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Assignment:

On Monday September 1st, 2008 I was contacted by Sgt. Rossi who asked me to respond to an Officer Involved Shooting investigation taking place at 5807 Yarborough Dr. in Riverside. I agreed to respond and arrived at the scene at around 2200 hrs. I was assigned to meet several witnesses at CIB and conduct interviews with them.

Before leaving the scene, Sgt. Blomdahl gave a briefing on the events of the shooting up to that point. After the briefing, myself and other Robbery/ Homicide detectives returned to CIB to conduct interviews. I spoke with W/Clyde Barringer and W/Jennifer Barringer in person. I interviewed W/Nicholas "Chris" Ron by phone. All of these interviews were recorded and what follows is a synopsis of each.

W/Clyde Barringer:

Clyde is the owner of the residence at 5807 Yarborough Dr. He lives there with his wife Margaret, one adult daughter and as of three weeks ago, S/Carlos Quinonez. Carlos is Margaret's adult son who moved into their home after being arrested for a Federal crime. He is currently out on bail. Clyde claimed there have been no issues with Carlos since he moved in and that tonight was the first time he has seen Carlos act like he was out of control.

Today, Clyde and his family got together at the Yarborough Dr address for a party at around 1400 hrs. Things were going fine until later in the evening when Carlos became extremely angry with his son Eddy. Clyde is not sure why Carlos was so mad at Eddy but stated that Carlos chased Eddy around the house in an effort to harm him. Several family members attempted to calm Carlos down, to include Margaret, but he was inconsolable. Instead, anytime family members tried to talk with him, Carlos would become physically combative and push people away. At one point, Carlos' sister, W/Jennifer Barringer and her boyfriend, W/Nicholas "Chris" Ron, returned to the house to try and calm Carlos down. As soon as they contacted Carlos, he punched Chris in the face. This was an unprovoked assault. Jennifer and Chris left right away.

Clyde is older and not very mobile so he spends a good deal of his time in a chair inside the garage watching T.V. He was there tonight when he observed Carlos grabbing something from the rafters of the garage while he stood on a step ladder. Clyde could not see exactly what he was getting but described seeing Carlos with a blue bag after he came down from the ladder. Clyde did not see what was inside it but he described it as being approximately 4' long and possibly bending in the middle. Clyde next watched as Carlos walked out of the garage toward the driveway with the bag where he heard 5-8 gunshots. He did not see Carlos fire a gun but for some reason he felt Carlos had fired the shots because of the extremely angered state he was in prior to leaving the garage. A few moments later, Clyde thought he heard Carlos telling family members in the garage to get on the ground.

After hearing the gunshots and seeing his family members lying face down on the ground, Clyde called 911 for assistance. Several moments later his family members were called out of the garage and he thought he saw Carlos leaving the garage with his empty hands over his head during this time. He does not know what happened to Carlos once he left the garage.

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Later, uniformed RPD officers assisted him from the garage. Clyde never saw the shooting between RPD officers and Carlos. He was not certain about what he heard or saw in the moments just before the gunshots because he was focused on his T.V. Clyde was certain that Carlos was out of control this night. He was putting people in fear due to his outrageous actions and violent behavior. Carlos was so bad that he and Margaret contacted friends and family members, asking them to come to the house and help control/ calm Carlos down. Clyde said no one was able to get Carlos under control.

Clyde described Carlos' behavior that night as unusual based on the past few weeks he had been staying with them. Clyde added that Carlos has been under a great deal of stress due his recent conviction for the Federal crime he committed and that he was facing 3-5 years in prison starting in October. Carlos had also lost his job, car and had no money. Clyde felt that all of these things may have contributed to what happened tonight.

W/Jennifer Barringer (Sister of S1):

Jennifer and her boyfriend, W/Chris Ron, spend time with Carlos on a regular basis and they have had no problems with him in the past. She too described the recent events in Carlos' life as being traumatic but he seemed willing to face them. Jennifer had been at 5807 Yarborough Dr earlier in the day but left at around 1700 hrs. In the time she was there, Jennifer had no problems with Carlos and could only remember him being ok.

Jennifer could not remember the exact time but speculated that at around 2000 hrs, she called her mom and dad's home to see if she could pick up some left over food. Jennifer spoke with her mother (Margaret) who asked her to come back to the house to calm Carlos down. Margaret was upset with the way Carlos was acting and she felt that Jennifer might be able to help. Jennifer agreed to come over and she brought Chris with her.

Jennifer and Chris arrived at the house a short time later and approached Carlos inside the garage. Jennifer tried to talk with Carlos but almost immediately, Carlos turned and pushed/ punched Chris on the side of his face for no reason. Jennifer and Chris both decided to leave the home right away. Neither one was present later when the shooting between RPD officers and Carlos took place. She was made aware of the incident by neighbors who called her after it happened.

Jennifer could not understand why Carlos became so angry and inconsolable that night. She had heard from friends and family members that Carlos had pointed a gun at RPD officers just before the shooting but she was not aware of Carlos having access to a gun. She said he did not have a gun at anytime while she was around him.

W/Nicholas "Chris" Ron (Jennifer's Boyfriend):

Chris did not see what happened between Carlos and RPD officers the night of the shooting. He was able to tell me about his contact with Carlos prior to the incident. Chris' girlfriend, Jennifer, had called her parents home and spoke with her mother. During the call, Jennifer was told that her brother, Carlos, was causing problems at the house and she was asked to go over to the house to see if she could calm him down. Chris and Jennifer arrived a short time later and approached Carlos inside the garage of the residence.

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As they began to talk with Carlos, out of nowhere, Carlos punched him in the face. The attack was completely unprovoked. Upon being struck, Chris decided that he and Jennifer did not need to stick around any longer and decided to leave. They did not know anything more had happened until Jennifer received phone calls about the shooting. Chris did not know what set Carlos off this night. He was not injured in the assault.

This report will be forwarded to Det. Shumway for his case file.

115 A: That I made or whatever, and um, my dad told me that they were fighting and
116 to come and stop it.

118 Q: And who – who did he say was fighting?

120 A: He didn't say. But I already knew it was probably (Eddie) and (Carlos)
121 because – just because of, you know, their...

123 Q: Did they have a history of that?

125 A: Yeah. Not of fighting, but just to like not getting along.

129 A: But they were getting along, and then they weren't, you know?

131 Q: Okay. And is (Eddie) is son?

133 A: Mm-hmm.

137 A: That's – he only has three kids.

143 Q: Had you guys been at the party earlier that day?

145 A: Yeah, we were there – we were there and um, and we just left because like my
146 kids started getting cranky and I got two babies, you know.

148 Q: What – what time did you guys leave?

150 A: Maybe like 5:30 or 6:30 – like after 6:00.

152 Q: How was (Carlos) when you guys left?
153
154 A: He was quiet. He didn't seem like – he didn't – he didn't act – like he was the
155 one cooking all the meat and everything.

157 Q: Okay. It's okay for the most part when you left?
158
159 A: Yeah.

161 Q: Okay.
162
163 A: I mean, like I know that he didn't look like – he wasn't angry or – or I mean, I
164 don't know what – I don't know what happened?

166 Q: Okay.

168 A: You know, I wasn't there. I just know that my dad told me they were
169 fighting. And I came back. And by the time we came – it had already – it
170 was ended. You know, like they were – like (Eddie) and his mom and
171 grandma were leaving.

173 Q: Okay.

175 A: And then, um, and – and by that time, (Carlos) was very upset and...
176
177 Q: What time do you think you went back to the house?
178
179 A: Mmm, I don't know, maybe 9:00 or after 9:00. I don't remember.

