Interview with Officer Oakes:

Officer Cory Oakes
Swing shift / Assignment: C-330
3 years with RPD

On 02-26-13 at approximately 0300 hours, I interviewed Officer Corey Oakes in the Conference Room at the Magnolia Avenue Police Station. The interview was digitally recorded and later downloaded to the server for future reference. Among those present during the interview were Detective Ron Sanfilippo, Deputy DA Daima Calhoun, DA Investigator Ricardo Fuentes, and Attorney Kasey Sirody with the law offices of Lackie, Dammeier, McGill & Ethier.

Officer Oakes said that on 03-25-13 at approximately 2045 hours, he was on duty and partnered with Officer K. Wilder. Both officers were dressed in full police uniform and they were driving a marked patrol car. Officer Oakes was driving the patrol car in the area of Arlington Avenue and the airport when he heard Officer Disla yelling on the radio. Officer Oakes said it sounded like Officer Disla was chasing someone so he responded to Officer Disla's location at 7911 Arlington code three with lights and sirens. Officer Oakes said he pulled into the Peppertree Apartments and turned right towards the east gate. He chose to turn towards the east gate because he saw several marked units were already parked near the west gate and only one other unit went towards the east gate. Officer Oakes said he followed that unit that was later identified as being Officer Fast and Officer Borngrebe.

Officer Oakes said the other unit stopped just outside the east gate and both officers were out of their patrol car with their guns drawn towards the suspect vehicle. They were face to face with the suspect's gray Honda that was trying to exit the gate. The suspect suddenly put his car in reverse and drove backwards at a high rate of speed (Approximately 30 MPH) to get away from the officers. Officer Oakes said that both of the other officers were still out of their patrol car. Officer Oakes said he had enough room to maneuver around their patrol car so he drove around the other officers and chased the suspect vehicle.

The suspect continued to drive his vehicle in reverse while being chased by Officer Oakes and his partner Officer Wilder. Officer Oakes said he got on the radio to advise that the suspect was most likely going to try and exit out the west gate. Another unknown officer then got on the radio and said that the west gate was blocked off. When they reached the west gate Officer Oakes said he saw a black car blocking it. The suspect vehicle slowed down and at that point Officer Oakes said he thought the suspect was going to foot bail.

The suspect drove around the black car still in reverse and Officer Oakes followed him beyond the gate. As they passed through the gate Officer Oakes said he saw an officer later identified as Officer Papp on foot with his gun drawn ordering the suspect to stop. The suspect vehicle did not comply and in fact he struck the gate near the officer with his car. The suspect backed up through the gate and headed in the only direction possible which was east. Officer Oakes said he saw the suspect vehicle come to a stop. He thought at that point that the suspect was going to exit his car and run. Officer Oakes said he pulled his patrol car up to where he could cut off the suspect if he did get out and run. He saw the suspect reaching around the front cab of the car for something but it's unknown what it was. Officer Oakes said it no longer appeared that the suspect was going to exit his car and run. Officer Oakes said he drew his weapon from his holster. The suspect revved the engine of his car and accelerated towards the patrol car

from approximately 20' away. At that point Officer Oakes feared for his life and he decided to shoot the suspect. He fired what he believed was a total of seven rounds at the windshield from a seated position in the driver seat. The suspect's vehicle impacted the driver side door of the patrol car. Officer Oakes said he heard Officer Wilder make several commands for the suspect to stop his car but the suspect did not comply.

After the shooting, Officer Oakes said he was trapped inside his patrol car by the suspect's vehicle. Officer Oakes said he warned the other officers that he was putting his patrol car in reverse to allow himself to open the driver side door. He backed the patrol car up far enough to free himself from the driver's seat. Officer Oakes said at the time of the shooting he was not aware if any other officer on scene fired their weapon.

Q: Okay. This is Detective (Mike) Medici. Again, this is reference police report number P13026517. Uh, it's February 26, 2013. The time is now, uh, 3:07 in the morning. Um, we are here with Officer Cory Oakes. In the room, uh, is Kasey – God, I'm gonna do this again...

Q1: I'm gonna make you.

