I am a detective with the Riverside Police Department and I am currently assigned to the Special Operations Bureau, North Neighborhood Policing Center, as an Auto Theft Detective.

On 10/31/2017, at about 1200 hours, I was advised of an incident occurring at Castle View Elementary. I was in a meeting and turned my department radio on to monitor the radio traffic. I heard the school was on lockdown and an evacuation of students was taking place. I responded to the location to assist with evacuations.

Narrative:

I was driving my assigned Department vehicle, a white 2006 Toyota Tacoma and I arrived at the location at about 1220. I parked about 1 block from the main entrance of the school, on Shaker Drive, facing south. I dressed out in my Department Issued RAID vest which has a Riverside Police Department patch and "POLICE" on the front, with "POLICE" in 3 inch letters on the back. I was wearing a tactical holster and blue jeans.

I proceeded to the front office of the school and contacted Sgt. D. Warren. I learned the younger students had been evacuated to Castle View Park prior to my arrival and the older students were sheltering in place awaiting an escort out of the school. Sgt. D. Warren asked me to go to Castle View Park and assist with the students who had already been evacuated.

I drove to Castle View Park and parked on Westview Drive adjacent to the park. I contacted Det. J. Brandt who was directing traffic around the park. I assisted Det. J. Brandt with coordinating the arrival and artures of school buses which were being used for evacuations. RPD Officers on the south side of Castle View Elementary were requesting additional buses approach the school on Century Avenue to pick additional students up. I rode inside one of the buses and responded to the school. Approximately 40 children were loaded into the bus and left the school for the park. I rode inside the bus during transport and the children were dropped off at the park safely.

Once the students were safely evacuated from the school to the park, I began directing RPD Officers to traffic control locations. Initial road closures were established at Century Avenue and Westview Drive which I determined to be too close to the park. I established a new road block at Barranca Drive and Century Avenue and directed Officers to restrict travel East on Century Avenue East of Barranca Drive. I contacted Sqt. Shafer and asked if him to close Century Avenue at Promontory Lane.

I assisted R.U.S.D. staff with the release of students to their parents until about 1500 hours, at which time Sgt. D. Warren released me from the scene.
