Narrative:

On 2-18-12 Detective Jim Simons advised me that an officer involved shooting had just occurred in the area of Harold and Gramercy streets in the City of Riverside, Ca. I responded to the area where I was advised that Detective Dave Smith was the case agent and I would be assisting. Detective Medici was assigned to process the crime scene and Detectives Jim Simons and Rick Cobb were assigned to conduct interviews in the area.

Lt. Leon Phillips and Officer Dawson Smith gave us a briefing of what occurred at the scene. Detectives Smith, Medici and myself conducted a walk-thru of the crime scene. Detective Smith and I responded to the Magnolia St Station where Sergeants Ron Whitt and William (Billy) McCoy (shooting officers) had been transported to be interviewed. Officers Dawson Smith and Brett Stennett were also transported to the station for interviews as they were witnesses to the shooting.

I contacted Officer Brett Stennett at the Magnolia Station. I advised Officer Stennett I needed to chart his weapon to determine if he had fired any shots during the incident and take photographs of him. Officer Stennett advised he did not fire his weapon and agreed to have his weapon charted. ID Tech Susan Lane took photographs of Officer Stennett to show what he was wearing during the incident. Officer Stennett was wearing a black t-shirt with the METRO logo on the left chest area. Officer Stennett had black BDU pants, black boots and his Sam Browne belt, which contained his duty weapon, (4) four spare magazines and handcuffs. Officer Stennett carried a Springfield Arms (Serial # [REDACTED], model 1911, .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun. Officer Stennett's duty weapon was loaded with (7) seven Winchester .45 caliber bullets in the magazine and (1) one round in the chamber. There were (3) three (Silver) magazines on his duty belt that contained (7) seven rounds each and (1) one (Black) magazine that contained (8) eight rounds. All of the magazines were fully loaded. Officer Stennett was not carrying a backup weapon.

After charting and photographing Officer Stennett's weapon, I interviewed him about what he observed on Harold St. Officer Stennett advised he was assigned to the METRO team. Officer Stennett stated the METRO team routinely receives information on wanted suspects who are believed to be armed with weapons or who are believed to be dangerous. Officer Stennett said the team routinely (weekly) trains on these situations and serves search/ arrest warrants on suspected armed and dangerous suspects.

The METRO team had received information about S/ Danny Bond from Detective Mike O'Boyle. Officer Stennett was told that S/ Bond was always armed with a gun and that he had made statements that he was not going to let the police arrest him again. Officer Stennett said Detective O'Boyle had obtained an arrest warrant for S/ Bond for a domestic violence incident. Officer Stennett obtained a wanted flier (See attached) that Detective O'Boyle put out on S/ Bond. The flier had three pictures of S/ Bond. Detective O'Boyle had also received information that S/ Bond was staying at a residence in San Bernardino. Officer Stennett said they

agreed to actively look for S/ Bond on 2-17-12 and arrest him for his warrant. Officer Stennett said the METRO team sat on the residence in San Bernardino on 2-17-12, but never saw S/ Bond.

Officer Stennett said on 2-18-12 they started their surveillance at 920 Knoll Dr in San Bernardino looking for S/ Bond. Officer Stennett stated about 1330 hours Sergeants Whitt and McCoy, Officer Smith and himself followed who he believed was S/ Bond's mother from San Bernardino to a residence on the southeast corner of Gramercy and Montgomery. Officer Stennett said she was driving a white minivan. Officer Stennett said he was in a [REDACTED] undercover unit. Officer Smith was in a [REDACTED] undercover unit, and the sergeants were in a marked black and white unit. Officer Stennett said the rest of the METRO team stayed on surveillance at the Knoll Dr address. Officer Stennett set up surveillance on the Gramercy St residence with Officer Smith. Officer Stennett parked on Harold St facing south just north of Gramercy. Officer Stennett said Officer Smith was parked on Montgomery watching the residence.

Officer Stennett stated he was watching the front of the residence. Officer Stennett said he saw what appeared to be a realtor and a family arrive at the residence. He said they stayed for a few minutes and left. Officer Stennett said they were getting ready to call the surveillance as it was getting close to 1500 hours. Officer Stennett said Officer Smith radioed (Nextel) that he saw a subject walk out of the house that looked like S/ Bond. Officer Stennett said he could not see the person due to his position. Officer Smith radioed that the subject went back into the house. Officer Stennett said the subject came out of the house again and got on a bike. The subject was looking up and down the street. Officer Stennett said the subject rode the red mountain type bike east on Gramercy and then turned north on Harold. Officer Stennett said the subject was in the street and rode right past his driver's window. Officer Stennett said the subject had a very intense and serious look on his face. Officer Stennett identified the subject as S/ Bond who he saw from the photos on Detective O'Boyle's flier. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond was wearing a grey hat, sunglasses a light brown jacket and pants. Officer Stennett said he advised the units over the Nextel that it was S/ Bond on the bike.

Officer Stennett said S/ Bond stopped the bike about 20-30 feet behind his car. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond was adjusting his pants and jacket while he was sitting on the bike. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond was looking up and down the street for about 30 seconds. Officer Stennett said in retrospect it appeared that he was adjusting the gun in his waistband and that it was possibly falling out. Officer Stennett said about that time Sergeants Whitt and McCoy made a northbound turn on Harold from Gramercy in the marked unit. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond looked back at the unit and almost immediately took off north on Harold on the bike. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond was riding in the street and about midblock cut over onto the west sidewalk. Officer Stennett said Sergeant Whitt and McCoy were following S/ Bond north down Harold. Officer Stennett said he had to make a u-turn and ended up behind the marked unit. Officer Stennett said he thought Officer Smith was behind him.

Officer Stennett said Sergeants Whitt and McCoy pulled into a driveway in front of S/ Bond and across the sidewalk. Officer Stennett said S/Bond stopped his bike and got off. Officer Stennett said he pulled his vehicle into the driveway just south of where the sergeants stopped their vehicle. S/ Bond turned southbound on the sidewalk away from Sergeants Whitt and McCoy. Officer Stennett observed S/ Bond pull his jacket away from his waistband and remove a black colored hand gun with his right hand from the front of his waistband. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond looked back towards his left with the gun now in his right hand about chest level. Officer Stennett said it looked at that point like S/ Bond was about to engage Sergeant Whitt and McCoy in a gunfight. Officer Stennett said Sergeants Whitt and McCoy had exited their unit and were approaching S/ Bond while giving him commands. Officer Stennett could not recall what the sergeants were saying. Officer Stennett said when S/ Bond turned left toward the sergeants with the gun in his hand, they both "engaged" him. Officer

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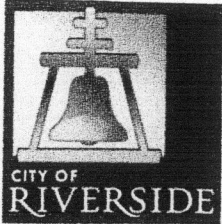
Stennett said he doesn't believe S/ Bond ever fired at the sergeants. Officer Stennett said he observed and heard all of this while he was still in his vehicle. Officer Stennett said the entire incident happened so quickly, he never had a chance to exit his vehicle prior to the shooting. Officer Stennett was not sure where Officer Smith was located during the shooting.