181 Q: Okay.

183 A: I have to call my caller-id to know its exact time.
184
185 Q: Okay. I – and the only reason I’m asking is, I think we had this thing, this
186 whole thing kinda happened sometime a little before 8 o’clock.
187
188 A: Oh, see, if I’m off right now. I can’t think right.
189
190 Q: That’s okay. When you guys got back, um, I – I take it (Chris) went with
191 you?
192
193 A: To my mom’s house?
194
195 Q: Yeah.
196
197 A: Yeah.
198
199 Q: Okay, what happened?
200
201 A: We left right away ‘cuz (Carlos) was very upset and (Chris) doesn’t – like
202 we’re really close with him, you know?
203
204 Q: You and (Chris)? Okay.
205
206 A: Yeah. So, he was ready to do his time. That wasn’t the issue. I don’t know
207 what triggered for him to get upset like that.
208
209 Q: Okay.
210
211 A: I don’t know what – what it was.
212
213 Q: Right.
214
215 A: You know, he came to my mom’s kitchen and...

217 Q: She told me...
218
219 A: My sister’s been having issues and he was – I think he was upset about her,
220 too. She wasn’t even there, but I mean, just everything building up, you
221 know?
222
223 Q: Sure.
224

225 A: And I mean, I'm...
226
227 Q: Did you...
228
229 A: ...the only one who, you know, like saw him every day and talked to him
230 every day and like for something like this to happen, you know, like I
231 wouldn't - I know that I just - I can't imagine, you know, that - that's what
232 would happen.
233
234 Q: Sure. Sure.
235
236 A: So, I mean, I don't know why he would be so upset. I know he had a lot of
237 stress and all that, but.
238
239 Q: Sure.
240
241 A: I mean, for it to go to this extreme is really, you know, way out.
242
243 Q: Okay.
244
245 A: 'Cuz he wasn't using drugs and he wasn't - he wasn't using drugs and he's
246 not - like he doesn't drink. Like he's not an alcoholic, but.
247
248 Q: Mm-hmm.
249
250 A: I know that like he had some alcohol that - I don't know if he was drinking
251 like when I left. I didn't see him drinking. But I'm pretty sure maybe he did.
252 I don't know.
253
254 Q: Okay.
255
256 A: I drank, you know, a beer, you know?
257
258 Q: Sure. You know, it's a party, a barbeque.
259
260 A: You know, so...
261
262 Q: What happened between...
263
264 A: ...it's like (Carlos) doesn't like to disrespect my mom, so he does - so I'm
265 really surprised that this happened.
266
267 Q: Sure.
268
269 A: 'Cuz he would never do that to my mom.

270
271 Q: Okay.
272
273 A: You know?
274
275 Q: What happened between (Chris) and- and (Carlos)?
276
277 A: No, we just went up to him and we're like, "What are you doing?" Like we
278 thought if like we got there he would calm down.
279
280 Q: Right.
281
282 A: And like he just, you know, was upset. He just like, you know, pushed him on
283 the side of the face and that's when we left. That's all that happened. It
284 wasn't like a fight or anything. Cuz he had alr- he - it was like - like
285 whatever - whatever he - however he slapped his son, or whatever happened,
286 I wasn't there so I don't know. I just know that he - they were getting in -
287 into some type of altercation.
288
289 Q: Okay.
290
291 A: So I don't even know, I mean I hear different stories.
292
293 Q: Sure.
294
295 A: Like I heard that he just - he slapped him in the back of the head.
296
297 Q: Mm-hmm.
298
299 A: You know, I don't know.
300
301 Q: Sure. Well...
302
303 A: And - and I just don't believe everything I hear because like I've been hearing
304 that (Chris) was the one who got shot at.
305
306 Q: Oh, okay.
307
308 A: You know, so, it's - and my ridiculous sister is over there on the news like
309 talking about God. I mean she's...
310
311 Q: Which - which one is that, Rita?
312
313 A: She has some nerve.
314

- 315 Q: Is uh, did (Carlos) actually punch (Chris)? 'Cuz I think that's the way (Chris)
316 explained it. It's like he got suckered punched.
317
- 318 A: I wasn't really like - I was just tripping out - or you know, like surprised that
319 - that (Carlos) um, was so upset the say he was. 'Cuz I didn't know what had
320 just happened before we got there.
321
- 322 Q: Sure.
323
- 324 A: So, I mean, the way I saw it, was like from the side.
325
- 326 Q: Mm-hmm.
327
- 328 A: Do you know what I'm saying?
329
- 330 Q: Okay.
331
- 332 A: I wasn't like - it just blew my mind that - that he was just upset so like. And
333 (Chris) like he just stepped back. And like (unintelligible) care about that.
334
- 335 Q: Sure.
336
- 337 A: He just wanted to know if my brother was alive or dead. And I know he's
338 been dead for awhile, I know. And nobody was telling me. I wanted to be
339 there in the hospital and nobody was letting me see him.
340
- 341 Q: Well even - even if they were - and I don't know what they were doing at the
342 hospital, no one would have been able to see him while they were trying to do
343 things to help him. So, I - I couldn't tell you. I couldn't tell you...
344
- 345 A: I think he was already dead. He was laying in the street for a long time. I was
346 talking to (Georgie) for a long time while he was across the street at (Peta)'s
347 house. And the whole time (Georgie) is telling me that he was on the floor
348 dead. She already knew it. And then nobody wanted to tell me what hospital
349 he went to or anything. I'm just so upset, you know. Like - like - I don't
350 know what triggered it. You know? He was ready to do his time and I don't
351 know after that.

- 355 A: And I don't care about this stupid fight. Because now he's dead. 'Cuz he did
356 what he did. And he wasn't old. He was still under 50.
357
- 358 Q: Right.

360 A: You know, he could have still started a life over. But you know, I don't know
361 it - it...

363 Q: Um, Jennifer, do you know did - did he have any - any guns or access to
364 guns? Or even something he used like for hunting or sporting, or anything at
365 all like that?
366
367 A: I don't know. I mean, if he did he would keep it up away from me. Like he
368 wouldn't tell me.
369
370 Q: Okay.
371
372 A: You know?
373
374 Q: Okay.
375
376 A: So, I mean, I just - I don't like to be around that kind of stuff. So he wouldn't
377 tell me anything about it.

379 Q: If he did, you wouldn't - you most likely wouldn't have known? Okay.
380 Alright, did you and (Chris) actually make it into the house when you went
381 over? Or...

383 A: No, everybody was in the garage.

385 Q: Okay, is that where he pushed him or punched him, or whatever?
386
387 A: Yeah, everything - and from what I understand, everything happened outside.
388 Not inside.
389
390 Q: Um, everything that - that...
391
392 A: As far as like if - when he - like got into it with his son.
393
394 Q: Okay.
395
396 A: And um, then uh, whatever.
397
398 Q: The reason I ask is, there is some blood inside the house. Almost like
399 somebody was bleeding and either cut themselves or got punched, or
400 something like it dripped around the house. It...
401
402 A: I don't...
403
404 Q: ...that's not (Chris) is it by any chance?

405
406 A: No.
407
408 Q: Okay.
409
410 A: (Chris) it looks like the side of...
411
412 Q: I just want to make sure I can rule that out.
413
414 A: It was the side of (Chris)' – I mean, it didn't even phase (Chris) because
415 (Chris) is pretty strong.
416
417 Q: Okay.
418
419 A: So. I mean, like he was upset and he was just like – we didn't know like – we
420 just had to leave. I knew like I didn't want any – because you know, like they
421 have – I didn't think that it was going to happen that way, but.
422
423 Q: Sure. It's not what you were expecting when you got over there?
424
425 A: No.
426
427 Q: Okay. Did you guys leave pretty quickly after that?
428
429 A: Yeah. We left right away.
430
431 Q: Okay. And then when did you find out that something more had happened?
432
433 A: Because I kept trying to call my dad and he said that everyone was being
434 talked to by the police. And but he couldn't get down there because they
435 wanted everyone to talk with their hands on their head.
436
437 Q: Oh.
438
439 A: But my dad he can't walk down the – the ramp.
440
441 Q: Okay.
442
443 A: He can't go by himself. So he was just answering the phone. But then – so
444 then I called (Peta)'s house 'cuz I knew she was over there. And I just wanted
445 to know like...
446
447 Q: And is (Peta) a cousin or something, or?
448
449 A: The neighbor across the str-...

