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**Summary of Officer Wilder's interview:**

Officer Wilder advised he has been a police officer for three years all with the Riverside Police Department. Officer Wilder said he was passenger officer in unit number 3912 driven by Officer Oakes. Officer Wilder advised they work swing shift and their designator was "330". Officer Wilder stated he and Officer Oakes were in the area of Arlington Ave. and Adams St. when he heard what appeared to be a RPD Police Officer (unknown at time) in foot pursuit. Officer Wilder advised he later learned it was Officer Disla. Officer Wilder advised the foot pursuit was taking place at the Peppertree Apartments located at 7911 Arlington Ave. Officer Wilder said he checked the mobile computer in the police unit and learned this incident was in reference to a stolen vehicle. Officer Wilder said they proceeded to drive Code 3 to the Peppertree Apartments and upon arrival made a right into the apartment complex. Officer Wilder stated they then drove to the east entrance / exit gate and he observed an RPD Police unit already parked at the gate. Officer Wilder said he observed a RPD Police Officer (unknown at time) standing outside of the police unit pointing his weapon at the driver (S-1 Ciaramella) of a grey Honda Civic which was at the east gate facing south. Officer Wilder said the Honda Civic was still inside the apartment complex gate facing south when Officer Oakes pulled their police unit next to the other police unit. Officer Wilder said S-1 Ciaramella was attempting to exit the east gate but because of the presence of the police units S-1 Ciaramella began driving in reverse. Officer Wilder stated S-1 Ciaramella accelerated at a high rate of speed in reverse from the officers (north-bound).

Officer Wilder said S-1 Ciaramella drove the grey Honda Civic in reverse throughout the entire apartment complex to the west entrance / exit gate. Officer Wilder advised S-1 Ciaramella was traveling as fast as 50 mph through the apartment complex as they followed with their lights and siren activated. Officer Wilder said he didn't observe S-1 Ciaramella see any vehicles until striking an SUV after exiting the west gate. Officer Wilder said as they approached the west entrance / exit gate he observed a civilian vehicle parked parallel in front of this gate in an attempt to block S-1 Ciaramella from exiting. Officer Wilder stated S-1 Ciaramella maneuvered around the civilian vehicle and exited the west gate into the south / west portion of the apartment complex. Officer Wilder said S-1 Ciaramella then collided with a SUV (maroon Ford Expedition-CA-6MDG325) and continued to travel in reverse until he stopped just prior to a parked RPD Police unit (Lt. Griffitt's).

Officer Wilder advised Officer Oakes then drove their police unit in front of the Honda Civic in an attempt to block S-1 Ciaramella in. Officer Wilder said at this point it appeared that S-1 Ciaramella was going to "foot-bail" so he (C-1) opened his door and began to exit the police unit. Officer Wilder said as he was halfway out of the police unit he looked back over his left shoulder and observed the grey Honda Civic "lurch forward" toward their police unit. Officer Wilder said he observed his partner Officer Oakes pull out his handgun and point it towards the grey Honda Civic. Officer Wilder advised at this point he turned away from Officer Oakes and exited his police unit. Officer Wilder said he then heard approximately ten (10) gunshots so he immediately took cover behind his police unit. Officer Wilder said he wasn't sure at this point who was shooting but believed S-1 Ciaramella had fired at them.

Officer Wilder advised when the shooting stopped he came up over the top of his police unit pointing his weapon in the direction of the grey Honda Civic. Officer Wilder advised he then observed S-1 Ciaramella to be unresponsive. Officer Wilder said he noticed that the front end of the grey Honda Civic ended up against the driver's door of their police unit. Officer Wilder said he wasn't sure if the grey Honda Civic struck their police unit but said he did feel a "slight jolt" while exiting their police unit. Officer Wilder stated after the shooting stopped Officer Oakes backed up their police unit a few feet in order for him (V-1) to exit the driver's door. Officer Wilder advised he along with Officer Borngrebe and Officer Pap formed an arrest team and made their way to S-1 Ciaramella. Officer Wilder advised S-1 Ciaramella appeared to be "lifeless" as he was removed from the grey Honda Civic.

