorl yeah he was there.

581  
582 Q: Rescorl.

583

584 A: He was there, you know he was the big one. And the people they - they afraid  
585 to talk about it.

586  
587 Q: Mm-hm.

588  
589 A: They (unintelligible) Latinos, you know, (unintelligible). They are afraid of  
590 the police a lot of these people. They - they fear you call the immigration or  
591 you know how it is. They were afraid. But most people they saw that, who  
592 was the balcony. You see a lot of people who was on the balcony at that time.  
593 But most of the people in that area, they saw, the whole thing. But they don't  
594 want to say nothing. They afraid. They afraid of the police and they're afraid  
595 of the neighbors. You know those - those neighbors could be really dangerous  
596 to be honest with you. Even myself (unintelligible), this position I have here,  
597 they can do it anytime, anything against me. You know they are a really, they  
598 have a lot of friends around here a lot of people there.

599  
600 Q: Mm-hm.

601  
602 A: When I'm going on the outside they look at me like - like I'm responsible for  
603 that. I'm not responsible for anything.

604  
605 Q: Right. Exactly.

606  
607 A: Yeah one of you came to me the other day, right, at 12:30. To my apartment?

608  
609 Q: Yeah. Yeah.

610  
611 A: Sorry I was kind of a little nervous at that time (unintelligible) I'm not ready to  
612 respond anything and so that's why I say no. Because I mean I was afraid  
613 because after that I heard a rumor he pass away, he pass away. I said man he  
614 pass way, he - he was alive. So I have to think about you know for  
615 (unintelligible) people that knew what's going on, you know.

616  
617 Q: That's okay. All right Sidney if you can just get a hold of me, um...

618
