Narrative:

On 11-16-2011, 0717 hours, I monitored an emergency radio broadcast of an 11-99 (Officer needs help) and shots being fired by a suspect at police officers occurring at 10406 Indiana Avenue #242. I responded to the scene from Tyler and Indiana which is just a few blocks from the location of occurrence. I arrived to the front of the Tyler Springs apartment complex and used my department issued Knox Box key to open the main vehicle entrance gate for additional responding units. I retrieved my AR-15 long gun and department issued "Police" raid vest from the trunk of my police unit. Officer Mendonca, Glover and I then ran on foot to apartment #242 which was located near the south-west portion of the complex. Sergeant Ramaekers and Detective Fernandez were kneeling down behind the rear patio retaining wall of apartment #250. They both had their handguns out and pointing towards apartment #242. Sergeant Ramaekers said the suspect was a Hispanic male adult, about 60 years old. Ramaekers said the suspect fired a shotgun at them as they made entry into the apartment while serving a search warrant at the apartment.

Narrative Continued:

Officer Glover, Officer Asbury and I took a position with long guns behind the rear patio wall of apartment #250, relieving Sergeant Ramaekers and Detective Fernandez from their positions. Several ceramic flower pots were moved away from the rear patio wall to afford us better position and cover from additional gunshots that may have been fired from the suspect. Two of the ceramic flower pots were broken when they were moved. The flower pots were later photographed by Forensic Evidence Technician Susan Lane. Officer Glover was able to obtain entry into apartment #250. Officer Glover began to give the suspect verbal commands to come out of the apartment, without any weapons, and his hand up in the air. I could hear the suspect say that he had been shot in the leg and was unable to come out of the apartment. Officer Glover said he could see the door to the suspect's apartment was open, but he could not see the suspect inside the apartment. Officer Glover instructed the suspect to "Army crawl" using his forearms, to pull himself out of the apartment so we could render the suspect medical aid. A short time later, we could no longer hear the suspect saying anything to us from inside the apartment. Entry was not made into the apartment because we feared that the suspect was attempting to bait us inside the apartment so he could fire additional rounds towards officers. Officer Glover continued to give the suspect verbal commands to come out of the apartment so we could provide him with medical aid that was already on-scene and standing by. Officer Glover said that he could no longer hear the suspect communicating with him.

About 45 minutes later members of the Riverside Police Department M.E.T.R.O team arrived on-scene and relieved us from our positions.

I then met with members of the Robbery-Homicide Unit at the command post which was set up in the main office of the apartment complex.

A short time later we were informed that M.E.T.R.O. team members had made entry into the apartment complex and determined that the suspect, Alfred Romo, was deceased inside the apartment.

Detective Brandt and I attended the briefing of the investigation and were assigned to assist with processing the crime scene. (Please see Detective Brandt's supplemental report)

Members of the S.A.C.A. unit had originally arrived at the apartment to execute a search warrant at Alfred Romo's residence pertaining to a sexual assault investigation in which Alfred Romo was the suspect. The S.A.C.A. unit was unable to complete the search warrant due to Alfred Romo firing at them with a shotgun upon entry into the residence.

Riverside Police Department Forensic Evidence Technicians took photographs and video tape of the crime scene and evidence. Evidence was identified, measured and collected.

After collection of the evidence, Sergeant Dave Amador, Detective Jim Brandt, Greg Rowe and Dave Smith assisted me with the collection of evidence pertaining to the sexual assault investigation as described in the search warrant authorized by Judge Richard Fields of the Riverside Superior Court. This was documented under Riverside Police Department report P11169201.
