## **May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month Riverside Police Department to Conduct Enforcement Operation and Encourage Motorcycle Rider Training**

*Careless motorists as well as riders get special scrutiny*

The Riverside Police Department will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on April 3, 2016, in an effort to lower deaths and injuries. Extra officers will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where motorcycle crashes occur. Officers will be looking for violations made by drivers and riders alike that can lead to motorcycle crashes. They will be cracking down on both those operating regular vehicles and motorcycles who are violating traffic safety laws.

Motorcycle fatalities jumped dramatically in California by over 28 percent from a decade low of 352 in 2010. In 2013, 453 motorcyclists lost their lives, which is at a 5 year high. California collision data reveals that primary causes of motorcycle-involved crashes include speeding, unsafe turning and impairment due to alcohol and other drugs by both riders and drivers alike.

Operations like this are aimed at curbing any more rise in motorcycle deaths and sending the numbers back downward. Over the course of the past three years, the City of Riverside’s motorcycle-involved collisions have resulted in 248 fatal and injury crashes. The steady increase each year in the number of collisions may be contributed to the increasing number of motorcycles on the roads, as well as the increased size, horsepower and speed of these motorcycles. During Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month in May and during the rest of the year – drivers of all other vehicles are reminded to safely “share the road” with motorcyclists.