Officer Stennett said S/ Bond immediately fell to the ground after the sergeants fired. Officer Stennett said he and Officer Smith approached S/ Bond. Officer Smith covered S/ Bond at the head while the sergeants held cover near S/ Bond's feet. Officer Stennett said S/ Bond's hands were located under his upper torso while he was lying face down on the ground. Officer Stennett said he approached S/ Bond and handcuffed him behind his back. Officer Stennett said when he pulled S/ Bond's right hand from underneath him, he could feel something heavy in his hand and heard the metal of the gun scrape against the concrete. Officer Stennett said he rolled S/ Bond over and saw the black gun. Officer Stennett said he was not sure, but thought Officer Smith might have pushed the gun away from S/ Bond.

Officer Stennett said he could see that S/ Bond had been injured on his back and side. Officer Stennett said Sergeant McCoy got on the radio right after S/ Bond was handcuffed. He said Sergeant McCoy was coordinating responding officers and believes he asked for medical aid. Officer Stennett said he backed his [REDACTED] south on Harold to block northbound traffic. Officer Stennett said they continued cover down on S/ Bond until medical aid arrived. Officer Stennett said he was directed to go interview some witnesses that were located in a garage just north of where the shooting occurred. Officer Stennett said he retrieved his digital recorder from his unit and got brief statements from those witnesses. See Officer Stennett's supplemental report for details of their statements. Officer Stennett said he got blood from S/ Bond on his hands while handcuffing him. Officer Stennett said he washed his hands in the witnesses' bathroom prior to the interviews. Officer Stennett advised he did not have his recorder on during the shooting and only retrieved it after to interview the witnesses. I confirmed there were no recordings of the incident besides witness interviews.

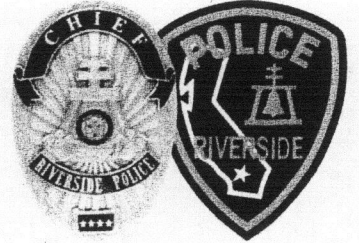
Officer Stennett said he was then removed from the scene and transported to the Magnolia Station to be interviewed.

SUMMARY: On 11/08/11 the victim sought treatment at Kaiser Hospital for various injuries including two black eyes. The victim was uncooperative and would not disclose the circumstances to the investigating officer. The victim re-contacted RPD the following day at the direction of CPS. She reluctantly told the officer she was assaulted by Danny Bond, her boyfriend. The case was submitted to the Riverside County District Attorney's Office who approved a felony filing of ADW. On 01/03/2012 a felony arrest warrant was issued for Danny James Bond charging him with PC245(a)(1).

The victim told officers that Danny Bond owns a gun and said he would kill himself before going back to jail. Danny Bond is a convicted felon and registered sex offender. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Several sources have said Danny Bond is often armed with a silver colored handgun which he keeps tucked into his front waistband. Additionally, Danny Bond's residence is supposed to be equipped with surveillance cameras.

VEHICLE: Last known vehicle was a Silver 2004 BMW 525 4DR, CA. License Plate # 5GWR005. I do not think Bond has this vehicle anymore however it is still registered to him.

INTERVIEW WITH OFC. BRETT STENNETT

Q=Det. Rowe

A=Ofc. Brett Stennett

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Q: All right. This is Detective Rowe. I'm here with uh, Officer Brett Stennett. Um, this is reference to file number P12024811. It's uh, February 18, 2012 at approximately 1730 hours. Um, all right, Brett. What um, how do you spell your last name?

A: S-T-E-N-N-E-T-T.

Q: And your first name is B-R-E-T-T?

A: Yes sir.

Q: What's your ID number?

A: 1374.

Q: And what's your assignment?

A: I'm assigned to the METRO Team.

Q: Okay, the full-time team?

A: Yes.

Q: Do you - do you - is it still split up in - do you still have a full and part-time?

A: Yeah. It's the full-time part of the SWAT Team.

Q: Okay. All right. Um, and what are your normal work hours?

A: Uh, they change from day to day. Um, I guess today would normally be uh, be like 2:00 to midnight.

Q: Okay. Do you normally work on Saturdays or did you just come in on uh, adjust your shift or...

- 47 A: Yeah. We work on Saturdays now.
- 48
- 49 Q: Okay. And what - what - what is your assignment uh, on Saturdays or today?
- 50
- 51 A: Uh, we do - today our assignment was to conduct surveillance on a residence
- 52 in order to catch a subject wanted - was wanted for a domestic violence
- 53 charge.
- 54
- 55 Q: Okay. And um, as far as um, this guy goes you guys came in um, uh, to go
- 56 look for that su- uh, subject?
- 57
- 58 A: Yes.
- 59
- 60 Q: How w- how - how did you - how were you aware of uh, this guy?
- 61
- 62 A: Well I believe it was uh, Officer (Casteneda) talked to Detective (O'Boyle)
- 63 uh, about s- a person that he had um, done some investigation on uh, (Danny
- 64 James Bond). And this person uh, was wanted for beating up his girlfriend.
- 65
- 66 Q: Okay. Did - do you um, were you aware that there was an arrest warrant in
- 67 the system for um, if you have any background on - on - on this guy and - and
- 68 what - what he was wanted for?
- 69
- 70 A: Yeah. We were aware that he had arrest warrants and we were checking uh,
- 71 you know, the status of his - the status of that every day through dispatcher
- 72 and MDC. We'd run his name to make sure he was still wanted and he hadn't
- 73 been picked up yet.
- 74
- 75 Q: Were - and so you guys were doing surveillance on him. Was this the first
- 76 day that you guys were uh, conducting surveillance?
- 77
- 78 A: No. We were doing surveillance yesterday also.
- 79
- 80 Q: Okay. Um...
- 81
- 82 A: That was the first day.
- 83
- 84 Q: Okay. And where - where were you guys uh, doing your surveillance at that
- 85 point?
- 86
- 87 A: We started out the surveillance today at uh, 9020 (Noel) Drive in San
- 88 Bernardino I believe was the address.
- 89
- 90 Q: Okay. And was that the only location?