Q: ... Sirody. See? Um, Detective (Ron) Sanfilippo, Daima Calhoun from the DA's Office here in Riverside. Let me get your information, okay, and then we'll start. So spell your last name for me?

A: O-A-K-E-S.

Q: You're an officer with city Riverside here.

A: Yes, sir.

Q: First name is Cory?

A: Yes, C-O-R-Y.

Q: Okay. What, uh, designator were you tonight?

A: Uh, C330.

Q: That was a two-man ride tonight?

A: Yes, sir.

Q: And who was your partner?

A: Officer (Wilder).

47 Q: Do you remember the unit you were driving? And if you don't, that's fine.

49 A: No.
50
51 Q: Okay. Um, what, uh, what shift do you work?
52
53 A: Uh, swing shift.
54
55 Q: You're wearing a police uniform right now, standard Riverside PD uniform.
56 Is that the same uniform you were wearing tonight?
57
58 A: Yes, sir.
59
60 Q: Okay. And the patrol car that you were driving is a fully marked patrol car,
61 um, insignias on it from Riverside, light bar...
62
63 A: Yes, sir.
64
65 Q: ... the whole shebang. Okay. Okay, I guess you were called out to 7911
66 Arlington tonight, uh, which is an apartment complex at Peppertree Place. Do
67 you want to run down to me how – how this happened and, uh, how you got
68 involved?

70 A: Yes, sir.
71
72 Q: Okay.
73
74 A: Um, I was in the area of, uh, Arlington and the airport, uh, watching traffic
75 pass. At that time, I heard on the radio, I believe it was Officer Disla start
76 screaming that, uh – yelling, very excited. Sounded like he was chasing
77 somebody. Um, dispatch, I believe, said where he was, so I started
78 responding code three. Um, while responding, I asked my partner, Officer
79 (Wilder), what was going on. He told me that there was – the call was a GTA.
80 I asked, you know, what the plate was, or some questions telling me what was
81 going on when I got on the scene. Um, we pulled into the – the Peppertrees.
82 Uh, I saw units were already on the left. Uh, the two main entrances. The
83 main entrance off Arlington and then two gates to get into the, uh, complex.
84 A west gate and an east gate. I saw a bunch of units were already on the west
85 gate. Uh, right when I pulled in, I saw just one unit goin' to the east side. So I
86 decided to follow that unit. Um, as I was – as I was following that unit, that
87 unit stopped as it was turning the corner to get into the complex. I rounded
88 the corner, I saw both officers out of the car, and they had a car at gunpoint.
89 Uh, there was a driver in the car, the police car and the suspect vehicle were
90 head to head when I saw it. Uh, shortly after that, I saw the officer and

91 suspect vehicle, um, flip it into reverse and start accelerating at a high rate of
92 speed in reverse, uh, through the apartment complex. Both the officers in the
93 police car were still out of the car, so I had enough room to maneuver my car
94 around theirs. Um, excuse me. I'll (unintelligible).

95
96 Q: Sure.

