SUSPICIOUS SUBJECTS CALL RESULTS IN RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY SERIES ARRESTS

RIVERSIDE, CA – On Saturday December 14, 2013 at about 1:29am, Riverside Police Department officers were dispatched to a call of suspicious subjects with flashlights in the 6000 block of Del Rey in the City of Riverside. K-9 Officer Hill, Officer Mowrey, and Officer Jones detained one suspect on the street and another in a nearby van. The officers recovered a shotgun and .38 revolver in the van along with a large amount of suspected stolen property. As the investigation continued, the officers found a residential burglary had just occurred nearby in the 4400 block of Beverly Court. Some of the property from the victim's residence was in the van. Detectives Knoffloch and Nelson interviewed both suspects, searched one of the suspect's residence in the 4800 block of Palm, and recovered an additional firearm and more stolen property. In total the detectives identified property from five recent residential burglaries in the City of Riverside. The detectives are working with the Crime Analysis Unit to identify where the other suspected stolen property came from.

Bryant James Gentry, 20 years old from Riverside, and Devaughn Rayshawn Moore, 20 years old from Hemet, were booked into the jail for several felony charges including burglary (459 PC), possession of a loaded firearm (25850 PC), and possession of stolen property (496 PC).