91
92 A: That's where we started out. And then myself and Officer (Dawson Smith)
93 and Sergeant (McCoy) and Sergeant (Whitt) broke off from there and
94 followed the suspect's mom to another address on Grammercy.
95
96 Q: So um, from that house - from the residence on (Noel) um, some of you guys
97 followed a - a vehicle away from that address to an address on Grammercy?
98
99 A: Correct. I was in a undercover vehicle. Uh, and I followed her on the
100 freeway. And then I followed her up to Van Buren to the Grammercy address.
101
102 Q: Okay. And while we're on - on that what uh, what kind of - what unit were
103 you in today?
104
105 A: I was in a [REDACTED]
106
107 Q: Okay, not - not a marked unit or anything like that?
108
109 A: No sir.
110
111 Q: Um, just a plain uh, undercover unit?
112
113 A: Yes.
114
115 Q: And how about what - what you were wearing today?
116
117 A: I was wearing my black uniform pants. I was wearing my duty belt with my
118 gun in a holster, magazines, radio, handcuff cases, and I was wearing just my
119 black uniform shirt. And I did not have my vest on.
120
121 Q: Okay. Does it - does the black uniform shirt, does it have any identifying uh,
122 marks on it?
123
124 A: On the front of the shirt there is um, an emblem that says METRO Team
125 Riverside Police.
126
127 Q: Um, and right now you have your um, raid vest on. Um, you were not
128 wearing that at the time?
129
130 A: No. I was not.
131
132 Q: Okay. Um, and you had - you said you had your duty belt on um, which has
133 how many magazines?
134
135 A: I have four magazines and then one magazine in my weapon.

136
137 Q: Okay. And um, do you know how m- how many rounds each one of those
138 magazines uh, hold?
139
140 A: Seven.
141
142 Q: Okay. All right. And so you - you were part of the - the team that followed
143 um, the mother from the (Noel) address to the address on Grammercy?
144
145 A: Yes sir.
146
147 Q: Okay. Um, who was the other uh, officers?
148
149 A: The other officer who was in the undercover vehicle was (Dawson Smith).
150
151 Q: Okay.
152
153 A: And then we had uh, two sergeants, Sergeant (Whitt) and Sergeant (McCoy),
154 who were in a - a marked police unit.
155
156 Q: Okay. And when - when you - when the vehicle left the (Noel) address the
157 only person that was in that vehicle was a female?
158
159 A: Uh, followed - when I followed behind it I could see inside the vehicle pretty
160 well. I didn't see any other heads or anyone else. As it drove past me - I
161 followed it the entire time. I just saw the uh, the one female who I believe
162 may have been the suspect's mom but I don't know that for sure.
163
164 Q: Okay.
165
166 A: I never was able to confirm who it was in the car.
167
168 Q: Okay. Um, did you guys ever make a stop on that vehicle or - or...
169
170 A: No.
171
172 Q: ...any contact with that person at all?
173
174 A: No.
175
176 Q: Okay. What kind of vehicle was um, (Dawson) in?
177
178 A: He was in a [REDACTED]
179
180 Q: Okay. And how about Sergeant (Whitt) and (McCoy)?

181
182 A: They were in a marked police unit.
183
184 Q: Okay. They were together?
185
186 A: They were together. Yes.
187
188 Q: Okay. Um, and I wanna go back a little bit uh, as far as the background on
189 this (Danny James Bond). Um, did you have any information about him um,
190 as far as um, I know - I know we talked about the arrest warrant but was there
191 any other information that you had about him that he was armed, that - what
192 he was wanted for um, any specific details about the crime that he committed?
193
194 A: Yes. He uh, I learned from - I learned that he was believed to be carrying a
195 gun, that he always carried a gun on him and that he had made statements that
196 he um, was not gonna let police arrest him again. And he could very well be
197 violent.
198
199 Q: Okay. Um, so you a- and where did you - have - get this information from?
200
201 A: It was contained in the information that Detective um, (O'Boyle) gave to
202 Officer (Casteneda).
203
204 Q: Okay. Had you seen a flyer that was put out uh, on the subject?
205
206 A: Yes. I saw a flyer that had several pictures of him um, with different haircuts.
207
208 Q: Okay. And in that flyer did it - it sh- state that he was uh, not gonna go - had -
209 had made statements that he wasn't gonna go back?
210
211 A: Yes.
212
213 Q: Um, and uh...
214
215 A: And also believed to be carrying a gun.
216
217 Q: Okay. All right. Um, and as far as your assignment goes is that common
218 when that uh, that you guys um, go after armed, wanted suspects or make
219 entries into um, search warrants on - on those type of suspects?
220
221 A: Yes. We try to take - we try to uh, be active and - or take proactive uh, um,
222 actions on subjects that are known to be armed and are violent because of our
223 level of training.
224

225 Q: And that was my next question. What - and you don't have to go into every
226 training thing but I mean do you have a regular routine where you guys train
227 on doing search warrants, taking um, armed suspects into custody?
228
229 A: Yes. We train every Wednesday. And our training consists of um, training
230 for responses to active shooter situations, hostage rescue, situations um,
231 emergency response team uh, incidents and also serving search - high risk
232 search warrants, and we also do a lot of training uh, handgun training.
233
234 Q: Okay.
235
236 A: And firearm training - handgun and rifle training.
237
238 Q: Okay. Um, so let's get - go um, you guys followed the - the - what you
239 believed was the mother to an address on Grammercy. Once uh, she got there
240 what happened?
241
242 A: She pulled into an address that I don't know. Um, I don't know the address -
243 the physical address but she pulled into an address at the corner of
244 Grammercy and uh, and uh, I can't remember the street. It's just uh, she
245 pulled into an address on Grammercy just west of Harold.
246
247 Q: Okay. Was it the corner house?
248
249 A: It was the corner house. Yeah.
250
251 Q: What - what end - and which corner would that have been?
252
253 A: It would have been - it would have been the uh, southeast corner of
254 Grammercy and uh, Grammercy and Montgomery Street.
255
256 Q: Grammercy and Montgomery?
257
258 A: Montgomery Street. Yes.
259
260 Q: Okay.
261
262 A: Southeast corner of Grammercy and Montgomery.
263
264 Q: Okay. Um, and then what happened?
265
266 A: We - well after she parked I turned my vehicle around. And I parked my
267 vehicle on the west curb line of Harold Street um, just north of Grammercy.
268 And from my position I could sit in my car and - and watch the front of the -
269 of the Grammercy address. And I could see the vehicles. And uh, we s- we