97
98 A: The, uh, suspect vehicle continued in reverse through the apartment complex.
99 Uh, I hopped on the radio, I told 'em what we were doing, I was chasing the –
100 the car through the rear of the apartment complex. I also hopped on the radio
101 and said that it was likely that, uh, it was gonna try to exit through the west
102 gate. Uh, someone hopped on the radio and said that they – they had it
103 blocked off. Or something like that. Anyway, I continued to follow the
104 suspect vehicle as it was in reverse. Uh, sure enough, we went to the west
105 gate. Um, he slowed down a little bit because – it looked like there was a
106 civilian car, there was a black car, sort of parked, uh, blocking the gate.
107 Suspect vehicle slowed down. Uh, I thought that he was gonna – he was
108 gonna foot bail at that point. So I positioned my car a little bit more to the
109 right to block him off when he exited the car. Turned out he didn't. He
110 actually went around the civilian car, uh, at which point I corrected my car,
111 went left, followed him. I saw there was an officer at the gate, uh, with his
112 gun drawn, pointed at the suspect vehicle, uh, yelling, "Stop," or something
113 similar to that, the suspect car. The suspect car didn't slow down and actually
114 hit the gate, uh, very close to where the officer was. Uh, right then, I knew
115 that he had no regard for, uh, for us. At least that was my mindset. So I
116 followed him through the gate. Uh, he was still in reverse. Once you get out
117 of the west gate, there's no other way to go except east, uh, to the main
118 entrance on Arlington. So sure enough, he backed up, east, um, and I saw his
119 car was trying to slow down. So I thought there was officers there that were
120 gonna block him. Again, I thought that he was gonna foot bail. So I
121 positioned my car a little bit more ahead so then he would open the door, I
122 would be ready. I noticed his car stopped. At that point, the – you know, I
123 thought he was gonna foot bail. I get my gun out of my holster. Uh, I keep
124 my eyes on him the whole time. I notice he's reaching around for something,
125 uh, it doesn't quite look like he's gonna get out. Uh, at that point, I hear the
126 engine of the car, uh, rev, uh, the RPM's and the car begins to accelerate
127 toward me. Uh, at that moment, I was in fear for my life. I thought he was
128 gonna ram my police car and possibly kill me. That's when I decided to, uh,
129 shoot at the suspect.

130
131 Q: Okay. Anything else before I kinda go over it again?

132
133 A: No, sir, I believe that...

134
135 Q: Okay.

136
137 A:covered everything
138
139 Q: Um, the initial police officers – you – when you went to east gate, you saw
140 two officers out of their car. Do you know who they were?
141
142 A: At the time, I did not. I – I know who they are now.
143
144 Q: Who – who do you think they are now?
145
146 A: Officer Fast and Officer Borngrebe
147
148 Q: Okay. They were a partner team as well tonight?
149
150 A: Yes, sir. I think they were doing a DUI patrol.
151
152 Q: Okay. And you know what, Cory, I don't think I asked you how long you've
153 been an officer. How long have you been a police officer?
154
155 A: I – I'll be sworn three years in June.
156
157 Q: Okay.
158
159 A: Nearly three years.
160
161 Q: And that's with RPD?
162
163 A: Yes, sir.
164
165 Q: Any other agencies?
166
167 A: No, sir.
168
169 Q: Okay. So this car's gone in reverse, uh, which is pretty incredible, for the
170 length of time it was in reverse.
171
172 A: Yes, sir.
173
174 Q: What did you estimate the speed at? Uh, if you can.
175
176 A: Uh, possibly 30, 30 miles an hour?
177
178 Q: Okay. Which in reverse is a pretty good clip, I guess, huh?
179

- 180 A: Yeah, the – I mean, the – the apartment was very winedy. It's not a – a
181 straight shot to get through it. Uh, to be honest, I was pretty impressed with
182 his driving skills to be doing that in reverse.
183
- 184 Q: Okay. At any point in time, how close do you think – because you were face
185 to face now. You're – you're goin' forward, he's goin' reverse, you guys are
186 lookin' at each other. How close do you think you were to him?
187
- 188 A: Uh, maybe 20 feet.
189
- 190 Q: Okay. Any reaction to him looking at you? Any facial expressions, any –
191 what was your take on that?
192
- 193 A: I saw that he had a panicked look on his face. Um, from what I remember
194 driving, following him, his main concern, I thought, was looking over his
195 shoulder, making sure he didn't crash. Uh, he didn't spend a whole lot of time
196 looking at me.
197
- 198 Q: Okay. So he was turned over his shoulder, looking in reverse.
199
- 200 A: Yes.
201
- 202 Q: He makes it all the way over to the west gate, which is blocked. Um, and you
203 heard that traffic come over the radio, so you knew there was gonna be a
204 blocked gate over there?
205
- 206 A: I – I assumed there would be. I – I heard on the radio that they – they had it
207 blocked. I didn't know what that meant. But...
208
- 209 Q: So when you got over there, in fact, it was blocked. Right?
210
- 211 A: Yes.
212
- 213 Q: By – by the vehicle? There was a car blockin' that gate?
214
- 215 A: Yes. It looked like it was a civilian car
216
- 217 Q: Okay. Um, suspect car clears that in reverse, correct?
218
- 219 A: Yes.
220
- 221 Q: And, uh, ends up, as you said, going east. 'Cause that's the only way you can
222 exit that area.
223
- 224 A: Yes.

