HOW DO I VOTE?

To Vote:

- Go to the Polls on Election Day
- Request Vote By Mail Ballot by May 12, 2009

To Vote:

- Mark your ballot by completing arrow
- Remove top stub
- Place in salmon colored return envelope
- Sign and enter address on back of envelope

No postage required

WHERE DO I VOTE?

Polls open on May 19, 2009, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Return ballot by June 2:

Mail or drop off vote-by-mail ballots by May 19 to:

- Registrar of Voters – 24 hour drop box
- City Clerk's Office – 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday

- Mail to Registrar of Voters
- Drop off at City Hall or Registrar of Voters Office

- Take to Ward drop-off locations on June 1 or 2

Ballots must be received by 8 p.m. on May 19, 2009

Ballots must be received by the Registrar of Voters Office or at a ballot drop-off location by 8 p.m. on June 2, 2009