270 um, sat there and watched. (Daw)- also (Dawson) was a- on the other side
271 across from - he was on um, he was off of Grammercy off of uh, Montgomery
272 Street. He was parked on Montgomery Street somewhere. I don't know
273 where. I think um, I think he was watching from the other side.
274
275 Q: Okay. Uh, did you see what the female did?
276
277 A: The female - I did not see her get out of the car. Uh, by the time I turned
278 around and parked she had already gotten out and I b- I assume that she went
279 into the house but I didn't see that.
280
281 Q: Okay. And about what time was this?
282
283 A: I believe that it was - it was probably around 1 o'clock.
284
285 Q: Okay.
286
287 A: I think.
288
289 Q: Okay. What time - and what time did you guys start your shift?
290
291 A: We started at 8:00.
292
293 Q: 8:00 this morning?
294
295 A: Yes sir.
296
297 Q: And when were you supposed to get off?
298
299 A: So 8:00 to uh, 1800 hours - 6 o'clock.
300
301 Q: At 1800? Okay. Okay. So uh, so you said approximately 1:30 is when the
302 vehicle - when she pulled into the residence?
303
304 A: Yeah. It was around that time. I'm - I'm not sure of the exact time.
305
306 Q: Okay. Um, and then you and (Dawson) just basically sat up on point and
307 watched the - watched the house?
308
309 A: Yes sir.
310
311 Q: Um, was there people coming and going from that house? Or did you see any
312 movement at the house?
313

314 A: Yeah. While we were sitting there after probably close to an hour, two cars
315 arrived. And uh, one of the cars um, a business man, older gentleman,
316 probably in his fifties and nice pantsuit or um, you know, like a um, he was
317 dressed up in a suit - no jacket but um, nice button-up shirt and pants. And
318 uh, he was followed by - by another car. Then a family got out uh, a husband
319 and wife and two kids. And it appeared to be, although I was never able to
320 verify this, it appeared to be a realtor who was showing the house.
321

322 Q: Okay.
323

324 A: He had some paperwork. He had like one or two papers in his hand. And um,
325 he was professionally dressed. And they went inside the house for maybe two
326 or three minutes and together the family - the couple and the two kids - two
327 younger kids probably like uh, 5, 7 years old went into the house briefly and
328 two or three minutes and came back out. They looked around the
329 neighborhood a little - looked up and down the street a little bit and got into
330 the cars and drove off. And they seemed very unfamiliar with the
331 neighborhood.
332

333 Q: Was there a for sale sign in the - at the house?
334

335 A: There was a sign in the window - in the front window but I couldn't read it. I
336 didn't see like a big realtor sign in the front.
337

338 Q: Okay.
339

340 A: But uh, like a - said for sale but just - I'm just assuming that it - just really
341 appeared to be a realtor...
342

343 Q: Okay.
344

345 A: ...showing the house to some couple.
346

347 Q: Okay.
348

349 A: And other than that until (Danny Boy) came out I didn't see anyone.
350

351 Q: Okay. So the - that was the only coming and going or movement at the
352 house?
353

354 A: Uh, well - and there was one other time. While we were watching - once I
355 had parked um, when I first initially - when she had parked I drove by. I came
356 back down Harold, parked on Harold, and was watching the house shortly
357 after our - I parked uh, a person came out and was g- opened up the side door
358 of the van - the sliding door of the van and looked like she was maybe getting

359 something out of the van. She was rummaging around inside for maybe a
360 minute. And before she walked back in the house and uh, Officer (Dawson)
361 arrived around the time that she was - he had parked and set up on - on the
362 other side on Montgomery Street as she was rummaging around in the van.
363 And uh, uh, she said it was a- another female. She did- he didn't think that it
364 was the um, the mom who was driving the van.
365
366 Q: Okay.
367
368 A: And uh, uh, I don't (unintelligible). She was just in the van for a minute. And
369 I think she - I couldn't see what she did but I believe over the Nextel
370 (Dawson) said she carried a couple of things into the house.
371
372 Q: Okay. Um, w- and what kind of car was it that the mom was driving from San
373 Bernardino to Grammercy?
374
375 A: She was driving a white van uh, maybe late or mid-nineties. And um, it was
376 like a family van with a sliding side door.
377
378 Q: Okay.
379
380 A: And very lightly tinted windows.
381
382 Q: Okay. Did um, and - and this surveillance - this uh, the communications that
383 you guys were having, was that on the radio or was it over your Nextels?
384
385 A: Over our Nextels.
386
387 Q: So that was the o- everything was done over Nextel nothing over Channel -
388 Channel 3?
389
390 A: It was done on the Nextel. Yes sir.
391
392 Q: Okay. Um, and then what happened after uh, uh, after that?
393
394 A: Well a little bit after that I think maybe an hour - another hour had passed and
395 I believe it's around 1440 I think. Um, a uh, subject came out of the front
396 door. I couldn't see him 'cause I was blocked by the van and a pickup truck
397 that was parked in the driveway. He came out of the front door. And uh,
398 Officer (Dawson) got on his Nextel and advised, "Hey, I think this - this looks
399 like it's the suspect and he just came out and he's getting on a bike and he's
400 looking up and down the street." I couldn't see this.
401
402 Q: Okay.
403

404 A: And then uh, then the subject drove out from the house on his bike. And he
405 came eastbound on Grammercy. And he drove right by my front window.
406 And he drove right by my - in front of my car and right by the driver's side
407 window where I was seated. And I was able to look up and see him clearly.
408 And uh, he was wearing like a - a gray ball cap, sunglasses, a light brown
409 jacket, and he had some sort of pants on. I don't remember what color his
410 pants were. He was on a red bike. And I could see his face very clearly. And
411 I recognized him to be uh, he looked - he looked like he was (Danny) uh,
412 (James Bond).
413
414 Q: And you recognized that from the flyer that was put out that you had saw
415 on...
416
417 A: Yes sir.
418
419 Q: ...pr- previously?
420
421 A: He was very, very close to me and he looked - you know, he looked exactly
422 like that, one of the pictures.
423
424 Q: And what - and where - where again were you parked at?
425
426 A: I was parked on Harold - on the west curb of Harold just north of Grammercy.
427
428 Q: Okay.
429
430 A: Maybe two car lengths. I don't know what that would be - maybe 25, 30 feet
431 maybe.
432
433 Q: Okay. So the west curb of uh...
434
435 A: West curb of uh, Harold.
436
437 Q: ...Harold facing south?
438
439 A: Facing south. Yeah.
440
441 Q: Okay.
442
443 A: And I was parked just north of Grammercy.
444
445 Q: Okay. And so the subject that (Dawson) said looked like...
446
447 A: Mm-hm.
448

