4 **Assignment:**

5 On January 7, 2012 I was contacted by Det. Cobb and asked to respond to 10745 Cypress Ave,
6 Riverside to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. I agreed to assist and arrived at the
7 scene at around 1800 hrs. Upon arrival, I met with members of the RPD Robbery/ Homicide Unit and
8 took part in a briefing provided by patrol Sgt. Banks. He told us that RPD officers had been called to
9 the location reference a domestic violence call and they met with the victim (V/Rebecca Ledezma) to the
10 front of the residence. After speaking with her, the officers walked to the end of the residence driveway
11 where they contacted S/David Ledezma. There, the officers attempted to calm down David who was
12 agitated and armed with tools. David pulled out a knife and threatened to kill himself while talking with
13 the officers. He then armed himself with a metal bar which he later threw at the officers. Officers
14 attempted to use a Taser on David but it had no effect. Next, he armed himself with another bar/ pipe
15 and came toward the officers who fired several rounds at him causing him to fall to the ground. David
16 was taken to the hospital where he was pronounced dead.

17
18 After the briefing, I took part in a walk-through of the scene to see the pieces of evidence and get a feel
19 for where the shooting took place. Next, I was told someone who lives at the house may have video
20 recorded the incident with their cell phone. I located this subject, W/Yvette Ledezma who was sitting
21 on a couch inside the 10745 Cypress Ave residence. Yvette agreed to show me her cell phone and found
22 it did not have the ability to video record. She did admit to using her phone to take several pictures but
23 only after the shooting had taken place. Yvette agreed to come to CIB to give me an interview and to
24 allow me to make copies of the pictures she had taken with her phone.

25
26 Back at CIB, I downloaded 18 photos from Yvette's phone to my computer and then had them uploaded
27 to this case file in the RPD photo server.

28
29 I conducted an interview with Yvette at CIB. This interview was audio recorded and what follows is a
30 synopsis of that interview.

31
32 **W/Yvette Ledezma (Bachicha):**

33 Yvette is S/David Ledezma's daughter. She lives at the Cypress Ave address in the main house, with
34 her children, grandparents and other relatives. David and her mother, V/Rebecca Ledezma, live in a
35 second house to the rear of the property near where this shooting occurred. Yvette was home inside the
36 main house living room when this incident began.

37
38 Earlier on the 7th, David and Rebecca went to a car wash earlier in the day which was being held for a
39 friend of Rebecca. Yvette could not recall the time they left for the car wash. The couple was gone for
40 around two hours and returned with David driving their Dodge Intrepid very fast into the driveway. She
41 estimated the time to be around 1500 or 1400 hrs but she could not be certain. The fact David was
42 driving so fast made Yvette take notice because there are usually several children playing in the front
43 yard driveway area that everyone knows to drive slowly when they pull onto the property.

1 Due to his driving, Yvette knew something was wrong. She decided to get up and go to the back door of
2 the house that faces toward the area near her mom and dad's home to see what was going on. As she
3 looked out the door, she saw David taking items out of the trunk of the Intrepid. Yvette went outside to
4 her dad and he said to her, "You better talk to your mom before she thinks about calling the cops."
5 Yvette told him she did not want to hear about anything and walked back into the house. David and
6 Rebecca argue and fight all the time. They both drink a lot of alcohol and fight when they get drunk.
7 These fights happen 2-3 times a week.

8
9 Yvette sat back down on the couch and saw her cousin Yvonne with Rebecca outside near the front
10 door. Yvette could see Rebecca's face was black looking because of mascara running down her face
11 from crying. Yvette saw that Yvonne was on the phone and Rebecca said she was calling the police
12 about what had happened. Yvette could tell David had done something to her because he face and neck
13 were red and her hair was messed up and Rebecca is very particular about keeping her hair in place.
14 Yvette went back inside. Rebecca said David had all her money and she wanted the police to help her
15 get it back.