Officer Wilder said S-1 Ciaramella was approximately ten (10) feet away when Officer Oakes initially pulled up in front of the grey Honda Civic. Officer Wilder added that he observed Officer Pap standing south of the west gate as they followed S-1 Ciaramella through the west gate. Officer Wilder advised he didn't hear S-1 Ciaramella make any

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statements throughout this entire incident. Officer Wilder stated he didn't fire his weapon during this incident. For more details refer to recorded interviews and transcripts.

12 Q: Okay it is February 26, 2013 and it's about 12:50 in the morning. We're at the  
13 Riverside Police Department Magnolia Street Station and we're actually in  
14 Sergeant Dan Russell's office. And I am in the office with Officer Wilder?  
15

16 A: Yes.  
17

18 Q: And Officer Wilder what is your first name?  
19

20 A: Kyle  
21

22 Q: Is that K-Y-L-E?  
23

24 A: Yes.  
25

26 Q: W-I-L-D-E-R?  
27

28 A: Yes.  
29

30 Q: Okay. And what's your badge number?  
31

32 A: 1629.  
33

34 Q: Okay. And how long you been with, uh, Riverside PD?  
35

36 A: Approximately three years.  
37

38 Q: Okay. Did you work anywhere else before?  
39

40 A: No.  
41

42 Q: Okay. And this evening, um, what assignment were you working this  
43 evening?  
44

45 A: Patrol.

46  
47 Q: Patrol? And what - what shift?  
48  
49 A: Uh, swing shift.  
50  
51 Q: Swing shift? And do you know, uh, were you riding alone or were you riding  
52 with somebody?  
53  
54 A: I was riding with somebody.  
55  
56 Q: Okay and who was that?  
57  
58 A: Officer Oakes.  
59  
60 Q: Officer Oakes? Okay. Were you driving or passenger?  
61  
62 A: Passenger.  
63  
64 Q: Okay. Do you remember what unit number you were in?  
65  
66 A: Uh, I believe it's 3912.  
67  
68 Q: Okay. And what was your beat designator tonight?  
69  
70 A: It was 3-30.  
71  
72 Q: 3-30?  
73  
74 A: Yes.  
75  
76 Q: Okay. Okay we got called out because - for an incident that occurred out at,  
77 uh, I believe it's 7911 Arlington...  
78  
79 A: Yes.  
80  
81 Q: ...it was an Officer Involved Shooting. Um, what I'll have you do is just  
82 explain in your own words what you remember from the time you guys got  
83 the call or - or started - or proceeded to that location. And just kind of run  
84 through what happened, what you observed, what actions you took and then I  
85 might have questions at the end and stuff, is that okay?  
86  
87 A: Okay.  
88  
89 Q: Okay go ahead Kyle.  
90

91 A: Um, my partner and I were, uh, traveling near Arlington when we heard the,  
92 uh, an Officer putting out - sounded like he was in a foot pursuit and he  
93 needed help. Um, he was on the radio. I only caught the, uh, the designator,  
94 um, he was working in the West end of town. And I pulled up the call while  
95 Officer Oakes began rolling, uh, Code 3 to the call.

96  
97 Q: Okay.

98  
99 A: Uh...

100  
101 Q: Where were you guys responding from?

102  
103 A: Um, I think at the time we were about Arlington and Adams...

104  
105 Q: Okay.

106  
107 A: ...I - I believe. Um - uh, while we were in route I pulled up the call it came,  
108 uh, up as a - a GTA. About that time we believe that he was probably chasing  
109 the GTA suspect. Um, we show up to the front of the, uh, the Peppertrees and  
110 make the - the first right to the entrance.

111  
112 Q: Okay.

113  
114 A: Um, as we turn around towards the front of the entrance I believe it would be  
115 the, um, East entry/exit gate...

116  
117 Q: Okay.

118  
119 A: ...uh, we saw another unit parked there. Um, the Officer was outside of his  
120 car with a - a - his gun drawn and he was yelling commands at a, uh, a driver  
121 in a silver Honda Civic.

122  
123 Q: Okay.

124  
125 A: Um, as we pulled around the back of that unit the Civic, uh, began to drive in  
126 reverse, um, away from us so he was traveling North now in reverse. Um, we  
127 went in pursuit of him, um, and drove after him all - all the way around the,  
128 uh, complex...

129  
130 Q: Okay.

