Supplemental Report

INVESTIGATING OFFICER

1 **SOURCE:**

2 I am currently assigned to the Police and Corrections Team PACT. I was working with Officer
3 Arangure #1564 when we heard a request for assistance from another officer due to shots being fired.
4 The request was at 10745 Cypress Avenue. We responded to the call and arrived within a few minutes of
5 the request.

7 **INVESTIGATION:**

8 Upon our arrival to the front of the residence, we saw the officers who were attempting to control
9 an upset family at the back of the property. They were also holding cover on the wounded suspect. While
10 officers controlled the family, we formed an arrest team to approach the suspect so that we could detain
11 him and get him medical aid. My responsibility on the arrest team was covering a portion of the yard that
12 had not been cleared. We moved forward, I stepped beyond the suspect to cover the officers who were
13 placing him into custody. Once the suspect was placed into custody, we cleared the yard and the sheds
14 for additional suspects and advised that it was clear for RFD/AMR to respond. After clearing one of the
15 sheds in the backyard, I came back out to the scene of the shooting and saw that medical personnel were
16 already working on the suspect.

18 I asked an officer to retrieve some crime scene tape from a trunk of a unit and bring it back to the
19 scene. Officer Adcox and I placed that crime scene tape around the inner perimeter of the crime scene.
20 We began placing crime scene markers at the site of all the obvious items of evidence; however the wind
21 kept blowing the markers away from the evidence. Another officer was ordered to photograph the scene
22 in the event that the wind continued to worsen. I placed officers in places where I felt they could control
23 the crime scene and prevent any destruction of evidence (Officer Wilcox was asked to contain the west
24 property line, Officer K. Corbett was asked to contain the Eastside of the residence, Officer Gomez was
25 placed at the front door of the residence, and Officer C. Reeves was asked to stand at the rear door of the
26 residence, which opened up into the inner perimeter.

28 I remained on scene to help with crime scene security.