225
226 Q: When you pull forward, um, or – or let me backtrack. You said you saw an
227 officer standing by the gate.
228
229 A: Yes.
230
231 Q: Any idea who that was?
232
233 A: At the time, I didn't know. But I know who it was now.
234
235 Q: Who is that?
236
237 A: Officer Pap.
238
239 Q: Okay. By the gate, there's also kind of a – of a – of a wall, if you will, or a
240 stucco area. Do you know what I'm talkin' about?
241
242 A: No.
243
244 Q: Okay. So when you said you saw Pap by the gate, was he – which side of the
245 gate was he on? North or south?
246
247 A: He's on – he was on the south side. The opposite side from where we were
248 coming from.
249
250 Q: Okay. And he had his gun out?
251
252 A: Yes.
253
254 Q: Where was Officer Papp pointing his gun?
255
256 A: At the suspect vehicle.
257
258 Q: Okay. Which was now on the other side of the gate? Right? It's on the south
259 side of the gate?
260
261 A: Once the suspect vehicle passed Officer Pap
262
263 Q: Mm-hm.
264
265 A: ... I did not – I did not see what he did.
266
267 Q: Okay.

269 A: Uh, before the suspect vehicle passed the gate, I saw Officer Pap pointing his
270 gun at the suspect vehicle.
271
272 Q: Did you ever see Lieutenant (Griffitts) there?
273
274 A: No.
275
276 Q: Or his vehicle?
277
278 A: After the incident was done, I saw Lieutenant (Griffitts) there.
279
280 Q: Okay, but while this was occurring, you had no idea that his car was back
281 there.
282
283 A: No, sir.
284
285 Q: You were focused on the suspect vehicle.
286
287 A: Yes, sir.
288
289 Q: At -- at some point in time, when you passed through the gate as well, was that
290 suspect vehicle stopped? Or was it always moving?
291
292 A: I -- as I passed, I noticed it was, uh, coming to a stop -- it did eventually stop.
293
294 Q: Okay. And that is when you pulled up to block him from bailing, I think is
295 what you said?
296
297 A: Yes, I'm anticipating him opening his driver door.
298
299 Q: Tell me about the position of your car, uh, and driver's door in relation to the
300 front of his car.
301
302 A: The front of his car was pointing directly at my driver's door.
303
304 Q: And how much separation do you think was between, say, the bumper and
305 your door?
306
307 A: Uh, maybe like 20 feet?
308
309 Q: Okay.
310
311 A: Fifteen, 20 feet?
312

313 Q: So then at – at – at some point – and you were in the car – was your window
314 rolled up or down, do you know?
315

316 A: My window was down. I was in the car.
317

318 Q: Okay. Car door was closed?
319

320 A: Yes.
321

322 Q: And then at – was it at this point you heard revving or an acceleration?
323

324 A: Yes, sir.
325

326 Q: Okay. From approximately 20 feet or so away?
327

328 A: Yes, sir.
329

330 Q: What does he do next, then? Does he just put it in drive and come at your
331 vehicle?
332

333 A: Yes.
334

335 Q: Okay. Does it actually impact your – your vehicle?
336

337 A: Yes, it does.
338

339 Q: So you felt the impact of the car?
340

341 A: Yes.
342

343 Q: Any commands by either yourself, any other officer that you heard or are
344 aware of?
345

346 A: Um, yes. Officer (Wilder), uh, was giving commands to the suspect, like, uh,
347 "Put your hands up."
348

349 Q: Okay. And do you know when those commands, uh – and – and I realize a
350 lot's goin' through your head at this point, so I'm just trying to get an idea if
351 those commands came, uh, before he accelerated, after he accelerated, if you
352 know.
353

