Independence Day in Victorian Riverside was an occasion for Sousa Marches, patriotic speeches, bunting on trees & buildings, picnics, fireworks, & ice cream socials. During the summer of 1891, while this house was being built, downtown's Kandy Kitchen sold six flavors of ice cream: vanilla, lemon, strawberry, chocolate, pineapple, & coffee. That 4th of July, Robert Bettner, Catharine's son, & Frank Miller, founder of the Mission Inn, served on the young City's celebration program committee.
