WARD 6 RESIDENTS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR CITY COMMUNITY POLICE REVIEW COMMISSION OPENING

RIVERSIDE, CA - Applications are now being accepted for a Ward 6 vacancy on the City's Community Police Review Commission.

The Community Police Review Commission consists of nine members who act in an advisory capacity to the Mayor and City Council on all police and community relations issues, conduct public outreach to educate the community on the purpose of the Commission, receive, review, and investigate, through its manager, complaints of alleged police employee misconduct; and conduct hearings and make findings to advise the Police Department in matters pertaining to police policies and practices.

The Community Police Review Commission meets at 5:30 p.m. on the fourth Wednesday of the month in the Art Pick Council Chambers at City Hall. Time commitment may include 18-20 hours per month.

"The Mayor and City Council Members value the input from our community volunteers," stated Colleen J. Nicol, City Clerk. "By serving as a member of one of the Boards and Commissions, residents will have an opportunity to make decisions that affect their neighborhoods and city."
