NARRATIVE:

On this date just after 0730 hours, I was working uniformed patrol assisted to the POP Team. I was leaving the Lincoln police station when heard a Riverside Police Detective broadcast over the air an emergency request for back up at the Tyler Springs Apartments, and she also advised "shots fired". I responded code 3 to the Tyler Springs Apartments in response to the emergency back up request. When I arrived, an officer on scene was asking for officers with long guns (rifle), so I took up a position near apartment 242 (suspect's apartment) with my rifle. I eventually made my way to apartment 243 with Officer Glover, which was directly across from the suspect's apartment. Officer Glover and I entered apartment 243 through a rear open window and went to the front door of that apartment. From the front door of 243, we could clearly see the front door of #242 and that it was fully open. From my position, I could see several gunshot holes in walls and appliances inside apartment 242. Shortly after taking up our position in apartment 243, Officer Glover and I made verbal contact with the suspect, which the suspect initiated by yelling for help. We could not see him; we only had verbal contact. The suspect was yelling for help and said he had been shot. Officer Glover and I maintained verbal contact with him and told him several times to crawl outside so that he could get medical attention. The suspect again told us that he could not crawl because he had been shot. We maintained this dialog for several minutes and made several attempts to have him crawl out. During the dialog between me and the suspect, he stopped responding to our voices and to our requests. We made numerous other attempts to get him to respond to us, but the dialog appeared to be over.

About 5 minutes after the dialog between me and the suspect ended, Riverside Police S.W.A.T officers took over my position at the front door of apartment 243 and tried to reestablish contact with the suspect. After I was relieved, I stayed in apartment 243 while S.W.A.T. officers conducted their operation. After S.W.A.T. secured the suspect's apartment and deemed it safe, I was tasked to maintain security of the crime scene until police detectives arrived. After about 15 minutes of providing scene security, Officer Mendoca arrived and relieved me. Prior to being relieved by Officer Mendoca, the crime scene was not compromised.

After I was relieved, I had no further involvement in this incident.
