5 **Testing:**

6 On June 27, 2013 the above listed handgun was taken to the California DOJ Lab, Riverside for
7 analysis five expended casings found within the revolver's cylinder. The sixth round was not
8 sent because it was under the hammer of the revolver in the ready to fire position. The testing
9 was being done to determine if any of those five expended casings had multiple firing pin strikes
10 on the primers.

12 The examination was done by Sr. Criminalist R. Takenaga who was able to determine the
13 following:

- 14 - The revolver functioned properly
15 - The five casings were fired by the handgun they were found within
16 - Three of the casings appeared to have 1-2 firing pin strikes on them
17 - Two of the casings had multiple (3 or more) firing pin strikes on them

PHYSICAL EVIDENCE EXAMINATION REPORT

I, the undersigned, declare under penalty of perjury: (1) I am employed by the State of California, Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Forensic Services; (2) I conducted an examination of the material described below in the ordinary course of my work as a qualified examiner, according to approved laboratory procedures that include creation of contemporaneous documentation and the technical review of my work; (3) The observable data is set forth in the associated laboratory case record; (4) Any opinions, interpretations, or conclusions in this report are based upon data in the associated laboratory case record and findings listed below.

Note: This laboratory report has been prepared and retained by DOJ in the normal course of business according to DOJ's regular practices and procedures. The Department of Justice Laboratory is accredited by the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors / Laboratory Accreditation Board (ASCLD/LAB).

At the direction of the submitting agency, only the agency identified in the mailing address of this report will be allowed access to this case. The submitting agency should notify the Laboratory when the prosecutor's office or others should be included.

SUMMARY/RESULTS

The submitted firearm (RM18) fired the five submitted cartridge cases (RM18-B). The diameters of the firing pin impressions on Item RM18-B Slot B through Slot D indicate that they were caused by a single or by double firing pin strikes. The diameters of the firing pin impression on Item RM18-B Slot E and Slot F indicate that they were caused by multiple firing pin strikes (three or more).

EVIDENCE

The following evidence was submitted to the Laboratory by S. Robinson of the Riverside Police Department on 06/27/2013:

EXAMINATION

Item RM18 is a six shot revolver manufactured by Smith & Wesson and is chambered to fire .38 Special caliber ammunition. The action of the firearm was immovable and the firearm was non functional as received. This operational problem appeared to be due to the presence of possible dried blood. The possible dried blood was removed and the revolver was functional after its removal. The trigger pull measured 4 ¼ pounds for single action and 9 ¼ pounds for double action. Its internal safety was functional. The revolver was test fired twelve times using Winchester ammunition from the laboratory collection. The test fired rounds were fired using the following sequence: tests 1 through 3 were fired once, tests 4 though 6 were fired twice, tests 7 through 9 were fired three times, and tests 10 through 12 were fired four times. Only the cartridge cases were retained. The revolver functioned properly during examination and test firing.

Item 18-B consists of five expended Winchester brand .38 Special caliber cartridge cases. The cartridge cases were received labeled "Slot B to Slot F" and were received covered with possible dried blood (the possible dried blood interfered with the microscopic examination of the cartridge cases and was removed). The cartridge cases were microscopically intercompared and compared to the test fired cartridge cases from Item RM18. Based on sufficient agreement of the individual marks found within the firing pin impressions, Item 18 fired the five cartridge cases Item RM18-B. The diameters of the firing pin impressions on Item RM18-B Slot B through Slot D indicate that they were caused by a single or by double firing pin strikes. The diameters of the firing pin impression on Item RM18-B Slot E and Slot F indicate that they were caused by multiple firing pin strikes (three or more).

DISPOSITION

The test fires were labeled Items TF-RM18. The test fires and all remaining items will be returned to the appropriate agency.