449 Q: ...uh, (Danny Bond).
450
451 A: Well he believed it was him. I think that's actually what he said. "I think it's
452 (Danny Bond) coming out." And then as he was coming out on the street I
453 think I may have gone on the Nextel and said, "Yeah. I think it's him." Then
454 when he drove by I mean I could - it looked just like the picture.
455
456 Q: Okay. And - and when he drove by what kind of bike was he on?
457
458 A: He as on a red uh, a red bicycle. I mean...
459
460 Q: Like a mountain bike, a beach cruiser, a 10 speed if you remember?
461
462 A: Uh, you know, I'm not great with bikes but I think it was m- I think it was like
463 a mountain bike.
464
465 Q: Okay.
466
467 A: I could be wrong.
468
469 Q: Okay. Um, and he basically drove right past your driver - or the passenger
470 side window?
471
472 A: He drove right by me. Yeah.
473
474 Q: Okay.
475
476 A: (Unintelligible).
477
478 Q: Did he look in your car or...
479
480 A: He never noticed me. He drove right by. I had my sunshade up. And my
481 windows are slightly tinted. If he had looked at me he may have seen me...
482
483 Q: Okay.
484
485 A: ...but he didn't look down. He just went right by. He had a very uh, intense
486 look on his face.
487
488 Q: Okay.
489
490 A: It wasn't like a normal person riding by on a bicycle. I mean he wasn't out for
491 a nice little you know, little outing on his bicycle. I mean he had a very
492 intense, very serious look on his face.
493

494 Q: Okay.
495
496 A: I mean it really kind of stuck out to me.
497
498 Q: Okay. Um, and - and when he drove by did you put it out that that - that you
499 recognized him as...
500
501 A: I did not. No.
502
503 Q: Okay.
504
505 A: I mean at that point we'd all basically said, "This is him." And we'd made a
506 plan that we're gonna stop him.
507
508 Q: Okay.
509
510 A: And I mean just I didn't put that out on the radio after he rode by. I just gave
511 more instructions on where he was going because I felt that you know, we'd
512 basically already established it was him.
513
514 Q: Sure. And so he went east on uh, Montgomery?
515
516 A: From his house. Uh-huh.
517
518 Q: And he went north on Harold?
519
520 A: Harold. Yes sir.
521
522 Q: Passed you?
523
524 A: Yes.
525
526 Q: He's - he's riding his bicy- bicycle on the sidewalk?
527
528 A: He's riding his bicycle on the road. Uh...
529
530 Q: Oh, in the road?
531
532 A: Yeah. So basically he's on - he's on the uh, um, the left hand side of the road
533 - or the wrong side of the road basically on his bicycle.
534
535 Q: Okay.
536
537 A: And he continues up...
538

539 Q: Mm-hm.
540
541 A: ...stops his bike maybe 20 or 30 feet behind my vehicle.
542
543 Q: Okay.
544
545 A: Just slightly off from the sidewalk.
546
547 Q: Okay.
548
549 A: And he stops his bike and he's just standing by his bike. And he starts
550 looking around again. And he grabs his back jacket and he flips up his back
551 jacket and he starts adjusting his pants. And he's adjusting his pants and
552 pulling up his belt. And then he moves his hands to the front of his pants and
553 he's moving and he's like adjusting you know, his pants and his belt um, as
554 he's standing there and he's looking around. He's looking back and forth.
555 He's looking behind him. He's looking to his side. And in retrospect I
556 believe he was adjusting his gun.
557
558 Q: Mm-hm.
559
560 A: 'Cause it probably - I don't think he had a holster for it. I think that it was just
561 in his belt and in looking back I think that he may have just been worried that
562 it was gonna fall out as he was riding his bike from h- you know, his legs
563 pumping up and down. And he was probably adjusting it and he may have
564 been tightening his belt. So he's standing there and he's doing this for
565 actually a little while. I mean it was probably a good you know, I would say
566 he's probably standing there for you know, 30 seconds or so. It seemed like a
567 long time.
568
569 Q: Right.
570
571 A: But al- I think maybe 30 seconds. He's standing there fixing his belt, his
572 pants. And uh...
573
574 Q: Did you put that uh, information out over the Nextel?
575
576 A: Yes. I told them that he - I believe that I had said over the Nextel that, "Hey,
577 he stopped. He's right behind my vehicle." Um, and uh, at that point as he's
578 standing there on his bike the sergeants uh, Sergeant (McCoy) and Sergeant
579 (Whitt) came off of Grammercy.
580
581 Q: Okay.
582

583 A: And they're making the turn northbound onto Harold Street in front of me.
584 And that's when the subject - 'cause he's looking around. He looks back and
585 sees them immediately in the intersection. He sees them making that turn.
586 And he gets on it you know, puts his feet on the pedals and he's going. He
587 just takes off you know?
588
589 Q: Which way?
590
591 A: He starts going northbound.
592
593 Q: Okay.
594
595 A: When he starts going - he might not have been - he - he didn't have a lot of
596 speed at that point but he started taking off - well I think especially when they
597 started approaching him he realized they were gonna stop him. He just takes
598 off northbound on Harold. And uh, he's going down the street and he - he
599 probably goes um, most of the - the block. And he's ki- he's getting pretty
600 close to the end of the block. And he uh, or he's like mid-block I think. And
601 he pulls on - he turns onto the sidewalk. And he starts going northbound on
602 the sidewalk.
603
604 Q: Okay.
605
606 A: And that's - and I - I'm trying to get around. I - I'm able to get around. W- I -
607 I turn my vehicle around. I start my vehicle up. I turn around. And...
608
609 Q: You had to make a u-turn, right?
610
611 A: I had to make a u-turn. Yeah. And when another - there's a woman in the
612 roadway. Um, I had to - she slowed down, kinda stopped, and then I had to
613 get around her. I think she just took off and kept on driving um, past the
614 whole thing. And uh, slowed me up a little bit but then I started catching up.
615 And um, I believe that uh, Sergeant (Whitt) and Sergeant (McCoy) were -
616 they were - they were paralleling uh, (Danny Boyd) down the street um,
617 following him. And they pulled in front of him and nosed their vehicle into
618 the driveway.
619
620 Q: Okay. Did you see all of this? Or had - had you already made the u-turn and
621 seen all this or...
622
623 A: Yeah.
624
625 Q: ...or...
626
627 A: Well I'm - when I make the u-turn they're still following each other.

