Dearest Sister Sumi,

How are you? I hope that you are feeling better and hope that the shoulder pain doesn't bother you too much. Yes, I think that the pain comes from your gall bladder. I received your letters of the 8<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of April yesterday. I also received letters from Sis, Taiko and Mike fore.

I was surprised to learn of Chuck being killed in action. Mike wrote and said that he couldn't believe that he wouldn't comeback.

I took my first shower in about 27 days yesterday so I feel pretty clean today. But it will take more than one shower to get me real clean. We also got a change of socks and since I had you wool socks on I was going to throw them away as they were dirty. I gave it a second thought and decided that if you found out that I threw them away I would have heck to pay so I got a helmet full of water and washed them. Good home training!

The people in this part of Italy seem to be better off than those down there where we started from. We trade cigarettes and

Candy for rice and eggs so we make  
"Okazu" out of our C and K rations  
whenever we get a chance. The people  
line the streets of the towns that we  
have liberated and clap and throw  
flowers at us. They are really happy to  
see us. If we should stop they give us  
water or wine. The race baiters and  
all those that are anti-Japanese should  
see this and the sacrifices that our men  
have made to receive this joyous welcome.  
I have seen what the Partisans do to the  
Fascists and that is just what I would  
do to anyone that calls me a Jap.

Your schedule of the day is too  
rough on you. I think that Clark  
is asking too much to want to sleep  
until 8<sup>30</sup>. He should get enough sleep  
by the time you get home and besides  
he can sleep while you make supper  
if I can sleep with Jerry shells and our  
guns popping. Show him this letter.

Take it easy, sis. Don't worry about me  
as I'm okay and in the best of health. Please  
write often and give my regards to all. Love, <sup>FORM 500 A</sup> Sarge.
