Narrative of Supplemental Report:

On May 10, 2011, at about 1757 hours, I heard a call dispatched of an unknown trouble at 11532 Trailway Dr. Shortly after dispatched advised shots had been fired and there was possibly a shooting in progress. I was assigned as the west end supervisor and began responding to the scene.

I heard Officer Fishell announce on the radio he had arrived on scene. Officer Fishell broadcast shots had been fired. Dispatch advised there were multiple victims down in a front yard. Officer Fishell confirmed victims were down. A short time later, Officer Fishell broadcast shots had been fired and the suspect was down.

I arrived on scene shortly after and saw the suspect down in the driveway of 11531 Trailway Dr. There were officers holding cover on the suspect and other officers covering on the two victims in front of 11540 Trailway Dr. At that time it was not confirmed who had a weapon and who did not.

The suspect was face down, hands underneath his body with blood coming from his head area. I could see his upper body was moving up and down and looked like he was still breathing. Officers said there was some movement from the suspect. Fearing the suspect was still armed with a gun and capable of shooting at officers if they approached, I requested Canine Officer Carroll respond with his Police Service Dog.

Officer Carroll arrived. I directed Officer Carroll to deploy his dog to the suspect in order to see if the canine was met with any violent reaction (refer to Officer Carroll's supplemental report). Once the canine was deployed I felt it was safe to secure the suspect.

I directed an arrest team to move up and handcuff the suspect. Once the suspect was handcuffed, I had officers hold cover on 11531 Trailway Dr. I directed officers to meet with the Riverside Fire Department, who was on scene and escort them to the victim's location (front yard and sidewalk of 11540 Trailway Dr.). The fire department personnel assessed the victims and were escorted back to their vehicle.

At that time, the immediate outside portion of the crime scene was secure. I talked to Officer Fishell and obtained a "Public Safety Statement," to include the number of rounds fired, the trajectory of the rounds, any outstanding suspect information and crime scene preservation. I assigned Officer Putnam to stay with Officer Fishell and find a position of cover until the entire scene was secured. At that time there were sufficient officers on scene and Officer Fishell's assistance was required.

I confirmed with dispatch, there were three people still inside the 11532 Trailway Dr., who had locked themselves in a bathroom for safety. Once that was confirmed I established an Emergency Rescue Team and moved to the front door of the location. Once at the front door, a female opened the door and she was escorted to the east end of the crime scene for her safety.

The Emergency Rescue Team entered the residence and cleared the downstairs area and backyard. Blood was located in the downstairs area and backyard. There were bullet holes in the front door, furniture, the refrigerator and through windows. There were bullet strike marks on the south exterior wall of the residence in the backyard. There was a gun found in the backyard near the pool. I directed Officer Zackowski to stay with the firearm and maintain scene security of the backyard. We continued to clear the house. An adult female and a juvenile were found in the downstairs bathroom on the southeast corner of the house. They were initially secured at that location until the remainder of the residence was cleared and secured. After the residence was cleared, the two people that had locked themselves in the bathroom were escorted to the east end of the crime scene for their safety.

I had Officer Stennett remain inside the residence to maintain control of that portion of the crime scene. I coordinated with Sergeant M. Barney to start clearing 11531 Trailway Dr., where the suspect had been shot in the driveway and where it had been determined the suspect resided. There were five people in that residence that exited and were detained. The house was cleared by the Metro Team. Officers Castaneda and Goodson maintained control of that portion of the crime scene. Officer Macias was assigned to maintain control of the area where Officer Fishell was when he engaged the suspect. Officer Curtis was assigned to maintain control of the area where both victims were and the immediate surrounding area that contained evidence such as bullet casings, handgun magazines, blood and the two victims. Officer Fishell was escorted out of the crime scene and remained with Officer Putnam.

Sergeant Barney assisted in assigning officers to secure the individual inner crime scene areas with crime scene tape and posting officers at both ends of the overall crime scene for scene security. I provided a briefing of the incident to the Officer involved Shooting Team. I provided a walkthrough of the crime scene to the Officer involved Shooting Team. I turned control of the scene over to Sergeants Russell and Hudson and their detectives.
