2 W1/Serna is the aunt of W2/Rodriguez.

4 Scene Description/Observations:

5 W1/Serna and W2/Rodriguez both reside at [REDACTED]

9 Background:

10 W1/Serna has resided at the aforementioned residence for approximately 13 years. W1/Serna informed
11 me that she and S/Ledezma are cordial with each other but not close friends.

12
13 Furthermore, W1/Serna was aware S/Ledezma and his significant other were always involved in verbal
14 and/or physical altercations. She explained to me it was a regular occurrence for S/Ledezma and his "wife
15 or girlfriend" to be drinking heavily and arguing loudly. W1/Serna stated she never called the police on
16 the couple reference these altercations because she felt it was none of her business nor did she want to get
17 involved.

19 Narrative:

20 On 01-07-12, at approximately 1615 hours, I was dispatched to 10745 Cypress Ave. reference a "shots
21 fired" broadcast by another police officer. Prior to my arrival, officers on scene advised, via RPD radio
22 communications, that they were "code 4" but still needed scene assistance. I arrived and canvassed the
23 area for eyewitnesses to the incident. I separately contacted W1/Serna and W2/Rodriguez and they
24 provided the following statements:

26 Statements:

27 W1/Serna stated that on 01-07-12, at about 1200 hours, she observed S/Ledezma and a female half
28 arguing loudly to the rear of 10745 Cypress Ave. W1/Serna explained to me that her living room faces the
29 backyard of her neighbor's house and with her screen door closed the verbal altercation was easily audible
30 to her within the home. S/Ledezma continued to argue with his significant other on and off for the entire
31 afternoon. At around 1600 hours, the argument grew extremely loud and W1/Serna stepped out of her
32 residence to observe what was taking place and watched as they continued to argue.

34 Shortly afterwards, W1/Serna saw two, fully-uniformed, Riverside Police Department, male police
35 officers begin to approach S/Ledezma who was in the rear yard by himself. The two police officers were
36 also accompanied by another male in a light-blue Riverside Police Department uniform she translated as a
37 "training" uniform. At this point W1/Serna was approximately 100 feet away from the officers as they
38 began to speak towards the direction of S/Ledezma. Due to the significant distance, W1/Serna was unable
39 to interpret what the police officers were telling S/Ledezma but she knew the police officers were for sure
40 yelling at S/Ledezma because of the manner in which their voices were being projected.

42 Approximately two to three minutes later, W1/Serna believed she saw S/Ledezma throw an unknown item
43 towards the officers who were standing about five to seven feet in front of him. The police officers
44 continued to yell at S/Ledezma who appeared to be ignoring their demands. W1/Serna then watched as
45 S/Ledezma picked up what appeared to be a large metal pole from the ground and "chucked" it towards

1 the police officers. W1/Serna explained that in her opinion, the approximately 2 – 3 foot metal pipe was
2 thrown in full effort and/or strength by S/Ledezma with the intent to hit the officers that were standing
3 directly in front of him. From the position in which she was standing, W1/Serna did not believe the metal
4 pipe had hit the police officers but she was unsure due to the bushes blocking her view.

5
6 After this had occurred, S/Ledezma again bent down to pick up an unknown item and quickly afterwards
7 W1/Serna heard what she believed to be about 6 gun shots coming from the direction of the police
8 officers towards S/Ledezma; she then quickly ran back into the house.

9
10 W2/Rodriguez stated that on 01-07-12, at about 1600 hours, she heard a loud argument outside her front
11 door and across the way. Along with W1/Serna, she stepped out of her residence to observe what was
12 taking place and watched as S/Ledezma continued to argue with a Hispanic female adult.

13
14 Shortly afterwards, W2/Rodriguez saw about five, fully-uniformed, Riverside Police Department, male
15 police officers begin to approach S/Ledezma who was in the rear yard by himself. At this point
16 W2/Rodriguez was approximately 100 feet away from the officers as they began to speak towards the
17 direction of S/Ledezma. Due to the significant distance, W2/Rodriguez was unable to interpret what the
18 police officers were telling S/Ledezma but she knew the police officers were yelling because of their loud
19 voices; additionally at least two police officers were holding guns in their hands and had them pointed at
20 S/Ledezma.

21
22 Approximately two to three minutes later, W2/Rodriguez then watched as S/Ledezma picked up what
23 appeared to be a large metal pole from the ground and throw it at the police officers. W2/Rodriguez
24 explained that in her opinion, the approximately 2 – 3 foot metal pipe was thrown in full effort and/or
25 strength by S/Ledezma with the intent to hit the officers that were standing directly in front of him. From
26 the position in which she was standing, W2/Rodriguez did not believe the metal pipe had hit the police
27 officers but she was unsure due to the bushes blocking her view.

28
29 After this had occurred, W2/Rodriguez heard what she believed to be about 10 gun shots coming from the
30 direction of the police officers towards S/Ledezma; she then quickly ran back into the house.

32 Investigative Actions:

33 I assisted with crime scene security until advised by Sgt. Banks that it was okay to leave at approximately
34 2000 hours.
