On 11/17/11, I attended the autopsy of S-Romo which took place at the Riverside County Coroner's Office. The autopsy was performed by Dr. Hunt.

**Assisting personnel**

Coroner's Technician – E. Arballon  
Forensic Technician – J. Frisby  
Riverside Police Evidence Technician – S. Lane

**Details**

The autopsy began at 0910 hours. S-Romo's hands were bagged and he was wearing clothes. The bags were removed and disposed of.

RPD Evidence Technician Lane took photographs of the autopsy and evidence, and collected all evidence.

S-Romo was wearing the following clothing:

- White socks (Bloody)
- White underwear (Bloody)
- Blue jeans (Bloody)
- Blue shirt (Left shoulder bloody)
- Brown shirt (Left shoulder bloody)

Blood, urine and bile samples were taken from S-Romo.

**Wounds**

S-Romo had 11 bullet wounds and appeared to have been shot 4 times. He also had one graze wound.

**Shoulder wound:**

A bullet entered the upper left arm near the shoulder and traveled in a downward angle. The bullet then exited the left arm near the arm pit and then re-entered the body near the arm pit. The bullet then traveled through the chest cavity and stopped in the lower back near the spine.

Dr. Hunt said the bullet collapsed the left lung.

The bullet fragmented and mushroomed. The bullet was collected as evidence.

**Hip wound:**

A bullet entered near the left hip and traveled to the right for approximately 8 inches. Dr. Hunt said the bullet damaged many blood vessels in the area. The bullet lodged in the pelvis area and was recovered and collected as evidence.

**Leg wounds:**

A bullet entered the Right Medial Leg near the knee and exited through the Right Lateral Knee.

A bullet entered the Right Medial Knee and exited through the Right Lateral Leg.

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**Graze wound:**

Dr. Hunt found a mark on the left hip area. She said it appeared that a bullet may have bounced around the apartment and hit the hip area and did not penetrate.

**Cause of death**

The cause of death is pending.

Dr. Hunt said that both the shoulder wound and the hip/pelvis wound most likely caused the death. She said S-Romo most likely bled to death from both wounds.

The autopsy was concluded at 1201 hours.