354 A: I believe it was the point between him still reversing and accelerating toward
355 us.
356

357 Q: Okay.

358
359 A: It's that moment where he was stopped and fiddling around with the, uh, what
360 I presume was the gear shifter.
361
362 Q: Okay. So he puts it in gear, he drives at you. At what point do you think,
363 again, if you remember, when you actually fired the first shot? Had he hit you
364 first or not hit you first?
365
366 A: As soon as I saw the vehicle coming toward me, uh, that's when I knew he
367 was going to ram me, and that's as soon as I – I started firing.
368
369 Q: Okay. And you fired through your open window, I assume, as opposed to
370 getting out of the car?
371
372 A: Yes. I – I had my – I think I had my gun partially out the window.
373
374 Q: Okay.
375
376 A: The – I bladed my body my on the inside of the car.
377
378 Q: Do you know where, um, you – your – your sight picture was as far as on the
379 car? Was it windshield, hood...
380
381 A: It was windshield.
382
383 Q: Okay. Um, no one el- else in his car, no other passengers in his vehicle that
384 you saw?
385
386 A: No. There was no one else in the car.
387
388 Q: Okay. Did you hear anybody else besides yourself firing?
389
390 A: No.
391
392 Q: And do you know how many rounds you think you might've fired?
393
394 A: Initially, I thought I fired seven rounds.
395
396 Q: Okay. Um, and initially, are you thinking differently now? And not that it
397 matters, I – I'm just asking...
398
399 A: I was there when they charted my gun, and I fired eight rounds.
400
401 Q: Okay. All right. Um, where did you feel the impact on your patrol car from –
402 from his vehicle?

403
404 A: I felt his car hit my driver's side door.
405
406 Q: Okay. Then what happened after that? There's an impact, the rounds are
407 fired, w- what happened then?
408
409 A: After that, I took a deep breath, uh, and I realized I was trapped in the car.
410 Because the suspect vehicle was resting against my car. There was no way to
411 go forward, uh, so I think he actually hit another car that was sort of sticking
412 out of the parking space a little bit. Um, so I started yelling to the officers
413 behind me that I was going to reverse to make sure I didn't hit them. Uh, at
414 that point, I didn't know if he had a weapon, if, uh, he was still able to use it
415 against me. So my priority was to get out of there. Uh, so I yelled, "I'm - I'm
416 backin' up, I'm backin' up." I reversed just enough to open my door, and then
417 I - it - it just went from there.
418
419 Q: Okay. Was your partner out of the car?
420
421 A: I never looked over.
422
423 Q: Okay. So you don't know one way or another whether he was still in the car
424 with you or - or actually out of the car at that point?
425
426 A: No.
427
428 Q: Okay.
429
430 A: I kept my eye's on the suspect.
431
432 Q: So you - you reversed the car to give you enough clearance to get out of the
433 car.
434
435 A: Yes. At the end of me - my reversal, the suspect vehicle was then resting on,
436 you know, like the - where the - like the front of the quarter panel of my car.
437
438 Q: Okay.
439
440 A: So my door was able to open.
441
442 Q: Did you ever see him, um, TC into any other cars over there? Like
443 beforehand? Did you see him crash into a car?
444
445 A: No. Just the gate, and then I saw him, uh, hit - I think a maroon Expedition or
446 something right before he stopped and then accelerated toward me.
447

448 Q: Okay. So you did see him impact the gate with what? Do you know? The –
449 the...

450
451 A: With, uh, the rear passenger side bumper of his car.

452
453 Q: Okay. So he impacts the gate, and then at some point, you did see him impact
454 the SUV that was out there?

455
456 A: Yes.

457
458 Q: A- as well? And then all this happened from that point on?

459
460 A: Yes, sir.

461
462 Q: Okay. You ever seen this guy before?

463
464 A: No.

465
466 Q: To your knowledge? Okay. Were you part of the after plan here, the arrest
467 team, if you will, to remove him from the car?

468
469 A: No.

470
471 Q: Okay. Did you see that portion?

472
473 A: Yes.

474
475 Q: Can you kinda just run that down to me?