16
17 A short time later, 3-5 police officers arrived at the house and began to walk toward the area where
18 David had been with the Intrepid. Yvette walked outside and stood near the front door where she could
19 watch both the officers and David, who was still doing something inside the trunk of the car. David was
20 pulling several tools from the car as the officers approached him. The officers asked him to stop what
21 he was doing and to come to them but David said no and continued what he was doing. At one point,
22 the officers told David to take his hands out of his pockets. David complied, turned toward the officers
23 and pulled out a knife that he opened and put the blade to his throat. The officers yelled several times
24 for him to stop what he was doing but David did not initially listen. The officers drew their weapons.
25 When he finally complied, David threw down the knife and picked up a plastic "stick" or something
26 similar. Yvette did not think David would put down the "stick" because the officers had drawn their
27 guns.

28
29 Yvette said the officers began to move closer to David who was standing near the front of the Intrepid.
30 As they moved, David began swinging the "stick". The officers fired their guns at David. David went
31 to the ground and Yvette claimed the officers continued to shoot when he was down on the ground.
32 Yvette and her family members were told to stand back while the officers checked on David. An
33 ambulance was called for David which she claimed took a long time. All of the witnesses were moved to
34 the front of the property where they waited.

35
36 Yvette admitted that David should never have picked up the "stick" after he put down the knife. Yvette
37 said there was something different today about the problems between her mom and dad. Yvette believes
38 David beat Rebecca up today. Rebecca is known to hit David in the past and felt she could have started
39 things today but she felt David did hurt her today. Yvette recalled the police officers were dressed in the
40 usual RPD dark uniforms and one was dressed in a light blue shirt. The officers talked with Rebecca for
41 a few moments and then headed to the back to talk with David.

1
2 When the officers first contacted David, he was at his trunk. As he pulled out the knife, he stood near
3 the right rear passenger door of the car. He ended up near the front of the car before the shooting.
4 David told the officers that Rebecca had been hitting him and that he was not going to be taken to jail.
5 As he held the knife to his throat, Yvette and her cousin Cynthia both yelled at David to put down the
6 knife but he would not follow their directions either. Yvette estimated the standoff between David and
7 the officers lasted around 3 minutes before he dropped the knife.

8
9 After the shooting, Yvette heard medical personnel say something about having to remove Taser darts
10 from her dad. She does not recall the officers tazing David. She only saw them firing their guns at him.
11 Yvette said David never threw the "stick" at the officers. He did smash it against a small shed he was
12 standing near. After he struck the shed, he moved toward the officers moving the "stick" back and forth.
13 Yvette thought the officers fired five or more shots. Yvette estimated the officers and David were only a
14 few feet apart when the shooting happened.

15
16 I asked Yvette to draw a map showing the property around her house and to mark certain areas of
17 importance. She marked the main house, the shed, David's car and how it was parked, where David was
18 when he was shot, the officers where they were when the shot and where she was standing during the
19 incident. I had her sign the drawing when she was finished. A copy of the drawing is attached to this
20 report.

21
22 Once our interview was completed, she was taken to RCH, along with three other family members, by
23 an RPD officer.

24
25 Det. Cobb and I next spoke with V/Rebecca Ledezma. Rebecca looked like she had been through a lot
26 today. Her hair appeared to have been messed up and it looked as if she had been crying. This
27 interview was recorded and what follows is a synopsis.

28
29 V/Rebecca Ledezma:

30 Rebecca and David have been married for some time and have had domestic violence problems in the
31 past. David had been arrested a few years ago for assaulting Rebecca but the police have not been
32 involved in any of the more recent incidents. Rebecca described David as an alcoholic who drinks
33 several beers a day on a regular basis.

