Suspect Arrested in 2011 Shooting Involving Police Officers

Riverside, CA – On Sunday, February 6, 2011, at approximately 0115 hours, the Riverside Police Department Communications Center received a call regarding a possible hit and run with a subject brandishing a shotgun in the 9400 block of Miller.

Officers responded to the location and located a subject with a shotgun on Miller Street. The suspect leveled the shotgun towards a crowd running away, and an officer involved shooting occurred. Two suspects were taken into custody at the time. One suspect was transported to a local area hospital with a non-life threatening gunshot wound. The other suspect, Jose Oyarce, 18 years old, of Corona, was booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center for two counts of assault with a deadly weapon and one count of illegal possession of a loaded firearm. Jose Oyarce has since been convicted and sentenced to prison by the Riverside Superior Court. The hospitalized suspect was not charged in this case.

While this shooting was occurring, another officer encountered a male subject firing a handgun in the direction of the original responding officers. A second officer involved shooting occurred. This suspect fled the location on foot and after a lengthy search of the area, was not located. Detectives from the Robbery-Homicide Unit continued to investigate this case and identified a suspect. Evidence was submitted for DNA and additional types of forensic analysis. The results of the analysis were recently sent to detectives confirming the suspect's involvement in the second shooting.

A criminal case was submitted to the Riverside County District Attorney's Office. Charges were approved and submitted to the Riverside Superior Court. An arrest warrant was issued by the Court for 22 year old **Aubrey Terrell Eakins**, of Colton. He was charged with 2 counts of attempted murder of a police officer, 2 additional counts of attempted murder along with weapon and gang enhancements on each attempted murder charge. His bail was set at \$1.1 million dollars.

On Tuesday, October 8, at 6:15 PM, members of the Metro (SWAT) and Police and Corrections Teams, along with Homicide Detectives, arrested 22 year old **Aubrey Terrell Eakins** in the 2600 block of Hall Avenue in Jurupa Valley. He was booked into the Robert Presley Detention Center in Riverside.