450
451 Q: Neighbor, okay.
452
453 A: The Castros.
454
455 Q: Gotch ya.
456
457 A: So then um, (Georgie), which is my little cousin.
458
459 Q: Okay.
460
461 A: He was out at (Peta)'s house scared. Like saying that – that, "Do you know
462 where my mom's at?" And I was like, "Well, she has to be at my mom's
463 house. You know, like across the street."
464
465 Q: Mm-hmm.
466
467 A: And then he's like, "Well, can you go get her?" And I told him, "The police
468 won't let me on the street. You have to tell me what happened. Like what
469 happened?" And he's like, and then he just told me that – that – that my
70 brother was lying on the street dead.
471
472 Q: Okay. Did he see what actually happened? Or what did he say happened?
473
474 A: I – he just said that um, he said um, that – that he got shot. That...
475
476 Q: That (Carlos) got shot? Did he say why or how it happened? Or...
477
478 A: That (Carlos) um, came out with the gun or something.
479
480 Q: Oh. Okay.
481
482 A: I don't – I mean, I don't know if like he saw it. He didn't tell me what he – he
483 just said what he was seeing right at – like he was scared. And he didn't
484 want...
485
486 Q: Sure.
487
488 A: ...to be there. And like they never come to (Riverside) and so that was really
489 unexpected.
490
491 Q: Okay.
492
493 A: No, I – I can understand that. I'm – I think was that (George) that walked out
494 as we walked in?

495
496 Q: Okay, I think they talked with him. So, I wasn't sure what he may have told
497 you?
498
499 A: Well, that's – that's what he said that, "He got shot because he was out there."
500 That he had a gun or something. I don't know.
501
502 Q: Okay. Alright, that's fair enough. Okay. I, you know what, I – I can't think
503 of anything more to ask about tonight. Is there anything that we haven't
504 talked about that you think would be important for me to know? Other than
505 what we've already discussed?



244 Q: Okay. All right. And just a family get-together or were there friends and so
245 forth, or-or just the family?
246

247 A: Oh, like in-laws and stuff like that, you know.
248

249 Q: Okay.
250

251 A: Like you know, (Carlos) and his-his wife I think was there, his daughter was
252 there and...
253

254 Q: How is (Carlos) related to you and your family?
255

256 A: Well, he's my wife's first son.
257

258 Q: Okay.
259

260 A: But that was way before I knew her.
261

262 Q: All right.
263

264 A: And uh, I guess that makes him my uh, step-son, but he never lived with me.
265

266 Q: Okay. How-how old is he?
267

268 A: He lived with me for a week maybe, I mean we got in a fight.
269

270 Q: Oh, okay. Uh...

271

272 A: When he got back from his grandmother's house.

273

274 Q: How old is-is (Carlos)?

275

276 A: Uh...

277

278 Q: Do you remember approximately?

279

280 A: I think he was born in '61.

281

282 Q: Okay. So he's uh, he's in his 40's somewhere then? Older guy - he's not

283 young?

284

285 A: No.

286

287 Q: He's a 40 - he - 40's or so?

288

289 A: Yeah.

290

291 Q: Okay. Um, and you were saying that uh, a bunch of family members over at

292 the house and (Carlos) was there. Did you see him there earlier in the

293 evening?

294

295 A: Well he was - he was living with us for the last two, three weeks or something

296 like that.

297

298 Q: He has been living with you guys for awhile?

299

300 A: Well here's what happened.

301

302 Q: Okay.

303

304 A: Okay. I don't remember what date it was - his landlord wanted \$650 back

305 rent, and so I sent him a check to his landlord.

306

307 Q: Mm-hm.

308

309 A: He took the money, cashed it, and moved him out anyhow, so then he had to

310 come and live with us.

311

312 Q: Okay. All right. Is-is (Carlos) on parole or probation or...

313

314 A: Uh, I don't think so. He was – he's been out of jail for a long time, and he's
315 been working as a – I don't know what you call it. He had something to do
316 with finding people that skip on their bills and stuff I think.
317
318 Q: Was he a – like a bounty hunter kind of person?
319
320 A: Something like that. I...
321
322 Q: He's...
323
324 A: I don't know what...
325
326 Q: People who skipped out on their bail or something like that?
327
328 A: Stuff, all kind of stuff.
329
330 Q: Okay.
331
332 A: People who want somebody and they're willing to pay to have you find them
333 for them.
334
335 Q: Oh, okay.
336
337 A: Yeah.
338
339 Q: Okay. So he's been with you and your family for two to three weeks...
340
341 A: Yeah.
342
343 Q: ...prior to today? How-how have things been with him living there at your
344 house?
345
346 A: He's been good – he's been real good. He's been helping my wife a lot.
347
348 Q: Okay.
349
350 A: He just painted the kitchen the other day.
351
352 Q: Okay. You had said in the past you and he got into an argument?
353
354 A: Well when I first got married.
355
356 Q: But...
357
358 A: And-and then...

359
360 Q: Just a verbal type argument or...
361
362 A: No, we've not come to blows but uh...
363
364 Q: Uh-huh.
365
366 A: ...uh, his grandfather came and took him away.
367
368 Q: Okay.
369
370 A: It's my wife's father and...
371
372 Q: Mm-hm.
373
374 A: ...and her mother, they they took him in with them then.
375
376 Q: Okay.
377
378 A: And moved in with them and uh, her second son was living with me though.
379
380 Q: Okay. How long ago was it you and he had that-that problem?
381
382 A: It was uh, right when we got married then, about 33 years ago.
383
384 Q: Oh, that's way back then. Okay. Yeah, way, way, way - he-he was a young
385 kid, he was a teenager?
386
387 A: Yeah, he was 18 back then.
388
389 Q: Okay, okay.
390
391 A: A senior in high school.
392
393 Q: Okay. I just want to make sure it wasn't something recent...
394
395 A: No.
396
397 Q: ...and that's way back in the past? Okay. Um, so as far as you - as far as
398 things are concerned with you, he's been okay these past two or three weeks
399 living at the house?
400
401 A: Oh yeah, he's been perfect.
402

403 Q: Okay. Sounds good. Um, you guys had a party over at the house around 2
404 o'clock and – tell me about the party, uh...
405
406 A: I don't go to the party. I stayed in my – in my garage and watched television.
407
408 Q: Okay.
409
410 A: I did go out a couple of times and say hello a little bit.
411
412 Q: Sure.
413
414 A: And uh...
415
416 Q: Where was the party taking place?
417
418 A: Hm?
419
420 Q: Where was the party taking place?
421
422 A: Uh, they were mostly out on the patio.
423
424 Q: Yeah, front yard or backyard?
425
426 A: No, it's the back.
427
428 Q: Backyard?
429
430 A: Yeah.
431
432 Q: Okay. All right. So is there anybody in the garage with you watching TV, or
433 you're just by yourself?
434
435 A: I'm by myself.
436
437 Q: Okay. And is the garage door opened or closed?
438
439 A: It's open.
440
441 Q: It's open? Okay. Um, tell me about as the party progressed, were there any
442 problems, anybody arguing, anybody fighting; anything at all?
443
444 A: Uh, only near the end.
445
446 Q: Okay. Tell me about that.
447

448 A: That's what I don't really know. I don't know who was there doing that,
449 except what I think was – happened.
450
451 Q: Yeah, tell me what you – what you remember.
452
453 A: I know (Carlos) was hot.
454
455 Q: Okay. Do you know why he was – hot, you mean angry then?
456
457 A: Yeah.
458
459 Q: Okay. Any idea why?
460
461 A: He was – no.
462
463 Q: Okay.
464
465 A: I believe with his son, uh, (Eddie).
466
467 Q: Was (Eddie) at the party?
468
469 A: Yeah.
470
471 Q: How old is (Eddie)?
472
473 A: I don't know, he's going to college I think.
474
475 Q: Okay. So he's 18 to 20-ish, somewhere around there?
476
477 A: Yeah, mm-hm.
478
479 Q: Okay. Does he live with (Carlos)?
480
481 A: I don't believe so, no.
482
483 Q: Okay. Do you know what (Eddie)'s last name is?
484
485 A: Quinonez, I think.
486
487 Q: Quinonez? All right. And how do you know that (Carlos) was hot or angry at
488 (Eddie)?
489
490 A: Well, they've been having a problem with the boy. I don't know what the
491 problem was. I know one problem he had was with a – the boy had a car

