Board Update Meeting Summary | Monday, September 12, 2016

Board approved for the City Manager to sign and submit resolutions required for application to the State Water Resources Control Board for the Water Recycling Funding Program, related to funding and reimbursement mechanisms.

Assistant General Manager Todd Jorgenson gave a history of the current Recycled Water Projects that have been planned, and explained the timeline for the next steps in relation to funding and compliance with guidelines required in the bid process. Loan and grant opportunities have been identified through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund application for financial assistance. RPU will engage in procuring loans and/or grants in the amount of \$21,315,000 for both phases of the Jackson Street Recycled Water Pipeline that will run from the Riverside Wastewater Control Plant to a Western Municipal Water District's Cleveland Avenue connection. He indicated that all in costs per acre foot would be approximately \$400, which represents good value on the marketplace, he also indicated that customers that are located along the pipeline maybe be interested in receiving this water and a contractor will be hired to assist with site conversions.