34
35 Today, Rebecca and David woke up and were getting ready for a benefit car wash in Home Gardens,
36 being held for a friend of Rebecca's. David got up around 0700 hrs and started drinking right away.
37 Over the course of the day, she felt David consumed around 12, 24 oz. beers. She and David got into an
38 argument before they left for the car wash. Once at the car wash, their argument continued. At one
39 point, Rebecca was alone talking with a friend of hers who told her that David had cheated on her in the
40 past and that everyone knew about it. This made Rebecca angry and upset so when she and David left
41 the car wash, she confronted David about what she had learned. David became belligerent and called
42 Rebecca a "fucking bitch!" He smacked Rebecca in the face and head several times with the back of his
43 hand. Rebecca sustained a bloody nose from the strikes.

1 Afraid she would be further injured, Rebecca threatened to call the police from her cell phone. As she
2 pulled out her phone and tried to make a call, David grabbed her phone and took the phone from her,
3 putting it into the pocket of the driver's door. He then grabbed Rebecca by the hair and began pulling
4 her hair really hard as he yelled at her. Rebecca started crying and tried to roll down her passenger
5 window to yell for help to passing cars but David used his window controller to keep her window from
6 going down. This type of situation continued all the way home with David driving very fast and at times
7 unsafe.

8
9 Once at home, David drove onto the property and parked their car (a Dodge Intrepid) in the back near
10 their room. Rebecca got out of the car and went to the front of the property where she met with
11 W/Yvonne Delacruz, Rebecca's niece. Yvonne could see that Rebecca had been crying, her hair was
12 messed up and she had been beat up. Rebecca told Yvonne about what David had done and said she
13 wanted to call the police so she could get her money back from David and leave without any further
14 problems. Since David still had Rebecca's phone in their car, Yvonne offered to call the police from her
15 phone. Yvonne told the police about what had happened and the two women waited near the front of the
16 house for the police to arrive. David told Rebecca, "Look what happens to your car!" while she and
17 Yvonne waited for police. Rebecca watched as David took things from the trunk of her car and also
18 appeared to be damaging the engine compartment of the car.

19
20 The first two officers to arrive were both uniformed and in a marked police car. One of the officers
21 spoke with Rebecca about what had happened. Rebecca told the officer that David had been drinking,
22 the assault she was subjected to and that David might have a small pocket knife on him at that time. She
23 also told the officer that she just wanted her money from David and to leave in her car. While she talked
24 with the officer, David yelled at Rebecca and the officers "What are you gonna do about it?!" A few
25 minutes later, another police car arrived and two more uniformed officers came to assist the other
26 officers. All four officers began to walk to the back of the property where David was still doing
27 something to the car. Rebecca and Yvonne were told to stay near the front of the property while the
28 officers talked with David.

29
30 A few minutes later, Rebecca heard multiple gunshots coming from the area where David and the
31 officers had been. Rebecca began to run toward that area and saw one of the officers fall to the ground
32 while he was shooting. Seconds later, the shooting stopped and David lay on the ground to the front of
33 their car. Rebecca did not see the confrontation between the officers and David. She only heard the
34 shots and then showed up once the shooting was about finished. She did not know what caused the
35 officers to shoot David.

36
37 After our initial interview, Det. Cobb and I re-contacted Rebecca and told her David had died as a result
38 of his injuries. She was very shaken up and blamed herself for his death. Rebecca said this was the
39 worst that David has ever been in the time they have been together.

40
41 Det. Cobb and I next spoke with RPD Explorer Martin Martinez. He had been on a ride-along with Ofc.
42 Miranda at the time of this shooting. He was interviewed in the presence of DDA Shouka and DA Inv.
43 Fuentes. His interview was audio recorded and what follows is a synopsis of the interview.