628
629 Q: So...
630
631 A: And as...
632
633 Q: ...Sergeant (Whitt) and Sergeant (McCoy) are still following...
634
635 A: They're still following the guy.
636
637 Q: Okay.
638
639 A: And that's...
640
641 Q: Who's driving that - their vehicle if you remember?
642
643 A: I have no idea.
644
645 Q: Okay.
646
647 A: I really don't. I'm not really sure.
648
649 Q: Okay.
650
651 A: I d- I think it was uh...
652
653 Q: That's okay.
654
655 A: I don't know. I don't know who it was but uh, I make the turn. They're still
656 following him. And as I'm trying to catch up I think that's - that's when he
657 got onto the sidewalk.
658
659 Q: Okay.
660
661 A: He drives up onto the sidewalk and he's taking off northbound on the
662 sidewalk on the west sidewalk of Harold.
663
664 Q: Okay.
665
666 A: And uh, the sergeants pull their vehicle into a driveway...
667
668 Q: Okay.
669
670 A: ...nose in on the sidewalk. Um, or - yeah. Nose in towards the sidewalk
671 anyway. And he stops his bike and gets off of it. And I'm coming up at that

672 point. I'm driving up. And I'm pretty close. And I pull my vehicle into the
673 driveway just south of where the sergeants pulled their vehicle into.
674
675 Q: Okay.
676
677 A: I pull my vehicle in there. He gets off the bike. He turns around towards me.
678 He pulls back his jacket and he grabs his gun.
679
680 Q: Okay.
681
682 A: And I see the g- the gun very clearly. He pulls the gun out. And he looks
683 back towards his left - I believe it's his left. He's looking back and turning
684 towards his left. And I believe he's gonna try and engage in a gunfight. I
685 mean it - it appeared to me that his - his intention was to shoot the officers that
686 were trying to arrest him.
687
688 Q: Okay.
689
690 A: Um, very clearly I mean that's - he's trying to get - he's trying to engage in a
691 gunfight here. He pulls out his gun.
692
693 Q: Let - let me stop right here.
694
695 A: Okay.
696
697 Q: Before - before he - that happens um, are you in front of - does (Dawson) um,
698 at some point join into...
699
700 A: Yeah. He was. I don't know where - I think that he - I don't know where he
701 was at this time.
702
703 Q: Y- you don't know whether or not he was in front of you or behind you?
704
705 A: Oh, he's behind me.
706
707 Q: So - so you made the u-turn and you were behind Sergeants (McCoy) and...
708
709 A: Ser- I'm right here. Yeah. I'm behind them.
710
711 Q: Okay. Okay. So then you - they - they pull to the - to the sidewalk kind of -
712 kind of to cut him off on the sidewalk.
713
714 A: Uh-huh.
715
716 Q: And at that point you say that he gets off of the bike?

717
718 A: Yeah. He gets off of his bike.
719
720 Q: And what does he do from there?
721
722 A: And he turns towards me. So he's now facing southbound.
723
724 Q: Okay.
725
726 A: And he has his back to the officers.
727
728 Q: Okay.
729
730 A: Um, and he pulls out - or - 'cause I can clearly see him. He pulls his jacket
731 back and grabs his gun with his right hand. And he pulls his gun out with his
732 right hand. And he has it up by his chest.
733
734 Q: Is he - is he doing all of this right near the - the bike or does he try and run?
735
736 A: He's hardly away from the bike at all.
737
738 Q: Okay.
739
740 A: Like the bike - I mean he's right by the bike.
741
742 Q: Okay.
743
744 A: I mean he...
745
746 Q: So he doesn't try and flee or anything?
747
748 A: No. No. No. I mean he may have gone like two - maybe - I think he - he
749 may have gone like one or two steps.
750
751 Q: Okay.
752
753 A: But he turns around but he - but he - his back is to - to the sergeants.
754
755 Q: Okay.
756
757 A: And he pulls his gun out with his right hand.
758
759 Q: Okay.
760
761 A: You know, and like he...

762
763 Q: And where was - where was the gun located?
764
765 A: The gun was located in his waistband.
766
767 Q: In his front of his back?
768
769 A: His front waistband on his right hand side.
770
771 Q: Okay. And he pulls it out with his right hand?
772
773 A: He pulls it out with his right hand.
774
775 Q: Okay.
776
777 A: And uh, he has it - he has it like this and he turns towards the officers and
778 that's when they engaged him.
779
780 Q: Okay. Now do you see where Sergeant um, (Whitt) and Sergeant (McCoy)
781 are at this - at this point?
782
783 A: They get out of their vehicles. They get out of their vehicle and uh, walk you
784 know, their front seats of the vehicle and they're approaching side by side
785 coming up to them with their guns drawn giving him commands. They're
786 saying - I don't remember what the commands were but they're giving him
787 very clear um, unequivocal commands to - I - I think maybe, "Put your -
788 stop," or, "Put your hands up," or - I'm not - I'm not sure. I don't recall
789 exactly what it was they were saying but they're giving him loud verbal
790 commands and they're repeating it.
791
792 Q: And they were already out of the vehicle um, before he turned towards them
793 with the gun?
794
795 A: Uh, yes.
796
797 Q: Okay. Did you hear anybody or did you or your - yourself or - or Sergeant
798 (Whitt), Sergeant (McCoy), (Dawson), did you hear anybody yell that he's got
799 a gun or did you yourself do that?
800
801 A: I didn't have a chance to. I was inside my vehicle. I wasn't sure if they were
802 going to see him. It happened pretty quick by the time I saw the gun.
803
804 Q: Okay.
805
806 A: You know, I mean it was - I mean I think they may have seen it, too.

807
808 Q: So by the - so when you...
809
810 A: So- soon after anyway.
811
812 Q: Okay. So when you pull up um, you're still in your vehicle when you see him
813 uh, pull the gun out of his waistband...
814
815 A: Yes.
816
817 Q: ...and turn towards the sergeants?
818
819 A: Yes.
820
821 Q: Okay. Um, and then what happens then?
822
823 A: Then both sergeants engage with him and uh, in the threat and take him down
824 and he falls straight down right there.
825
826 Q: Okay. Did you see where (Dawson) was uh, at this p...
827
828 A: He is not - I don't know where he's at. He's behind me somewhere.
829
830 Q: Okay. So you hadn't seen him uh, up to this point?
831
832 A: He comes up after uh, the suspect falls. I'm out of my vehicle and I'm
833 approaching.
834
835 Q: Okay.
836
837 A: And he runs up then. By the time I'm to the front of my vehicle where the
838 suspect is, that's when he, that's when (Dawson) shows up.
839
840 Q: Okay. And.
841
842 A: When he arrives at that location.
843
844 Q: Okay. And when Sergeant Whitt, did you see well, let me, let - let's go back
845 to before they engaged with him. Um, when did, when um, uh, Danny turns
846 and towards them, does he extend his arm? Um, do you know if he fires a
847 round?
848
849 A: I don't believe he fired a round.
850
851 Q: Okay.