492 parked on the street in a-a tow away zone or something, and they told him to
493 move and I know (Carlos) moved the car for him.
494
495 Q: Mm-hm.
496
497 A: And then they towed, moved it to and then he's angry with (Carlos) for
498 moving the car and...
499
500 Q: Uh-huh. Did that all happen today or is that...
501
502 A: Oh, that's been awhile. I don't know exactly when.
503
504 Q: Okay, fair enough.
505
506 A: Not too long ago though.
507
508 Q: So (Eddie) and (Carlos) – sounds like they have some history where they-they
509 kind of...
510
511 A: Uh, I a- I assume they do because every time they get together it seems that
512 they do.
513
514 Q: There's problems? Okay. So today you said that uh, (Eddie) was – I'm sorry
515 – (Carlos) was hot. Can you describe what-what was he doing that you knew
516 he was hot?
517
518 A: Oh, he was – he was – he was raising hell. He...
519
520 Q: I mean like yelling?
521
522 A: He was pushing everybody around out there in the kitchen.
523
524 Q: Okay. And I just...
525
526 A: And his daughter was down on the floor on her back, and I think she's
527 pregnant too.
528
529 Q: Do you – do you know how she ended up there?
530
531 A: I don't know, but I think he pushed her down – 'cause he was pushing
532 everybody around.
533
534 Q: Okay. So you're assuming she ended up on her back because he was pushing
535 other people?
536

537 A: I didn't see the-the down – I just saw her down really when she was down on
538 the floor.
539
540 Q: Okay.
541
542 A: So I didn't see exactly how she got down, but I know he was pushing the
543 people around with his hands.
544
545 Q: Well was he – had he been drinking or was he drunk or...
546
547 A: I don't have any drink in my house.
548
549 Q: Okay.
550
551 A: Unless my daughter buys some, but uh, they brought some over when they
552 came to the party.
553
554 Q: Okay. And you say "they" – who brought it over?
555
556 A: I'm not sure who but...
557
558 Q: Somebody did?
559
560 A: ...it was uh, one of his – sons or somebody like that.
561
562 Q: One of (Carlos)'s sons?
563
564 A: Yeah.
565
566 Q: Okay. And you're saying that um, he-he being (Carlos), is pushing people
567 around. Did you see him pushing people around?
568
569 A: Yeah.
570
571 Q: Okay.
572
573 A: He was pushing my neighbors and everybody.
574
575 Q: Is-is he...
576
577 A: They were trying to calm him.
578
579 Q: ...arguing with them about something or what is...
580

581 A: He just wants them to get-get away from him, and wants them to get away
582 from him.
583
584 Q: Okay.
585
586 A: And they're trying to calm him down.
587
588 Q: Did he appear to be drunk or under the influence of something, or-or he was
589 just mad?
590
591 A: He was just mad...
592
593 Q: Just mad?
594
595 A: ...with his son.
596
597 Q: Okay. Was (Eddie) still around?
598
599 A: Yeah.
600
601 Q: Okay. Did he and (Eddie) get into it?
602
603 A: Yeah, he chased (Eddie) all over my place.
604
605 Q: Okay. And describe that to me. You said he chased him – what was he
606 doing?
607
608 A: Well he was in the kitchen and he chased him into the living room, and that's
609 the last I saw of that, 'cause I went back out to the garage after that.
610
611 Q: Okay. Is he chasing him with something, like a weapon or...
612
613 A: No, no.
614
615 Q: No?
616
617 A: Hm-mm.
618
619 Q: Okay. Well is he saying anything as he chases (Eddie)? Did he say anything?
620
621 A: Yeah, he was saying stuff but I don't remember what it was – I think he was
622 mad at him.
623
624 Q: Okay. And at what time during the day did this happen while (Carlos) was
625 pushing everybody and chased (Eddie) – what time was it?

626
627 A: I want to say it was just – maybe right before sundown.
628
629 Q: Okay.
630
631 A: No, after sundown because I was out working on the pool at sundown.
632
633 Q: Okay. And were they outside or somewhere where you could see them,
634 (Eddie) being chased by (Carlos)?
635
636 A: Well, I was in the living room at the time.
637
638 Q: Okay.
639
640 A: ‘Cause he came running in the living room and (Carlos) was coming after
641 him. But uh, I don’t know – I went out to the garage after that, and I should
642 have called the police then I guess.
643
644 Q: Well, okay. Sometimes family stuff happens so...
645
646 A: Yeah.
647
648 Q: Um, did you – did you see any more problems with (Carlos) or with (Eddie)
649 after that-that chasing incident?
650
651 A: Well yeah, he kept trying to go after him, but I didn’t see (Eddie) –
652 understand? I could see (Carlos) – I knew he was yelling at somebody who
653 must be (Eddie), but I didn’t see (Eddie) – I don’t know where he was at.
654
655 Q: Could you – could you hear (Carlos) yelling though?
656
657 A: Yeah.
658
659 Q: Is he yelling (Eddie)’s name or...
660
661 A: Oh, he’s-he’s yelling all kinds of bad stuff.
662
663 Q: Is he cursing?
664
665 A: Yeah.
666
667 Q: Okay. Is he still pushing people around?
668
669 A: Well he – we was trying to calm him.
670

671 Q: Okay.

672

673 A: And then, yeah.

674

675 Q: So pushing people away that are trying to calm him down?

676

677 A: Yeah, like "Don't-don't-don't touch me, get away from me."

678

679 Q: Okay. Did he seem to be out of control or inconsolable - I mean they

680 couldn't calm him down?

681

682 A: We couldn't calm him down. He did get calm for a brief spell.

683

684 Q: Okay.

685

686 A: And I thought it was over, but then he started yelling at the kid again, and I-I

687 don't know where the kid was at.

688

689 Q: Okay.

690

691 A: I was in the garage.

692

693 Q: Right.

694

695 A: And (Carlos) was almost in-in the driveway I guess.

696

697 Q: Okay.

698

699 A: But the kid must have been in the kitchen or somewhere inside the house.

700

701 Q: Okay. So was (Carlos) out in the garage or driveway yelling while - like

702 yelling back at the house?

703

704 A: Yeah.

705

706 Q: Was anybody out there with him while he was yelling out in the driveway?

707

708 A: I don't think so.

709

710 Q: No? So he was by himself, just yelling?

711

712 A: I couldn't see him in the driveway from the TV's.

713

714 Q: Okay, okay. How-how long was it that uh, (Carlos) was so mad and hot and
715 angry? I mean are we talking a couple hours, is it a few minutes? How long
716 was he angry?
717
718 A: I know it was a pretty long time, maybe two times and flared up again.
719
720 Q: Okay.
721
722 A: So...
723
724 Q: Was he angry from the moment he came to the house?
725
726 A: No, he was in the house. (Carlos) was living there.
727
728 Q: Okay. So was he angry from the time the party started?
729
730 A: No, just at the -- at the very end, like I don't know, it was maybe an hour or
731 more trying to get him calm.
732
733 Q: Be-before the police...
734
735 A: It was before he -- I didn't even know he had a gun.
736
737 Q: Okay.
738
739 A: But...
740
741 Q: Okay.
742
743 A: ...it was before he went crazy and berserk and started to get the gun.
744
745 Q: Okay.
746
747 A: Out of a bag and went outside and then bang, bang, bang.
748
749 Q: Okay. Well let-let's talk a little bit about that. Um, he -- the last that you and
750 I talked, he was out in the driveway yelling and still mad about (Eddie).
751
752 A: Yeah.
753
754 Q: And nobody else was around him. Where did he go or what happened next?
755
756 A: Well, the neighbors come over from across the street.
757
758 Q: Do you know who those neighbors are?

