



**Knowledge of:**

- Standard practices, methods, tools and materials used in welding, carpentry, plumbing and electrical installation and repair.
- Methods, techniques and tools used in the construction and maintenance of Park and Recreation facilities.
- Safe work practices.
- Operation of power equipment, including trucks, hi-ranger and related equipment.

**Ability to:**

- Perform skilled welding, plumbing, carpentry, electrical and general maintenance tasks independently.
- Understand and carry out oral and written instructions and to work from sketches, blueprints and diagrams.
- Use bench and hand tools, machines and equipment of the trades.
- Operate lap top computer for controlling sports lighting.
- Maintain effective, cooperative working relationships.
- Provide excellent customer service.
- Supervise a small crew.
- Work overtime as required.

**Education and Experience:**

Any combination of experience and education that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be:

Education: Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade.

Experience: Three years of experience in a skilled construction trade involving a variety of maintenance and repair tasks and preferably additional experience in one or more in another trade. Completion of a recognized apprenticeship or certification of completion from a recognized vocational training institute may substitute for one year of the required experience.