476
477 A: Yes. Uh, I was standing both – first I got out of the car, um, everybody's –
478 body's asking me if I'm okay. I told 'em I was. Uh, we formed up a team, we
479 walked around the outside of my car to the front, uh, over to the suspect. I
480 stayed back and, uh, stayed near the trunk of his car and kept cover, uh, 'cause
481 he was still moving. Uh, we were tellin' him not to move, but his – his body
482 was still jerking around. Um, at that point, there's probably four or five
483 officers on the – the driver's side. They opened the – the car door, um, and
484 pulled him out. At that point, I, uh, I was taken away by Sergeant Tipre I
485 didn't see what happened after that.

486
487 Q: Who put out the shots fired call, do you know?

488
489 A: No, I don't know.

490
491 Q: Okay. Did you hear it?

492

493 A: No.
494
495 Q: Okay. Um, and – and did you get on the air at all after this turn of events?
496
497 A: No.
498
499 Q: Okay. What about, uh, the medical aid? Do you know if, uh, it even arrived
500 or when it arrived? Were you still there?
501
502 A: Yes. I saw it arrive, I saw the – the two EM Ts or whoever, uh, AMR
503 employees, uh, walk over to him, but at that point, I – I didn't stick around.
504
505 Q: Okay.
506
507 A: I think I left with Officer, uh, (Putnam) at that point.
508
509 Q: Well, I certainly don't expect you to know how long it took 'em to get there,
510 but it seemed reasonable to you, amount of time for the medical aid to get
511 there?
512
513 A: Yeah, it was very reasonable. I – I think – it seemed like maybe a few
514 minutes after we pulled him out of the car that they were – they were there.
515
516 Q: Mm-hm. He never said anything to you? The suspect?
517
518 A: No.
519
520 Q: Okay. Did you notice any movement after he was out of the car at all?
521
522 A: No.
523
524 Q: Okay. (Ron)?
525
526 Q2: When you said (Wilder) was yelling commands. Was this when you guys just
527 passed the gate? From the passenger seat, he was yellin' the commands and
528 that?
529
530 A: Yes, it was when the suspect vehicle stopped...
531
532 Q2: Okay.
533
534 A: ... and was pointing at our car. That's when he was – he was digging around.
535 We weren't sure what he was doing at the time until I heard the engine revving
536 and the car started moving. I realized he was actually shifting it into drive.
537

538 Q2: Mm-hm.
539
540 A: We weren't sure if he was accessing a weapon, anything like that.
541
542 Q2: Was – was (Wilder) still in the car when he was doing that?
543
544 A: Yes.
545
546 Q2: Okay. Did you see another police car behind the suspect vehicle at that point?
547
548 A: At that point, no.
549
550 Q2: Okay. Um, just a couple of little things. Uh, the trunk in your car was up,
551 you know, just wondering – at the scene. Do you know who was in your
552 trunk? Why the trunk was up?
553
554 A: Uh, I'm not sure why the trunk was up.
555
556 Q2: Okay. Um, and then we'll go back to the shooting real quick. Your mindset at
557 that point, the reason you fired, you brought the gun up, you heard the
558 revving, and – and your mindset at that point was – what – what was going
559 through your mind at that point?
560
561 A: At that point, and especially after seein' him almost hit Officer Papp at that
562 point, I thought he was gonna try to kill me, uh, with his vehicle.
563
564 Q2: Okay. And then you fired you – you think maybe seven shots. And then the
565 impact happened right after that? Or was it kinda simultaneous? Or you're
566 not sure?
567
568 A: At the time? It seemed like I got off most of the rounds before the impact.
569
570 Q2: Mm-hm.
571
572 A: After watchin' the video, it seemed like it was simultaneous.
573
574 Q2: Okay. Okay. And what's your I.D. number?
575
576 A: One five seven zero.
577
578 Q2: Okay.
579
580 Q: Is there any reason to take a – a break?
581
582 Q1: No.

583

584 Q: Uh, how about your end over there?

585

586 Q1: No.

587

588 Q: Okay. Do you have any questions at all for us?

589

590 A: No, sir.

591

592 Q: Nothing? All right. It's, uh, just about 3:30. We'll end the interview...