759
760 A: Yeah, uh, (Tom) and (Lupe) Castro and their sons.
761
762 Q: (Tom) and (Lupe) Castro – and do you know their sons?
763
764 A: Uh, no. (Tom) is one of them. I don't know the other two boys.
765
766 Q: Is-is (Tom) one of the sons or is...
767
768 A: (Tom) is the oldest.
769
770 Q: Oldest?
771
772 A: Yeah, the oldest son.
773
774 Q: And is (Lupe) the mother?
775
776 A: Yeah.
777
778 Q: Okay. So that's (Tom).
779
780 A: And I don't know the other boys' names.
781
782 Q: Do you know – why did they come over to the house?
783
784 A: I just called them.
785
786 Q: You called them?
787
788 A: I was trying to get them to stop this action that was going on.
789
790 Q: Okay. So if I understand this right, are you in the garage watching TV still...
791
792 A: Yeah.
793
794 Q: ...and you call (Lupe)...
795
796 A: Yeah.
797
798 Q: ...for help because – is it 'cause (Carlos) is still mad and angry and yelling
799 and all?
800
801 A: Yeah.
802
803 Q: I see, I see. And did (Lupe) say she would come over?

804
805 A: Plus they came over and he was pushing them around.
806
807 Q: Okay. What – tell me – describe what that looks like to me.
808
809 A: I don't know, he just wanted to push them to get away from him.
810
811 Q: Same thing, they're trying to calm him down...
812
813 A: Yeah.
814
815 Q: ...and he was pushing them away?
816
817 A: Yeah.
818
819 Q: Okay. Is he still getting angrier and angrier? I mean does he seem to be
820 getting more angry as the night's going on?
821
822 A: Well, it looked like he was calming down, and then he'd flare up again. It's
823 just...
824
825 Q: Okay.
826
827 A: It looked like nobody could calm him.
828
829 Q: Okay.
830
831 A: And uh, my daughter called – my other daughter.
832
833 Q: Who-who did she call?
834
835 A: She called my house.
836
837 Q: Oh, she called to the house?
838
839 A: Yeah.
840
841 Q: Okay.
842
843 A: And when I told them, they would come over and stop (Carlos)
844 (unintelligible). They came over...
845
846 Q: Who's that daughter? What's her name?
847
848 A: Uh, Jennifer.

849
850 Q: What's her last name?
851
852 A: Barringer.
853
854 Q: Okay. So she's not married right now?
855
856 A: No, she's living with this guy, uh -- anyhow, he came over with Jennifer and
857 (Carlos) sucker punched him.
858
859 Q: Okay. So...
860
861 A: They were coming over to try and calm him down too, but (Carlos) just
862 wound up and sucker punched the poor guy.
863
864 Q: Did you see that happen?
865
866 A: Oh yeah, I saw that.
867
868 Q: Did-did the guy do something to (Carlos) that...
869
870 A: No.
871
872 Q: No?
873
874 A: No.
875
876 Q: What's his name, do you know?
877
878 A: Uh, I don't know -- Rom, R-O-N -- uh, (Chris).
879
880 Q: (Chris) Ron?
881
882 A: Right. And uh...
883
884 Q: So...
885
886 A: ...he got hit in the mouth right like this.
887
888 Q: ...just -- (Carlos) just punched him out of nowhere?
889
890 A: Yeah.
891
892 Q: Did he knock him out or...
893

894 A: Knocked him down. It was a knockdown, bam.
895
896 Q: Okay. Was this before or after (Lupe) showed up?
897
898 A: I believe this was after they had showed up.
899
900 Q: Okay, okay. And what happened next?
901
902 A: What happened next?
903
904 Q: He...
905
906 A: Well – I don't know. But then he went into another rage and started looking
907 for his gun.
908
909 Q: Does he own a gun?
910
911 A: I didn't know.
912
913 Q: Okay. Did...
914
915 A: But he had it somewhere in the house.
916
917 Q: How did you know he was looking for his gun?
918
919 A: I didn't know. I didn't know what he was looking for.
920
921 Q: Okay.
922
923 A: Until he got – it was in a blue bag, you know.
924
925 Q: What kind of a blue bag?
926
927 A: You know, blue cloth bag. I don't know what kind, but you know.
928
929 Q: Like a zipper bag or...
930
931 A: No, I don't know. I didn't get that close to it. It was like yay long.
932
933 Q: Okay.
934
935 A: And I don't know guns, I mean...
936
937 Q: So he...
938

939 A: He took that thing out and then (unintelligible), he started firing it.
940
941 Q: Could you hear him firing it?
942
943 A: Yeah, I heard him – seemed like five or eight rounds.
944
945 Q: Okay. So – just so that um, I'm sure, Clyde, um, after he punch – he punched
946 (Chris)...
947
948 A: Yeah.
949
950 Q: ...did he say something about looking for his gun, or did he just go...
951
952 A: No.
953
954 Q: ...go away for awhile?
955
956 A: Yeah.
957
958 Q: Okay. And then when he came back, did he have this blue bag that you saw?
959
960 A: This came on – the very last thing. Uh, I thought this thing was over.
961
962 Q: Okay. A-after he...
963
964 A: And he started climbing up the ladder.
965
966 Q: What-what ladder is that?
967
968 A: It was a three-step ladder.
969
970 Q: Okay. Where is – where is the ladder at? Where...
971
972 A: It was in the garage.
973
974 Q: Okay. Could you see him climbing the ladder?
975
976 A: Yes.
977
978 Q: Okay.
979
980 A: He was up, and funny thing – his pants kept falling off because uh...
981
982 Q: Oh.
983

984 A: ...he's up on the ladder.
985
986 Q: Okay.
987
988 A: And uh, I don't know what he was doing up - I have an overhead storage
989 shelf up there.
990
991 Q: Is this in the garage?
992
993 A: Yeah.
994
995 Q: Okay.
996
997 A: I knew he was trying to get something out of that storage area.
998
999 Q: Okay.
1000
1001 A: And then maybe that's - was where he got the gun from.
1002
1003 Q: Did you see him take something out of that overhead storage?
1004
1005 A: I seen him looking for something, but I didn't actually see him take anything
1006 out.
1007
1008 Q: Okay. Did-did he stop looking up there at some point?
1009
1010 A: Yeah.
1011
1012 Q: Okay. And what did you see (Carlos) do next?
1013
1014 A: I don't know, but the next thing I know he had a gun and he was outside.
1015
1016 Q: Could you see what kind of gun?
1017
1018 A: No, I didn't see the gun.
1019
1020 Q: Okay. How do you know he had a gun then outside?
1021
1022 A: That's when he went boom, boom, boom. He shot it off a lot of times.
1023
1024 Q: Did you see him shooting it off outside?
1025
1026 A: No, I did not.
1027
1028 Q: Okay. But you heard gunshots outside?

1029
1030 A: Yeah.
1031
1032 Q: Okay. What makes you think that it was uh, (Carlos) that was shooting?
1033
1034 A: I have no idea it would be anybody else was shooting, I don' t know.
1035
1036 Q: Is it that everybody else inside your house was calm and no problems; he was
1037 the only one that was kind of crazy and angry?
1038
1039 A: Yeah.
1040
1041 Q: Okay. But just so that I'm sure, you didn't see him with a gun?
1042
1043 A: No.
1044
1045 Q: Or-or hear him talk about a gun?
1046
1047 A: No.
1048
1049 Q: But you hear the boom, boom, booms?
1050
1051 A: Yeah.
1052
1053 Q: Where did those come from?
1054
1055 A: Out in the street.
1056
1057 Q: In front of your house?
1058
1059 A: Sounded like it.
1060
1061 Q: Okay. And you assume that (Carlos) is somehow connected to those?
1062
1063 A: Yes.
1064
1065 Q: Okay. And you – are you assuming that he must have shot something because
1066 he's the only one that's been acting kind of nuts that night?
1067
1068 A: Yes.
1069
1070 Q: Okay. All right. And what did you do when you heard these bangs, these
1071 boom, booms? First of all, how many did you hear?
1072
1073 A: I'm not sure, somewhere between five and eight.