1 W/Martin Martinez (RPD Explorer):
2 Martin was assigned as a ride-along observer to ride with Ofc. Miranda for his swing shift tour of duty
3 this night. Martin was in his class B RPD Explorer uniform (dark colored pants with a light blue shirt,
4 Sam brown belt and no weapons) for this ride-along. Martin has been on 12 prior ride-alongs but this
5 was his first time with riding with Ofc. Miranda. He and Ofc. Miranda were assigned as #C438 for this
6 shift. Ofc. Miranda drove their marked RPD unit while Martin was the passenger. They received a
7 radio call of a spousal abuse on Cypress Ave and began heading to the call.
8
9 When they arrived, they were flagged down by a female who was standing near the front of a residence.
10 Ofc. Miranda parked their unit around two houses away and they approached the woman on foot. As
11 they got closer, Martin could see the woman's face was red and her make-up was running. Her hair was
12 messy and she was crying. It looked to Martin like she had been beaten up by someone. The female
13 (later ID'ed to be Rebecca Ledezma) told the officers that her husband, S/David Ledezma, had struck
14 her several times in the face during an argument. He was also keeping her money, approximately \$200,
15 from her and would not return it. Ofc. Miranda asked her if David had any weapons and she said he had
16 a knife on him.
17
18 Two other officers arrived in another marked unit and were going to provide back up to Martin and Ofc.
19 Miranda. The four men began walking to the rear of the property where Martin could see David doing
20 something to a car, taking things out of it and walking around. The officers attempted to make verbal
21 contact with David but he said he "did not care" that they were there and continued doing what he
22 wanted to do. The officers told David several times to show them his hands but he still would not
23 follow their commands. Martin watched as David lifted his shirt and reached toward his waistband
24 causing the officers to pull out their weapons and point them at David. David pulled a knife from his
25 clothing and opened the blade. David then pointed the blade toward his own neck and said he didn't
26 care what the officers wanted him to do. All of the officers gave David commands to drop the knife and
27 to get on the ground but David disregarded their commands and continued to hold the knife to his neck
28 as he walked near the front of the car.
29
30 Once at the front of the car, David threw down the knife and suddenly held up a white "stick". One of
31 the officers deployed their Taser in an effort to stop David but it had little to no effect on him. It only
32 served to make David more angry. David threw this "stick" at the officers, trying to hit them with it,
33 causing all of the officers to fire their weapons at David. Martin recalled Ofc. Putnam tripped and fell to
34 the ground at one point while firing his weapon. When the shooting ended, David was on the ground
35 saying he was thirsty. The officers continued to hold David at gunpoint until additional units arrived.
36 Fire personnel arrived soon after and David was treated by them before being transported.
37
38 Martin said he was unable to see the entire incident because his attention was divided between the
39 officers contacting David and close to 10 members of David's family gathering near the officers just
40 before the shooting. Martin continued to look back at the officers and David as he also dealt with family
41 members who were getting too close to the officers talking with David. The kept Martin from seeing
42 every part of the incident as it happened. Martin estimated the distance between the officers and David
43 at the time of the shooting to be between 15 and 20 feet.

1 Martin described David's demeanor during the entire contact as defiant, threatening and violent. David
2 would not listen to the officer's commands and continued to pose a threat as the officers tried to gain his
3 compliance. Martin felt David might have been on some type of drugs during this incident due to his
4 actions. After seeing what David had done to the crying female who flagged them down and his refusal
5 to listen to the officers, Martin felt David was a threat to him and the officers on scene.

