

“You Are Not Alone”

In 1995, the United States Postal Services created a program to aid senior citizens and persons who were physically challenged. The program offered assistance and referrals to a variety of services.

One of the proposed services was a program that encouraged seniors and physically challenged persons to participate with their police department in the “You Are Not Alone” Program. The program’s focus is making daily, or as otherwise arranged, phone contacts to ensure the safety and welfare of participants.

The Riverside Police Department has volunteers making the phone calls to the participants of the Y.A.N.A. Program. If contact is made, no further action takes place.

If the client doesn’t answer the phone after several tries, an emergency contact person or police officer will visit their residence.