131  
132 A: ...um, with him in reverse the whole time. Um, when, uh, we went - the - the  
133 parking lot kind of loops around...

134  
135 Q: Okay.

136  
137 A: ...um, to the West entry/exit. Um, we drove, uh, fol- following him all the  
138 way around to that entry/exit gate, um, at which time there was a, uh,  
139 civilian's car that was parked blocking that gate.  
140  
141 Q: Okay.  
142  
143 A: Um, the suspect managed to squeeze around that car and go through the open  
144 gate. Uh, we followed him through there he kept going in reverse. Crashed  
145 into a I - I believe it was a Tahoe or Suburban.  
146  
147 Q: Okay.  
148  
149 A: Um, he crashed into that car and then made the left in reverse and tried to  
150 keep going, um, but was blocked by another police unit.  
151  
152 Q: Okay.  
153  
154 A: Uh, Cory drove - or Officer Oakes drove the, uh, our marked police unit up  
155 and boxed in the, uh, suspect vehicle. Um, at that time I thought that the  
156 suspect was going to try to flee on foot, uh, so I began to get out of the car.  
157 As I got out of the car I looked over my shoulder and Officer Oakes was  
158 coming up with his handgun. Um, I saw the - the driver's car lur- lurch  
159 forward a little bit and I was still getting out of the car...  
160  
161 Q: Mm-hm.  
162  
163 A: ...um, so I turned my back for a second. As I was turning my back, um, I  
164 heard shots fired, um, probably about ten or so.  
165  
166 Q: Okay.  
167  
168 A: Um, I thought we were taking rounds so I ducked and drew my weapon and  
169 came up top and saw the suspect pretty much just laid over in - in his seat...  
170  
171 Q: In the seat of - of the - of the Honda?  
172  
173 A: Yes.  
174  
175 Q: Okay. And then what?  
176  
177 A: And then after that, um, Officer Oakes yelled that he was going to back the  
178 car up because he was trapped inside the car. Um, so he put the car in reverse  
and backed up so he could get out. He got out, um, I had a couple of other  
Officers come up with me we formed an arrest team and, uh, I was pulling -  
180

181 and we walked up to the, uh, the suspect. Um, I believe it was Officer Pap  
182 and Officer Borngrebe...

183  
184 Q: Okay.

185  
186 A: ...um, grab the suspect and pull him out. Um, and he - he was pretty much  
187 lifeless at the time and so.

188  
189 Q: Okay - okay. So, uh, going back so you - you heard, uh, did you know who it  
190 was that was, um, puttin' out the original call out at the Peppertrees?

191  
192 A: Uh...

193  
194 Q: Do you know what Officer was involved?

195  
196 A: ...I'm - I can't say for certain but I believe it was Officer Disla.

197  
198 Q: Disla? Oh okay. And it sounded like he was in a foot pursuit or vehicle  
199 pursuit?

200  
201 A: I - it sound like - like a foot pursuit. I didn't hear any siren in the back...

202  
203 Q: Okay.

204  
205 A: ...um, in the background, uh, it was - there was some confusion as to what  
206 exactly was - was going on, um...

207  
208 Q: Like what kind of confusion? What was that?

209  
210 A: I - I - like I said I didn't know if he was in a foot pursuit or a vehicle pursuit...

211  
212 Q: Okay.

213  
214 A: ...um, because like I said I didn't hear any sirens. It sounded as if he was - as -  
215 as if he was running.

216  
217 Q: Okay.

218  
219 A: Um...

220  
221 Q: Did he put out any supse- uh, suspect description at all or vehicle description  
222 or anything at that point or just saying he was...

223  
224 A: Um...

225



226 Q: ...if you remember?

227

228 A: ...not that I can remember.

229

230 Q: Okay.

231

232 A: I'm not sure.

233

234 Q: Okay so you guys rode code, when you got there you went to the right which  
235 would have been the East entrance, the gates? And as you came in - just  
236 inside the gates is when the - you saw the Honda?