1074
1075 Q: Okay.
1076
1077 A: It was all real fast, like boom, boom, boom, boom, boom.
1078
1079 Q: How uh, how soon after (Carlos) had been in the garage did you hear the-the
1080 bangs?
1081
1082 A: Oh, he was in the garage for quite awhile.
1083
1084 Q: Looking?
1085
1086 A: No, not looking – it didn't take him long to find what he was looking for.
1087
1088 Q: Okay. Did you see him bring down what he was looking for?
1089
1090 A: I saw him with the blue bag.
1091
1092 Q: Okay. Where was that blue bag when he was holding it?
1093
1094 A: Uh, this is what I'm not sure of.
1095
1096 Q: Okay.
1097
1098 A: I don't know if he got it down out of the – a rafter.
1099
1100 Q: Mm-hm.
1101
1102 A: Or in one of the boxes uh, alongside of the wall.
1103
1104 Q: Is this in the garage?
1105
1106 A: Yeah.
1107
1108 Q: Okay. And where was he when you first saw him with that blue – that blue
1109 bag?
1110
1111 A: He was uh, close to the door of the garage.
1112
1113 Q: The big open garage door, the big one?
1114
1115 A: Yeah.
1116
1117 Q: Okay. And what was he doing with the bag?
1118

1119 A: I don't know what he was doing. He just took that bag.
1120
1121 Q: Just swinging it?
1122
1123 A: Yeah, and grabbed it and uh, trying to get it open, I don't know.
1124
1125 Q: So he was trying to open the bag then?
1126
1127 A: Yeah.
1128
1129 Q: Okay. Did you see him finish opening the bag?
1130
1131 A: No.
1132
1133 Q: Okay. So you don't know what was in the bag?
1134
1135 A: No. (Unintelligible) on the floor. He was telling everybody to get on the
1136 floor, and he – then he said he had the gun. That's all I know.
1137
1138 Q: Did he say he had a gun or uh...
1139
1140 A: Who?
1141
1142 Q: Uh, (Carlos).
1143
1144 A: No, he didn't say nothing about the gun.
1145
1146 Q: Okay. Did somebody else say he had a gun?
1147
1148 A: He had all these people laying down on the floor.
1149
1150 Q: Where are these people lying at? Where are they?
1151
1152 A: They're lying, sitting here – there's one there and one there.
1153
1154 Q: So you're in the garage still?
1155
1156 A: Yeah.
1157
1158 Q: And these people are laying down in the garage or the driveway?
1159
1160 A: Yeah.
1161
1162 Q: Both, garage and driveway?
1163

1164 A: I don't know about driveway. I-I can't see out there.
1165
1166 Q: Okay. But you...
1167
1168 A: I can see the light areas.
1169
1170 Q: Did you hear him telling people to get down?
1171
1172 A: Yeah.
1173
1174 Q: Okay. And is he yelling at them, "Get down on the ground"?
1175
1176 A: Yeah.
1177
1178 Q: Okay. Did you look out from your TV's to see why he's telling them to get
1179 down?
1180
1181 A: No, I couldn't see them.
1182
1183 Q: Okay. Is there -- are there any lights in the garage besides your TV?
1184
1185 A: Yeah.
1186
1187 Q: Okay. And was-was the light good enough that you could see what was going
1188 on in the garage?
1189
1190 A: The light in the garage was okay. I can't recall what light was on though.
1191
1192 Q: Okay. Okay, but were you able to see what (Carlos) was doing?
1193
1194 A: Oh, I have a floor lamp -- I had that on, yeah.
1195
1196 Q: What was (Carlos) doing as he told these people to get down?
1197
1198 A: I don't know what he was yelling.
1199
1200 Q: No?
1201
1202 A: No.
1203
1204 Q: Could you see anything in his...
1205
1206 A: I couldn't see him.
1207
1208 Q: You couldn't see him?

1209
1210 A: No.
1211
1212 Q: Could you see people getting on the – getting down?
1213
1214 A: Oh, I saw the people – they were – they were right beside me, right here.
1215
1216 Q: Okay. Who was on the ground in the garage?
1217
1218 A: Well, my wife and uh, another woman – I'm not sure which one it was.
1219
1220 Q: Okay. Do you remember anybody else being down on the garage floor?
1221
1222 A: Everybody that was in the garage was down.
1223
1224 Q: Okay. Are...
1225
1226 A: I couldn't – I couldn't see who they were.
1227
1228 Q: How about (Lupe) or (Tom) or Jennifer or (Chris)?
1229
1230 A: Yeah.
1231
1232 Q: Those people that showed up?
1233
1234 A: Yeah.
1235
1236 Q: Do you remember seeing them on the ground?
1237
1238 A: I don't think (Chris) was there – I think (Chris) went home after he got hit.
1239
1240 Q: Did Jennifer leave with him?
1241
1242 A: Yeah.
1243
1244 Q: Okay. So he got hit and they left?
1245
1246 A: Yeah.
1247
1248 Q: What about (Tom) and (Lupe) and-and her other son?
1249
1250 A: I-I don't know – I think they were still all there.
1251
1252 Q: Okay. Do you remember if they were on the ground?
1253

1254 A: Yeah, I believe so.
1255
1256 Q: Okay. And then what happened right after (Chris) was telling -- or uh,
1257 (Carlos) is telling these people to get down on the ground? What happened
1258 next?
1259
1260 A: I don't know, they were just down on the ground, not moving, you know.
1261
1262 Q: Did you see where (Carlos) went?
1263
1264 A: No, I couldn't see (Carlos).
1265
1266 Q: Okay. These people when they're on the ground, are they laying face-down
1267 or...
1268
1269 A: Yeah.
1270
1271 Q: Like what are they doing with their hands?
1272
1273 A: Hm. I don't know what they were doing with their hands.
1274
1275 Q: Okay. Did anybody tell -- did (Carlos) tell you to get on the ground at all?
1276
1277 A: No.
1278
1279 Q: No? Okay. And then what-what happened next? After you heard (Carlos)
1280 telling them to get down, they got on the ground -- what happened next?
1281
1282 A: Nothing much happened after that.
1283
1284 Q: Okay. How long...
1285
1286 A: Except there was a lot of yelling and screaming but uh...
1287
1288 Q: Could you tell who was yelling or screaming?
1289
1290 A: Everybody was.
1291
1292 Q: Like people from your house?
1293
1294 A: Yeah.
1295
1296 Q: Okay. Where was that yelling and screaming coming from?
1297
1298 A: They were scared. They were just, you know.

1299
1300 Q: Did anybody say anything about a gun?
1301
1302 A: Yes.
1303
1304 Q: Okay. Who said something about a gun?
1305
1306 A: Uh, (Margaret).
1307
1308 Q: (Margaret) did? What did she say about it?
1309
1310 A: She said he had a gun.
1311
1312 Q: "He" being (Carlos)?
1313
1314 A: Yeah.
1315
1316 Q: Okay. Was that while she was lying on the ground?
1317
1318 A: Yeah.
1319
1320 Q: Okay. Did anybody call the police?
1321
1322 A: I did.
1323
1324 Q: You did?
1325
1326 A: Yeah.
1327
1328 Q: Did you call when she told you "He's got a gun," did you call the police?
1329
1330 A: I called the-the - wait. No, I called right after he got the gun.
1331
1332 Q: Okay. And-and you knew he had a gun because (Margaret) told you...
1333
1334 A: Yeah.
1335
1336 Q: ...that he had a gun?
1337
1338 A: Yeah.
1339
1340 Q: Okay. And then that's when...
1341
1342 A: But not only that. As soon as he got the gun he went out in the street and shot
1343 those five or six rounds, whatever it was.