852
853 A: And I'm not sure if he extended his arm. He might have had the gun close to
854 his body. It really, it happened very quick. Th- you know, I mean I don't
855 have the perfect recollection. And but he had the gun up in his hand. I'm not
856 sure that he was able to punch it up. He may have been, I - I think that it was
857 very close to his upper body, you know? He was holding it up near his chest.
858
859 Q: Okay.
860
861 A: From, in a, in a, and I believe he got in a firing position, you know? He's in a
862 position where he could fire but I don't think his arms were, his arms weren't
863 extended I don't believe.
864
865 Q: And did he turn all the way towards them?
866
867 A: No, I don't think so.
868
869 Q: Um, where, had he, you know what I'm talking about?
870
871 A: Yeah.
872
873 Q: Did he turn and face them or w- was he just beginning to turn?
874
875 A: He was beginning to turn, but I think he was looking back at them.
876
877 Q: Okay.
878
879 A: Cause he was looking back at them over his left hand side. He was looking at
880 them but it wasn't, he wasn't uh, squared up to them, if you understand like,
881 you know, like full facing towards them. As - as he was turning and looking
882 back towards them.
883
884 Q: Okay.
885
886 A: Over his left shoulder.
887
888 Q: And - and as far as Sergeant (Whitt) and Sergeant um, (McCoy), were they in
889 the street or were they um, when - when this was all taking place or side walk,
890 there's a grassy area between the street and the sidewalk?
891
892 A: They mov- they were moving and shooting and when I, they were on the um, I
893 think there's a grassy area um, between the sidewalk and the street, and they
894 were on that grassy area and the sidewalk as they approached the suspect and
895 engaged him.
896

- 897 Q: Okay. Alright. Do you know if um, did, I mean, were you able to see
898 whether or not Sergeant (Whitt) and Sergeant (McCoy) fired or were you able
899 to tell that for sure or not?
900
- 901 A: I could see both guns firing.
902
- 903 Q: Okay. Alright. Um, and what did you do once you saw him turn towards the
904 uh, sergeants?
905
- 906 A: I got out of my vehicle as quick as I could. But I'm, this happened while I
907 was in my vehicle basically. So by the time I got out, he was on the ground.
908 Um, and then I approached and uh, I said um, "I'll go hands on. I'll go hands
909 on. I will handcuff him." I verbalized that clearly and made sure, you know,
910 everyone got it. And then I plucked my handcuffs, I got down and grabbed
911 both his hands, placed them behind his back, cause h- his hands were
912 underneath him.
913
- 914 Q: That's what I was gonna ask. When he fell to the ground, if you can, if you
915 remember, which way was he facing and how was he laying?
916
- 917 A: He was facing uh, head towards the south.
918
- 919 Q: Okay.
920
- 921 A: And feet towards the north. And his hands were both underneath him on his
922 upper chest area, like this. He was on his high chest.
923
- 924 Q: Okay.
925
- 926 A: Um, with both hands beneath him. Like I kneeled down um, and grabbed his
927 left and right hand and pulled it out and when I pulled his right hand out, I
928 could hear him, the - basically the gun scraping against the sidewalk and him
929 really you know he's - he's limp I was able to - I knew that there was a gun
930 there and so I handcuffed him, rolled him over slightly and the gun was right
931 there it was in - in his right hand.
932
- 933 Q: Okay. Um, and where was Sergeant (McCoy) and Sergeant (Whitt) and - and
934 (Dawson) at this point?
935
- 936 A: (Dawson) is on the head side so that he's south of (Danny Boyd) and the
937 Sergeants were behind me so they were north of me so they were at his feet.
938
- 939 Q: Okay. Um, and when you uh, went to handcuff him, you said his hands were
940 underneath him. You pulled his left hand out which would have been closest
941 to the street side?

942
943 A: Yes.
944
945 Q: You pulled his left hand out from underneath him.
946
947 A: Uh-huh.
948
949 Q: And then you – you cuffed that hand?
950
951 A: I pulled his left hand out first and then just placed it on his back.
952
953 Q: Okay.
954
955 A: And blocked him with my knee and then I grabbed his right hand and pulled
956 that out.
957
958 Q: Okay. Did you, did you have to pull it out or did you even have to roll him
959 over if you remember?
960
961 A: I pull, I just pulled it out.
962
963 Q: Just pulled it out.
964
965 A: He may have rolled over slightly just, I think I just pulled it out.
966
967 Q: Okay. And when you pulled it out, was the gun still in his hand or?
968
969 A: I believe so just because when I pulled his, that his hand out, I could hear the
970 gun, the metal of the gun scraping against the sidewalk.
971
972 Q: Okay.
973
974 A: Like a kind feel like I kinda had a sense that there was a heavy object beneath
975 him that fell when I pulled his right hand out.
976
977 Q: Okay. And then when you placed that behind his back, was the gun still
978 there? How'd, how did?
979
980 A: The gun was st- stayed beneath him. Or it was kinda at his side at that point.
981
982 Q: Okay.
983
984 A: He kinda, I think it came out from beneath him when I was kinda like, you
985 know, I mean a, sticking out. I could see a little black, I don't know how far it
986 was underneath him and how far it was out, but I could see the little bit of

987 black. The back strap of the gun. And then I handcuffed him and then once I
988 rolled him up a little bit, then I could see the gun clearly.

989

990 Q: Okay. Once you handcuffed him, then what did you do?

991

992 A: I rolled him up slightly and I think, I think (Dawson) um, maybe, I think
993 (Dawson) may have pushed it away from him a little bit. Just for officer
994 safety wise, maybe. I'm not sure. The, uh, that's what happened.

995

996 Q: Okay. Did you roll him onto his back or?

997

998 A: No. No, I left him on his stomach.

999

1000 Q: You left him on his stomach? Okay.

1001

1002 A: I rolled him over slightly just um, to get the, to make sure the gun was you
1003 know, not still underneath him.