237

238 A: Yes.

239

240 Q: Okay. And the Honda was basically coming towards you?

241

242 A: Yes.

243

244 Q: Okay but at that same point you saw somebody outside of the car you think it  
245 was Officer Pap you think?

246

247 A: Um, I'm not exactly - I - I can't say I only saw...

248

249 Q: Okay.

250

251 A: ...the back of the head and my attention was mainly focused on the Honda  
252 now.

253

254 Q: Now where was that unit at?

255

256 A: Um, it, uh, it was located on the West side of that gate...

257

258 Q: Okay.

259

260 A: ...um, and we drove around on the East side of that gate. So it - it's wide  
261 enough for two cars...

262

263 Q: Okay.

264

265 A: ...um, because, uh...

266

267 Q: Which way was, uh, which way was his car facing (unintelligible)...

268

269 A: North - he was facing north...

270

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271 Q: ...Okay.

272

273 A: Uh...

274

275 Q: So he couldn't escape because you had both cars blocked in pretty much from  
276 there?

277

278 A: Yes.

279

280 Q: So that's when he decided just -- was - was it just the lone occupant in the  
281 vehicle?

282

283 A: Yes.

284

285 Q: And they decided to go - he decided to go backwards...

286

287 A: Yeah...

288

289 Q: ...so put it in reverse...

290

291 A: ...in reverse and...

292

293 Q: ...and basically did the whole apartment complex...

294

295 A: Whole complex yes.

296

297 Q: ...in reverse? And he - did he hit any vehicles on the way while he was doing  
298 it?

299

300 A: Um, no the - the only vehicle I remember him hitting was the, uh, the Tahoe...

301

302 Q: Mm-hm.

303

304 A: ...when he went out the West...

305

306 Q: Okay.

307

308 A: ...the West gate.

309

310 Q: Now he's - was - was he making eye contact with you guys at any point or, uh,  
311 when he was driving backwards or was he just looking backwards?

312

313 A: No there were a couple of times that he looked forward at us...

314

315 Q: Uh-huh.

316  
317 A: ...but - but primarily he was looking over his shoulder to see where he was  
318 going. Um, I know initially when he first saw us and we lit him up...  
319  
320 Q: Mm-hm.  
321  
322 A: ...and hit the siren he was looking right at us and putting in reverse and just  
323 gunned it. I think we were probably if I had to guess doing like 50 - 50 miles  
324 an hour in reverse...  
325  
326 Q: Okay.  
327  
328 A: ...through the complex.  
329  
330 Q: That's crazy. How - what - what did he look like the - the best you can  
331 remember?  
332  
333 A: A Hispanic male and short hair...  
334  
335 Q: Okay.  
336  
337 A: ...and kind of a fat yet stockier build.  
338  
339 Q: Okay stocky fat? How old did he look?  
340  
341 A: Um, maybe about 30 - 30ish.  
342  
343 Q: Okay. Okay so he does the whole complex and he's going out the actually the  
344 West gates at one point there's a - there's a vehicle blocking and I was out  
345 there so I saw the vehicle it's a dar- it's a dark colored vehicle.  
346  
347 A: Yes.  
348  
349 Q: And he maneuvers around that...  
350  
351 A: Yes.  
352  
353 Q: ...so then he gets out and he crashes into that Sub- that, uh, kind of an SUV  
354 type of vehicle that was ha- had another vehicle boxed in.  
355  
356 A: Right.  
357  
358 Q: And he crashes into that and then goes back which would be I guess East to a  
359 degree...  
360

361 A: Yes.  
362  
363 Q: ...and then there's another unit I think that's, uh - uh, Lieutenant Griffith's unit  
364 that was parked there.  
365  
366 A: Yes.  
367  
368 Q: Um, and did he stop in front of Griffith's or did he go to the side of it or was  
369 he right directly up to Griffith's unit and then decided he couldn't go no  
370 further or was he to the - like to the South of Griffith's unit, do you remember  
371 that?  
372  
373 A: Um, he was - I think he was pretty much just in front of the Lieutenant...  
374  
375 Q: Lieutenant...  
376  
377 A: ...Lieutenant Griffith's.  
378  
379 Q: But he figured he couldn't go no further?  
380  
381 A: Exactly.  
382  
383 Q: And that's when you guys pulled up and - and at that point how far away do  
384 you think you were when you guys pulled up in front of him that he was away  
385 at that point? How far away was he at that point before he came towards you  
386 guys?  
387  
388 A: Uh, maybe ten feet or so.  
389  
390 Q: Ten feet? Okay. And then as you guys pulled up, um, he come - you said  
391 lurched his vehicle or basically came towards your vehicle...  
392  
393 A: Exactly.  
394  
395 Q: ...and then at that point what was going through your mind at that...  
396  
397 A: Um, at that point I - I was already kind of committed to getting out of the  
398 car...  
399  
400 Q: Okay.  
401  
402 A: ...um, I was already half out, um, so at that time like I - I was primarily  
403 worried about just gettin' out.  
404  
405 Q: Mm-hm.