1344
1345 Q: Okay. But you didn't see those, you're just – you're going off of what you
1346 heard?
1347
1348 A: Right.
1349
1350 Q: And you knew that he had a gun because (Margaret) told you he had a gun.
1351
1352 A: Yeah.
1353
1354 Q: Is that right?
1355
1356 A: Yes.
1357
1358 Q: Okay, okay. 'Cause I just wanted to make sure how you knew it was (Carlos)
1359 that shot those five or eight rounds.
1360
1361 A: Mm-hm.
1362
1363 Q: Okay. Did you hear any more gunshots after those five or eight rounds?
1364
1365 A: No.
1366
1367 Q: Okay. Okay, and you called the police after (Margaret) said, "(Carlos) has a
1368 gun"?
1369
1370 A: Yeah, because I realized he was out there shooting and (unintelligible).
1371
1372 Q: Okay. After those shots were fired, did you look out and see what had
1373 happened or who had been shooting?
1374
1375 A: No, I didn't – I didn't get out of my chair.
1376
1377 Q: Okay.
1378
1379 A: I-I sometimes cannot get out of the chair.
1380
1381 Q: Okay. So what's the next thing you remember happening after those five or
1382 eight shots?
1383
1384 A: Well, the people was still on the floor in the garage, and I don't know. He
1385 must have been close enough to scare them to stay down.
1386
1387 Q: Okay.
1388

1389 A: But I don't – I couldn't see him.
1390
1391 Q: Okay.
1392
1393 A: And uh, I don't know. It remained sort of like that for awhile.
1394
1395 Q: How long do you think?
1396
1397 A: I don't know, 20 minutes maybe.
1398
1399 Q: Okay. And then, do you remember it – the police showing up at your house?
1400
1401 A: Yeah.
1402
1403 Q: Okay. Did they show up before or after the gunshots?
1404
1405 A: After.
1406
1407 Q: After the gunshots?
1408
1409 A: Yeah.
1410
1411 Q: Okay. Um, do you remember seeing (Carlos) again?
1412
1413 A: Hm?
1414
1415 Q: Do you remember seeing (Carlos) once the police showed up?
1416
1417 A: I never saw him.
1418
1419 Q: Okay. Did you see him again after those gunshots?
1420
1421 A: I think I saw him when he was going out with his hands up.
1422
1423 Q: Okay.
1424
1425 A: Like it was from a distance.
1426
1427 Q: Could you tell if that was actually (Carlos) or somebody else or what?
1428
1429 A: No, I – it was (Carlos) 'cause he started from inside the garage.
1430
1431 Q: Where was he inside the garage?
1432
1433 A: He was about in the middle of the garage.

1434
1435 Q: And you could see him clearly?
1436
1437 A: Yeah.
1438
1439 Q: Okay. And you're saying that he went with his hands up. Why was he going
1440 out with his hands up?
1441
1442 A: They told him to.
1443
1444 Q: The police did?
1445
1446 A: Mm-hm.
1447
1448 Q: Okay. Could you see whether he had a gun in his hand or anything like that?
1449
1450 A: No, I couldn't tell that.
1451
1452 Q: You couldn't tell if he was - if he had a gun at the time?
1453
1454 A: No.
1455
1456 Q: Okay. But you said something about his hands being up?
1457
1458 A: Yes, his hands was up.
1459
1460 Q: You could see his hands were up? Okay.
1461
1462 A: Yeah.
1463
1464 Q: Was there anything in his hands?
1465
1466 A: I didn't see anything.
1467
1468 Q: Okay. And then once his hands were up and he walked out, did you hear any
1469 gunshots after that?
1470
1471 A: I did not.
1472
1473 Q: You did not?
1474
1475 A: No.
1476
1477 Q: Okay.
1478

1479 A: But my wife said there was, but I don't know.
1480
1481 Q: Okay. So the only gunshots you heard were ones earlier...
1482
1483 A: Yeah.
1484
1485 Q: ...when people were down on the ground?
1486
1487 A: Yeah.
1488
1489 Q: (Margaret) told you that (Carlos) had a gun?
1490
1491 A: Yeah.
1492
1493 Q: You called the police?
1494
1495 A: Right.
1496
1497 Q: And then you heard five or eight gunshots; is that correct? Is that the right
1498 order?
1499
1500 A: Well uh, he may have fired the gun before I called the police - I believe that's
1501 what happened. I heard that he fired a gun - now I'm-I'm frightened - I got
1502 to call the cops, you know, I can't - he's liable to kill somebody, you know.
1503
1504 Q: Okay. So you think the gunshots came before you called the police?
1505
1506 A: Yes, I know they did, yeah.
1507
1508 Q: Okay.
1509
1510 A: Yeah.
1511
1512 Q: Okay, that's - okay, that makes sense then.
1513
1514 A: 'Cause I remember telling the operator that he's out there shooting and
1515 everything.
1516
1517 Q: Okay, all right.
1518
1519 A: You know.

1521 Q: Um, do you remember whether (Carlos) got into a fight with anybody else?
1522
1523 A: I don't think so.

1525 Q: No? Okay. Do you remember – there was um, like a stick or a baton that we
1526 saw at the house there. Do you remember anybody holding that or using that?

1529
1530 Q: No?
1531
1532 A: A stick or a baton?
1533
1534 Q: Yeah, like a – like a stick a police officer might carry?
1535
1536 A: No, I have nothing like that.

1538 Q: Okay. How about there's a uh, a hole that was punched in a table?

1542 Q: There's a hold that somebody punched in a table.

1544 A: A table?
1545
1546 Q: Yeah, do you remember seeing that?

1548 A: No, I must have been in the garage when that happened.
1549
1550 Q: Okay. You just – you're not aware of that?

1554 Q: Okay. And there's some uh, blood in the kitchen area.
1555
1556 A: Mm-hm.
1557
1558 Q: And throughout the house. Do you remember anybody bleeding?
1559
1560 A: Uh, let's see, uh – I don't think I was close enough to see any blood.
1561
1562 Q: Okay.
1563
1564 A: And uh, I didn't see any contact between (Carlos) and anybody, other than the
1565 people who were trying to calm him. I don't think he ever could catch up
1566 with his son. Well, maybe he did. Yeah, maybe he knocked him down a
1567 couple times.
1568

1569 Q: You didn't...
1570
1571 A: I'm not sure – I didn't see that.
1572
1573 Q: Okay.
1574
1575 A: Actually...
1576
1577 Q: The only time you actually saw (Carlos) fighting with anybody was when he
1578 sucker punched (Chris); is that right?
1579
1580 A: Yeah.
1581
1582 Q: Okay.
1583
1584 A: And uh, when he was chasing (Eddie) through the living room.
1585
1586 Q: Right. Did he ever actually catch (Eddie) and fight with him?
1587
1588 A: Uh, no.
1589
1590 Q: No?
1591
1592 A: Not that I saw, no.
1593
1594 Q: Okay. Did – are there any other guns in your house anywhere else?
1595
1596 A: I have a gun.
1597
1598 Q: Okay. Well where do you keep that? I mean it's not illegal to have the gun,
1599 so – do-do you have one in the garage with you or-or what?
1600
1601 A: Well, I have a thing I registered with the Department of Justice.
1602
1603 Q: Okay. So I mean it's legal to have it. I'm just – I'm asking to make sure that
1604 if there are any guns found in the house, I know that it belongs to you or to
1605 somebody else, or maybe it doesn't belong there. I-I want to make sure. Do
1606 you – do you own – what type of a gun do you own?
1607
1608 A: [REDACTED]
1609
1610 Q: Okay. Now, yeah I'm – I'm not here to make a big deal about that. You said
1611 you have it registered?
1612
1613 A: Yeah.

1614
1615 Q: Okay. So then it's not a problem then.
1616
1617 A: Mm-hm.
1618
1619 Q: Uh, where is that kept in the house though, so that if the officers find it they
1620 know that it's your gun and they can check to make sure it's registered?
1621
1622 A: How can they just-just find it?
1623
1624 Q: Well, they're over there looking at your house right now so...
1625
1626 A: Oh.
1627
1628 Q: ...I'd rather them not freak out and think that-that there's some issue with it.
1629
1630 A: Mm-hm.
1631
1632 Q: As opposed to them, you know, finding it and thinking there's an issue or
1633 some kind of a concern. If you've got it legally registered, then really
1634 what's the uh, the concern, Clyde? [REDACTED]
1635
1636 A: Hm?
1637
1638 Q: [REDACTED]
1639
1640 A: No.
1641
1642 Q: [REDACTED]
1643
1644 A: Yeah.
1645
1646 Q: Okay. Well then it's not illegal if you have it registered. So rather than have
1647 them tear your house apart looking for it, where-would it be at?
1648
1649 A: Can't they just check it out?
1650
1651 Q: Check which out?
1652
1653 A: Well, I don't know. You guys always take stuff and then I have to come and
1654 get it back.
1655
1656 Q: Well they -- they're-they're looking at the house right now, so I mean if
1657 they're gonna find it, I would rather them not have to tear your house around
1658 to find it.

