


Facts About Measure V Fall 2010

Facts About Measure V

- Measure V is a hotel tax paid ONLY by hotel/motel guests when they stay at a Riverside hotel or motel.
- Riverside residents, homeowners or property owners - who are not hotel/motel guests - are NOT taxed.
- If passed, Measure V would provide over \$730,000 annually to maintain local city services and stimulate Riverside's economy.



Measure V Maintains Your Services

Including:

9-1-1 response times


Fire protection and neighborhood police patrols

 Renovating the convention center to promote tourism and economic growth



Hotel/Business Support

 If passed, Measure V would generate funds to stimulate our local economy, keeping Riverside a safe and desirable place to live, work, visit and do business – WITHOUT RAISING YOUR PROPERTY TAXES



How Measure V Impacts Hotels/Motels

 Measure V is a hotel tax paid ONLY by hotel and motel guests.

 Measure V increases the cost of a hotel or motel room just 2% for guests.

Increase to be phased in with 1% in July 2012 and 1% in July 2014.

Will Measure V Funds Stay Local?

- The State has taken \$65 Million from Riverside and will continue to take millions from the City to deal with their own billion dollar budget issues.
- The City needs a revenue source that can't be taken by Sacramento to protect and maintain Riverside's essential services and quality of life.
- Funds from Measure V are legally required to stay here in Riverside, giving us local control.



Fiscal Accountability


Measure V is fiscally accountable:

 Revenues are subject to publicly available, annual independent audits of city funds and expenditures.