406  
407 A: And, uh, it - another thing I was running through my head was like he may try  
408 to ram the car and I know the SUV was right next to me and I didn't want to  
409 get pinned...

410  
411 Q: Mm-hm.

412  
413 A: ...between our car and the SUV. Um, and that's when the - the shots started  
414 going out.

415  
416 Q: Okay. And that put, uh, Officer, um, the - the Officer Oakes in a bad position  
417 too because then he was basically in - right in the - right in - in front of the  
418 suspect vehicle...

419  
420 A: Right.

421  
422 Q: ...and if he wanted to ram him he'd have his door pretty much str- straight out  
423 wouldn't it? It's kind of the way it looked.

424  
425 A: Yeah.

426  
427 Q: Okay. Did he end up hitting your car do you remember at any point?

428  
429 A: Um, I believe he did I felt a slight jolt...

430  
431 Q: Mm-hm.

432  
433 A: ..just like it - I don't remember if the jolt was from him hitting our car or if it  
434 was just me ducking or, um, it - it was difficult to say it all happened pretty  
435 quick.

436  
437 Q: Yeah. And - and like you said you looked away for a second, next thing you  
438 heard was gunshots?

439  
440 A: Yes.

441  
442 Q: And you said you heard maybe what ten you said?

443  
444 A: Yeah about ten.

445  
446 Q: Okay. Were they all from Officer Oakes that you know of from personal  
447 knowledge or?

448  
449 A: Uh...

450

451 Q: I know you may have learned something since but I mean at the time you  
452 think Officer Oakes fired them all or do you think anybody else fired them?  
453

454 A: At - at the time I thought it was only Officer Oakes that...  
455

456 Q: Okay.  
457

458 A: ...that fired.  
459

460 Q: And you've heard something since?  
461

462 A: Yes.  
463

464 Q: Okay. Um, did you ever see any other Officers out there with you guys at that  
465 point? The Lieutenant or any other Officers around that area when you guys  
466 first - when you started baling out of the car or - and - and when - when  
467 Officer Oakes was shooting?  
468

469 A: The only other Officer that I saw, um, initially when I started to get out was,  
470 uh, Officer Pap. Um, the only reason why I saw him was because, um, when  
471 we were driving through that West gate, um, Officer Pap was actually  
472 standing by the gate. They had to jump back out of the way of where the  
473 suspect was driving so.  
474

475 Q: And how did - you know how he got there?  
476

477 A: Uh, I...  
478

479 Q: Was he on the - wasn't he on the other gate at - when you guys - when you  
480 thought he may have been, uh...  
481

482 A: ..I - I'm not exactly sure.  
483

484 Q: Oh okay.  
485

486 A: I don't, uh, he was there...  
487

488 Q: No he was there (unintelligible)...  
489

490 A: ...so I remembered him...  
491

492 Q: Okay so you think Officer Pap was there out - standing outside, um, on what  
493 side of that - that vehicle that was blocking them would it be on the West  
494 side?  
495

496 A: I - it would have been on the East side of that - that...  
497  
498 Q: So right the same area where he went around that...  
499  
500 A: Ex- exactly.  
501  
502 Q: ...vehicle he was standing right there?  
503  
504 A: Yes.  
505  
506 Q: Okay. How did you - do you know how he missed him or was he inside the -  
507 by the carport then?  
508  
509 A: I - Officer Pap was on the South side of the - the gate so not actually inside the  
510 complex in...  
511  
512 Q: Right.  
513  
514 A: ...in the parking lot right there. Um, and there is kind of - I think there's like a  
515 walkway...  
516  
517 Q: Mm-hm.  
518  
519 A: ...sidewalk, um, and from my memory he was standing on the - the sidewalk  
520 and kind of jumped back a little bit.  
521  
522 Q: Okay - okay. Does this guy say anything at any time during the whole  
523 backing up or even when he - when you guys - when he was pinned in  
524 basically did he say anything or did he make any statements or yell at  
525 anything or?  
526  
527 A: No.  
528  
529 Q: Okay - okay. Anything else you can remember that, uh, happened that I  
530 haven't asked or?  
531  
532 A: Uh, I think the only thing was, uh, I do remember when we first boxed him in,  
533 um, he - he got the - I think it was the primary reason why I thought he was  
534 going to foot bail was because he got real fidgety and was grabbing for things  
535 around and I don't think he exactly knew what he was gonna do, uh, I'm not  
536 exactly sure.  
537  
538 Q: Now did - could you see his hands at that point?  
539