1004

1005 Q: Okay. And – and could you tell that he had been wounded?

1006

1007 A: Yeah. Um, when I walked up um, I mean, I could, you could see the um, the
1008 holes in his jacket.

1009

1010 Q: Okay. And.

1011

1012 A: And there was blood.

1013

1014 Q: Where – where were those located?

1015

1016 A: On his back. And I saw obviously the ones that were on his back. The ones I
1017 saw that were obvious were on his back.

1018

1019 Q: Okay. And can you tell where – where at on his back?

1020

1021 A: Um, it was kind of center mass on his upper back.

1022

1023 Q: Okay. Um, and did you roll him over enough where you could see any
1024 wounds to the, to the front?

1025

1026 A: No. I did not.

1027

1028 Q: Okay.

1029

1030 A: Or his side I couldn't, I mean I couldn't, I didn't really get a good look.

1031

1032 Q: Okay. And do you guys, nobody other than possibly (Dawson) moving the
1033 gun a- away from him a little bit, nobody messed with the gun, nobody
1034 unloaded it or –or anything like that or you know, touched the gun as far as
1035 that goes?
1036

1037 A: I don't, I'm not sure if I even actually recollect that he pushed his side of the
1038 boot or not. I'm not, I'm not positive but it was on the right side of his body,
1039 you know?
1040

1041 Q: Okay. Um, and then what – what did you guys do?
1042

1043 A: After I handcuffed him, then uh, I heard Sergeant (McCoy) on the radio. I
1044 believe he's putting out shots fired and the location. And uh, he directed me
1045 to um, stop traffic on the street. I got in the [REDACTED] cause it seemed like the
1046 best way to do it at the time. Got in the [REDACTED] and backed it up a little bit
1047 and then blocked the um, uh, blocked traffic coming to and from.
1048

1049 Q: Okay.
1050

1051 A: South of the location and then after I parked that vehicle, I walked back up
1052 and uh, I then walked to, there were uh, four Hispanic males that were in um,
1053 an address on (Harold), on the west side of the street. It uh, were just like one
1054 address to the north of where the shooting occurred.
1055

1056 Q: Okay.
1057

1058 A: Who were all outside their garage.
1059

1060 Q: Okay.
1061

1062 A: And so I went up there and I got my voice recorder working. I turned it on,
1063 and I started to interviewed those guys. And I interviewed like three of them.
1064

1065 Q: Okay. Um, at and, can you go back to right after the shooting and um,
1066 Sergeant (McCoy) gets on the radio, did anybody call for medical aid um, that
1067 you know of?
1068

1069 A: Yeah. Medical aid was called immediately.
1070

1071 Q: Do you know who did that?
1072

1073 A: I'm not sure. I was, Sergeant (McCoy) was the one on the radio so I'm
1074 assuming it was him but I didn't hear anyone specific.
1075

1076 Q: Okay. And you said that um, after – after um, you backed your car up to uh,
1077 block traffic um, and you got your recorder and you went and interviewed
1078 some witnesses north of the, of where the shooting occurred, did you have
1079 your recorder on you um, during the incident?
1080
1081 A: No. It wasn't on.
1082
1083 Q: Okay. So the only, the only recorder, recording uh, that you did on this
1084 incident occurred after the shooting with some witnesses that uh, were um,
1085 next door to the north of the shooting?
1086
1087 A: Yes, sir.
1088
1089 Q: Okay. Um, remind me to collect your recorder um, after, when we're done
1090 here.
1091
1092 A: Okay.
1093
1094 Q: Um, and then wh- what happened after that?
1095
1096 A: After I interviewed those guys uh, I spoke to one of them who spoke pretty
1097 good English. I was able to interview him. Okay, the other two I just got their
1098 block outs basically they had broken English. They – they uh, um, gave me
1099 very brief statements as much, as well as they could for their command of the
1100 English language. Then after that, I uh, I was basically I just um, was pulled
1101 aside and was giving rep and I just waited until I left.
1102
1103 Q: Okay. And prior to these interviews, had medical aid already arrived?
1104
1105 A: Yes.
1106
1107 Q: Okay. So did, you did these interviews after medical aid had already arrived?
1108
1109 A: Yes.
1110
1111 Q: Okay. Um, after – after you moved your unit, did you move your unit before
1112 medical aid arrived or was that, was that before? Do you remember?
1113
1114 A: It was before.
1115
1116 Q: Okay. Um, I – I assume some people that, of the other officers were uh,
1117 holding down on the, on the subject or he was already in – in handcuffs, was
1118 there any aid given to him or anything like that done? What were you guys
1119 doing prior to the medical aid arriving?
1120

1121 A: Uh, we were just covering down on him.
1122
1123 Q: Okay.
1124
1125 A: We didn't, I didn't administer any aid.
1126
1127 Q: Okay. Um, at any point during this incident, I know we kinda went through it
1128 step by step, at any point during this incident did you fire your weapon at all?
1129
1130 A: No.
1131
1132 Q: Okay. Did you have a backup weapon on you at all?
1133
1134 A: No.
1135
1136 Q: Um, any weapons in – in your vehicle?
1137
1138 A: Uh, no, I don't think so.
1139
1140 Q: Okay. Um, and the only people that you saw fire their weapons were the two
1141 sergeants?
1142
1143 A: Yes, sir.
1144
1145 Q: Okay. Um, you went hands on with the um, with uh, (Danny). Um, did uh,
1146 were, did you get blood on your hands during that incident?
1147
1148 A: Yes.
1149
1150 Q: Okay. After that, uh, did you wash your hands?
1151
1152 A: Yes, I washed my hands. I uh, that same group of four guys that were in front
1153 of the garage, that house.
1154
1155 Q: The witnesses north of the shooting?
1156
1157 A: Yeah, exactly. I went and I asked him, "Hey, can I please wash my hands"
1158 and they allowed me to go to restroom and I thoroughly with soap and water.
1159
1160 Q: Did you have blood on your hands?
1161
1162 A: Yes I did.
1163
1164 Q: Okay. Did you have any blood on your uniform or anything that you
1165 remember?

1166

1187

A: I believe I had blood on my boots.

Q: On your boots. Okay. Um, Alright. Is there anything else that you can think of that I didn't ask you that – that uh, you remember um?


A: No, the event just happened so quick. To the best of my memory uh, that's – that's what I, that's what I remember.

Q: Okay.

A: To the best of my recollection that is what I remember but it happened very, very, it happened quick.

Q: Sure. Okay. Um, that'll end the interview with Officer Stennett. It's uh, 1810 hours.