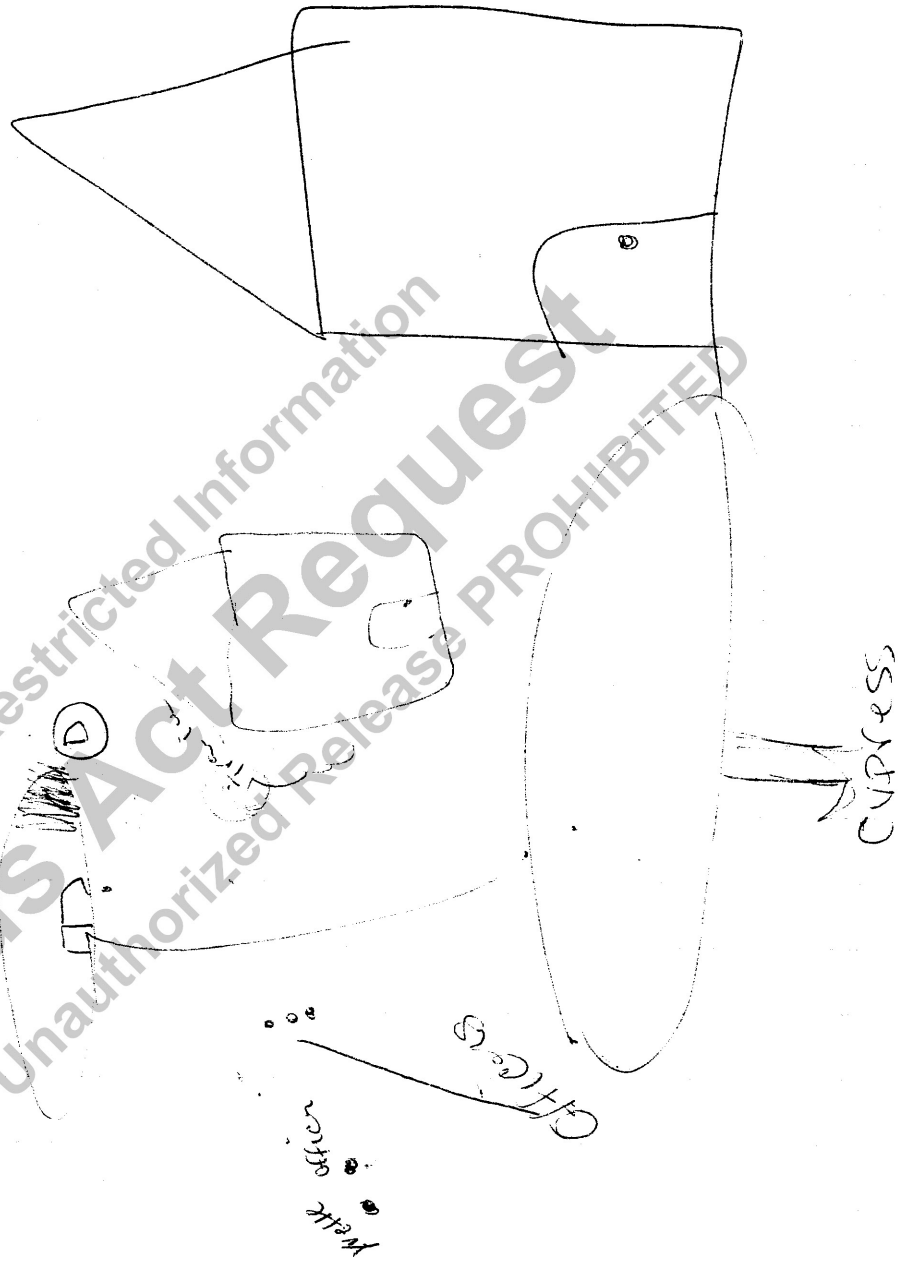

Inquires regarding the status of the potential release of weapon(s) may be directed to the Police Property Unit by calling (909) 351-6021. Welfare and Institution Code § 8102 mandates police officers confiscate weapons from persons detained under the provisions of Welfare and Institution Code § 5150. Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code § 8102, the health care facility must notify the detained individual of the procedure for return of the weapons. See reverse side for release instructions.

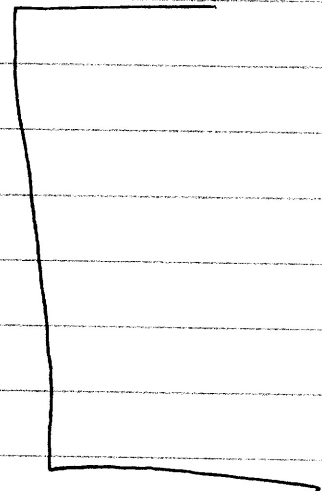