540 A: Um, I could only see his arms and he was reaching around for a bunch of stuff  
541 so I don't - I don't know exactly...

542  
543 Q: Did you even think that he possibly had a weapon or was that - even go  
544 through your mind at that point?

545  
546 A: Yeah it - it always goes through my mind.

547  
548 Q: Yeah.

549  
550 A: Um, he could be armed or - or whatever so I don't know if he's reaching for  
551 anything. That's another reason for me wanting to get out of the car because I  
552 know that if he does come up with a gun or something that is pretty much a  
553 coffin sittin' inside the car...

554  
555 Q: Mm-hm.

556  
557 A: ...so.

558  
559 Q: So from the time you guys pulled up into that front parking lot I guess we'll  
560 call it outside the East, uh, West gate...

561  
562 A: Yes.

563  
564 Q: ...ho- how long was it before the shots fi- was it immediate as soon as you  
565 guys pulled out there started opening up because he started driving towards  
566 you or was there a delay when he was just sitting in his car for a second or,  
567 um...

568  
569 A: Uh, it - it was seconds...

570  
571 Q: Seconds?

572  
573 A: ...was it yeah seconds...

574  
575 Q: Okay.

576  
577 A: ...it seems like a long time but seconds.

578  
579 Q: And then what happened when you guys ended up going up you said you for-  
580 uh, formed an arrest team and you guys went up what did you end up doing up  
581 at - at his car? Did you end up just leaving him in the car? Did he - or what  
582 happened at that point?  
583



584 A: No, uh, I held on him, um, and Officer Pap and I - I'm pretty sure it was  
585 Borngrebe, uh, gloved up...

586

587 Q: Okay.

588

589 A: ...um, because of the blood. And then they grabbed his arms and pulled him  
590 out and laid him face down into the - in the, uh, the parking lot.

591

592 Q: Okay. And was he handcuffed?

593

594 A: Uh, no not at that time he was completely unresponsive.

595

596 Q: Okay.

597

598 A: They - they left him unhandcuffed until, uh...

599

600 Q: Now you -- go ahead.

601

602 A: ...until, uh, AMR and RFD could treat him.

603

604 Q: Okay. Now the trunk of your vehicle was up?

605

606 A: No it was down.

607

608 Q: Okay. And when we got there I mean the trunk was up. Do you know why  
609 the trunk of the vehicle was up?

610

611 A: I have no idea.

612

613 Q: Okay - okay. Okay I don't think there's anything else. I think that covers  
614 pretty much all of it. Uh, but if we have more questions or whatever we'll get  
615 with you...

616

617 A: Okay.

618

619 Q: ...and see. But if you have questions for us also at any ti- at any point just get  
620 ahold of us. If you remembered something, um, but you pretty much covered  
621 it it's pretty quick...

622

623 A: Yeah.

624

625 Q: ...you know, the guy driving backwards. I mean that's amazing that he can  
626 drive that fast backwards through...

627

628 A: Yeah.

629  
630 Q: ...the whole complex and not hit somebody or some kid or, you know, he's  
631 obviously a danger to others by the way he was driving with reckless abandon  
632 for anybody that would have been because, uh, it was still early enough for  
633 people to be moving around and going to their cars.

634  
635 A: Right.

636  
637 Q: And to drive around even people block- blocking the exits and he still went  
638 around them...

639  
640 A: Yeah.

641  
642 Q: ...you know, so, um, okay. And you never fired one round at all?

643  
644 A: No.

645  
646 Q: Okay. Okay well it is 1:05 in the morning and that concludes the interview.