1659
1660 A: Yeah, I'm sure.
1661
1662 Q: Did that gun ever come into play at all tonight?
1663
1664 A: No.
1665
1666 Q: No? Nobody ever had it?
1667
1668 A: Nobody even knows where it is at.
1669
1670 Q: Okay. So just you have it then? You're the only one that -- does your wife
1671 even know where it's at?
1672
1673 A: No.
1674
1675 Q: She doesn't know? Okay. Is it loaded right now?
1676
1677 A: No.
1678
1679 Q: All right. So, as far as you know then, it was no -- that gun was nowhere near
1680 where (Carlos) was looking...
1681
1682 A: No.
1683
1684 Q: ...tonight?
1685
1686 A: No.
1687
1688 Q: Okay. Does he have any clue where the gun would have been?
1689
1690 A: He doesn't know I have one.
1691
1692 Q: Nobody knows you have it?
1693
1694 A: My wife does.
1695
1696 Q: Oh.
1697
1698 A: She doesn't know that I still have it.
1699
1700 Q: Oh, okay.
1701
1702 A: 
1703

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1704 Q: Okay. Well, like I said it's legal so – if it's legal and it's registered to you and
1705 it hasn't been altered, then there's – you know, I-I really could care less,
1706 Clyde. If it's not involved in this incident, I don't care.
1707
1708 A: Okay.
1709
1710 Q: Um, did-did you see – at any time did you see (Carlos) with a gun in his hand?
1711
1712 A: Not really.
1713
1714 Q: Okay. Well to-to really leave some ambiguity there. I mean did you actually
1715 see it or no?
1716
1717 A: All-all I saw is he got this blue bag.
1718
1719 Q: Mm-hm.
1720
1721 A: And he went out of the garage.
1722
1723 Q: How big was the blue bag?
1724
1725 A: It was big.
1726
1727 Q: Okay. You're showing me like, I don't know, maybe four-four feet or so
1728 long? Is it like a box or a bag?
1729
1730 A: Kind of like a bag type thing I think.
1731
1732 Q: Okay. Does it look like it's holding something, like a gun in it, a baseball bat?
1733 I mean what does it look like – like is in it to you?
1734
1735 A: It looked like a flimsy type bag, you know.
1736
1737 Q: Like it bends in the center?
1738
1739 A: Yeah.
1740
1741 Q: Okay. So does it look like it has anything in it or not?
1742
1743 A: Not from me looking at it, I mean you know.

1745 Q: Okay. So you had no clue what was in the bag then?

1748

1749 Q: Okay. And you don't know if he got into an argument or fight with anybody
1750 else at the house?

1754 Q: You don't know if he argued or fought with anybody besides (Eddie)...
1755
1756 A: Uh...
1757
1758 Q: ...and (Chris) and pushing people away that he didn't want touching him?
1759
1760 A: Yeah, that's all I saw.
1761
1762 Q: Okay. Did you get into a fight with anybody tonight?
1763
1764 A: Me?
1765
1766 Q: Yeah.
1767
1768 A: No.
1769
1770 Q: No? Okay. All right. Um, do you know - is there anybody at the house that
1771 has a handgun?
1772
1773 A: No.
1774
1775 Q: No? So the only other gun that would be in the house is gonna be the AK47
1776 then?
1777
1778 A: Mm-hm.
1779
1780 Q: Okay. All right. What-what was um, (Carlos) arrested for...
1781
1782 A: Uh...
1783
1784 Q: ...this last time?
1785
1786 A: It was a bum rap.
1787
1788 Q: Okay. Well I-I didn't ask whether it was right or not. I asked what he got
1789 arrested for.
1790
1791 A: Well, I'm not sure what the charges - but it-it...
1792
1793 Q: I mean did he have dope on him or was he in a bar or what?

1794
1795 A: No, no, no. He was in Tijuana.
1796
1797 Q: Okay.
1798
1799 A: And uh, he gave some guy a ride. Some guy wanted a ride over the border.
1800
1801 Q: Mm-hm.
1802
1803 A: So, he was kind of a good Samaritan and then drove him over the border. The
1804 guy tried to come over the border two or three times before that, and they
1805 caught him and put him back. Anyway, since (Carlos) had this prior bullshit
1806 about being in jail a lot of his life, I don't know - they think that he's
1807 smuggling aliens or something, I don't know.
1808
1809 Q: So is that - did he get in trouble with INS? Is that what he got arrested for?
1810
1811 A: Yeah, I guess that's why.
1812
1813 Q: Okay.
1814
1815 A: Has a - Homeland Security or somebody.
1816
1817 Q: So you said he's been arrested for some other bullshit. What-what else has
1818 this guy been arrested for?
1819
1820 A: Hm?
1821
1822 Q: What else has (Carlos) been arrested for besides this...
1823
1824 A: Uh, I don't know.
1825
1826 Q: ...this other guy?
1827
1828 A: Drugs, mostly I guess.
1829
1830 Q: Huh?
1831
1832 A: Drugs I guess.
1833
1834 Q: Drugs? Using, selling, what was he doing?
1835
1836 A: All he ever does, um, sniff paint and other various drugs.
1837
1838 Q: Okay.

1839
1840 A: I don't know what all he does.
1841
1842 Q: When did he get arrested for driving this guy over the border?
1843
1844 A: Uh, not too long ago. Uh, a few months ago.
1845
1846 Q: Is he on bail?
1847
1848 A: I guess.
1849
1850 Q: Did he skip out on his court date?
1851
1852 A: Hm?
1853
1854 Q: Did he miss his court date?
1855
1856 A: No. Uh, he just went to court – I don't know, a week ago – two weeks – he
1857 just went to court uh, and uh, been going on – then in five years uh, he's
1858 supposed to go back in the first week of October.
1859
1860 Q: And he's supposed to start serving five years?
1861
1862 A: He's supposed to do five years in the Federal Penitentiary.
1863
1864 Q: Okay. Is there anything else about tonight, Clyde, that you can think of that I-
1865 I didn't ask you about or that you think is important?
1866
1867 A: I really don't even know what their beef is, him and his son.
1868
1869 Q: Mm-hm.
1870
1871 A: I don't know, but I assume that they didn't get along at times.
1872
1873 Q: They don't get along?
1874
1875 A: Hm-mm, no sir.
1876
1877 Q: When did you first see a police officer? Did they come into the garage to get
1878 you or talk to you, or when did you first see a police officer tonight?
1879
1880 A: Well I was sitting at my desk in the garage, when I cleaned it up.
1881
1882 Q: And this was after the gunshots and after (Carlos) walked out with his hands
1883 over his head and all?

1884
1885 A: Af-after everybody was out of the house.
1886
1887 Q: Okay. So...
1888
1889 A: I was the only one left, and I couldn't get up.
1890
1891 Q: Right. Did you see police officers taking other people out of the house before
1892 they got to you?
1893
1894 A: Well, I didn't see them, I heard them.
1895
1896 Q: Okay. And were they saying for people to come out of the house and...
1897
1898 A: They were saying, "Put your hands up," and uh...
1899
1900 Q: Okay, okay.
1901
1902 A: That was walk this way.
1903
1904 Q: Right, right. And then officers came in and they carried you out of the house
1905 is what I heard. Is that right?
1906
1907 A: Well, they weren't carrying me out of the house, but they carried me down the
1908 street.
1909
1910 Q: Okay. They assisted you out of the house then?
1911
1912 A: Yeah.
1913
1914 Q: Okay. All right. Did you uh, that's the first time you saw any officers that
1915 night?
1916
1917 A: Yeah.
1918
1919 Q: Was when they picked you up?
1920
1921 A: You know, I saw the helicopter going overhead out there, you know.
1922
1923 Q: Okay.
1924
1925 A: I didn't see helicopters - I saw the light from the helicopters.


