On 02-18-2012, 1550 hours, I responded to 5652 Harold Street to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. Detective Dave Smith requested that I interview several witnesses to the shooting. These witnesses were inside the garage area of a residence located at 5664 Harold Street.

All interviews conducted with each of the witnesses were audio recorded using Detective Dave Smith's Puma recorder. Detective Smith downloaded the recordings into the database at the Magnolia Street Station. The following are summaries of the interviews with each witness.

I met with W-1 Pedro Hernandez inside the garage of his residence. The large garage door was open. I interviewed Hernandez at the kitchen table of his residence.

Hernandez said he was sitting in his garage with his brother in law Hugo Ortega, his neighbors Marco Palomera and Eliseo Salgado. Hernandez said he was preparing to have a family party at his residence. Hernandez was facing Harold Street at the time of the incident. Hernandez saw a male subject riding a bicycle north on Harold Street from Gramercy Place. The male subject was riding on the west sidewalk near the front of his residence. Hernandez noticed the subject was wearing a beige colored jacket. Hernandez could not provide any further description on this subject because the incident happened so quickly.

Hernandez said he then saw a black and white marked police car pull in front of the subject riding the bicycle blocking his path. Two police officers got out of the marked police car. The subject riding the bicycle jumped off the bicycle. The bicycle turned left and fell to the ground. The subject then began to take about five to six steps backward as he continued to face the officers.

Hernandez said the subject stepped behind his neighbors trees blocking part of his view. He was able to see him through the branches. Hernandez could see his upper body; however he could not see his face. Hernandez heard the officers yelling "stop, stop" several times and then heard one of the officers yell "gun". Hernandez said as he heard the officer yell, he saw the subject from the bicycle pull open his jacket with both hands. The subject then began to reach into his front waist band area with his right hand. Hernandez said he was "scared like hell" because he believed the subject was going to pull out a weapon. Hernandez said he never did see what the subject was trying to pull out of his waist band. At this time Hernandez said he heard another officer yell something like, "gun" about two or three times.

Hernandez said the two officers who got out of the marked black and white police vehicle began firing their handguns at the subject that jumped of the bicycle. Hernandez said he could see the spent casing from the officer's guns flying in the air. The subject from the bicycle then fell to the ground. Hernandez said everyone in the garage began moving away from the front of the house and into the kitchen area.

Hernandez described the officers that fired at the subject. He remembered one officer being taller with grey hair. The other officer was shorter.

Hernandez said the officers that fired their handguns were wearing police uniforms and driving a marked black and white police car. Hernandez said as soon as he saw the officer and vehicle; he knew right away that they were police officers.

Hernandez stepped out of the kitchen area so I could interview Hugo Ortega. Officer Angulo #1084 assisted with Spanish translation. Ortega spoke broken English and felt more comfortable talking in Spanish.

Ortega said he was sitting near the entry way of the driveway to the garage. His back was to Harold Street and he was facing his brother-in-law, Hernandez. Palomera and Salgado were also inside the garage.

Ortega heard someone yelling "stop, stop" numerous times. He turned and saw two officers that had just stepped out of a marked police patrol car. He saw that the officers were wearing police uniforms. Ortega immediately recognized them as being police officers. Ortega said that he did not see the suspect that they were yelling at because the neighbor's trees were blocking his view. Ortega then saw the suspect drop his bicycle. He saw the suspect begin to run south on the west sidewalk of Harold Street toward Gramercy Place. Ortega again lost sight of the suspect behind the neighbor's trees. Ortega said the incident happened too fast for him to provide a description of the suspect.

Ortega said he saw the two officers that got out of the patrol car walking in the direction of the suspect. He heard about six shots coming from the officers. He did not know if both officers fired or if just one officer fired. Ortega noticed that another subject, who he believed was another officer, stopped his [REDACTED] south of the suspect. He heard this officer yelling, "stop" several times.

Ortega did not see the suspect at the time of the shooting because his view was blocked by the neighbor's trees. Ortega said both officers that exited out of the marked police unit were wearing blue police uniforms. He saw that the officers had on gun belts, leg holsters and badges. He also noticed police patches on their shoulders. Ortega said he immediately recognized them as police officers.

Ortega was not able to provide a description of the suspect or his bicycle. Ortega described one of the officers that got out of the marked police vehicle as a tall White male with white hair and glasses. Ortega was not able to provide a description of any other officers.

After hearing the gunshots, everyone that was in the garage began moving towards the back of the garage near the kitchen door.

Officer Angulo and I then met with Marco Palomera at his residence which is directly across the street from Hernandez's residence.

Palomera said he was sitting in the drive way area near the front entryway to the garage of Hernandez's residence. Hernandez, Ortega and Salgado were also in the garage area. His back was to Harold Street and he was facing Hernandez. Palomera said he first heard five to six shots coming from the front of the residence. While the shots were being fired, he turned around and saw two officers wearing blue police uniforms. He also saw a marked black and white police vehicle parked near the front of the residence. He did not see the officers firing the shots but assumed they had fired because he saw them holding their pistols in their hands. Palomera did not see a suspect because the neighbor's trees were blocking the rest of his view where he believed the suspect was located. Palomera said they all began to move towards the front of the garage near the kitchen door for their safety.
