Narrative:

On 03-01-2012 at about 0330 hours, I was contacted over the phone by Sergeant Dave Amador. Sergeant Amador advised me that an officer involved shooting had occurred and requested that I respond to Lincoln Avenue and Anna Street to assist with the investigation.

I arrived at the scene at about 0415 hours. Detective Mike Medici was assigned as the case agent of the investigation. After attending the briefing regarding the incident, Detective Medici requested that I respond to the emergency room of the Riverside Community Hospital (R.C.H.) to assist with the evidence collection of suspect Brandon James Dunbar's body.

Upon arrival to R.C.H., I met with Officer Kevin Feimer and Sergeant Bill Crutchfield in room "M". Brandon Dunbar was deceased and laying on a hospital bed with a white sheet covering his entire body. Sergeant Crutchfield cleared the scene a short time after my arrival.

Forensic Evidence Technician Selena McKay-Davis, Deputy Coroner Escobar and Sergeant Deputy Coroner Westfeldt arrived at R.C.H. and met with me in room "M". Deputy Escobar removed the white sheet covering Dunbar's body and began his investigation by photographing Dunbar. McKay-Davis also took photographs of Dunbar's body. A pair of white socks were lying on the bed near Dunbar's feet. Multi-colored underwear was lying under Dunbar's buttocks. The underwear appeared to have been cut off or removed from Dunbar's body. Dunbar was wearing a black nylon cap on his head. The nylon cap was collected as evidence by McKay-Davis. The white socks and underwear were left with Dunbar's body. Dunbar's body was nude and he had a breathing tube inserted into his mouth. I noticed a large incision on the left side of Dunbar's chest. The incision appeared to have been recently closed with metal medical staples.

During the examination of Dunbar's body we noticed the following gunshot wounds to his body;

- (1) Gunshot wound to the left hip
- (1) Gunshot wound to the front of the right knee
- (1) Gunshot wound to the right shoulder
- (1) Gunshot wound to the right tricep
- (1) Gunshot wound to the left buttocks
- (1) Gunshot wound to the back of the right knee


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I noticed the following tattoo's on Dunbar's body;



Deputy Escobar and Evidence Technician McKay-Davis collected gunshot residue from Dunbar's hands. McKay-Davis took custody of the gunshot residue evidence.

Brandon James Dunbar's identity was not known at this time. Deputy Escobar used an Integrated Biometric Identification System (I.B.I.S.) to scan the right thumb from Dunbar's body. The I.B.I.S. resulted in the return of Cal I.D. [REDACTED] associated with Dunbar's thumb print.

Deputy Escobar placed paper bags over Dunbar's right and left hands. Dunbar's body was secured inside a white body bag and then transported to the Riverside County Coroner's Office by Coroner personnel.

I then responded to the Magnolia Station. I contacted Anita Williams over the phone. Anita Williams works at Cal I.D. I provided Anita Williams the Cal I.D. number that was obtained during the I.B.I.S. thumb print of Dunbar's body. Anita Williams informed me that Cal. I.D. [REDACTED] returned to the following individual;
