DETAILS:

On 10/31/17 at approximately 1112 hours, I was assigned to the West PAC Team and heard a radio call dispatched involving a subject taking a teacher hostage at Castle View Elementary School (located at 6201 Shaker Dr.). I responded to the school with PACT personnel. Once at the school, I requested that PACT officers provide breaching equipment (a ram and a pick specifically) and I provided a ballistic shield should they be needed. I then maintained a position on the south east side of the multi-purpose room.

Sergeant Tipre contacted me at roughly 1248 hours and asked if my team had any camera systems that might assist with intelligence gathering for the Emergency Response Team (ERT) positioned in room A3. I brought the requested equipment to room A3. While in room A3, I used the camera to view the interior of adjoining room A2 (via placement under the moveable wall) in order to assess how much a view into the room the camera could provide. Shortly thereafter, I redeployed with the majority of the ERT from room A3 to room A6. Room A6 shared a common wall with room A1 (where the suspect and hostage were) which was movable and had a small gap between both the top and bottom of the wall and the ceiling and floor, respectively. I used an under-door-camera (UDC) to look into room A1 to gain intelligence as to suspect and hostage movement as well as the placement of furniture inside the room.

Using the camera we could see that the furniture inside the room had been repositioned to form some sort of barricade in the middle of the room, what appeared to possibly be a barricade on at least one of the doors (leading to the interior common area) and a smaller barricade in the back corner of the room (diagonally away from the front door to the class room). The camera was briefly inserted under the door in the common area as well and the feed appeared to confirm that there were items placed behind that door. At one point (while placing the camera under the wall) I was able to see, what I believed to be the suspect's arm and hand and it appeared that he was sitting on the floor next to the camera with his back to the moveable wall. Periodically, I placed the camera through the gap in the top of the wall. This required turning the camera upside down to allow it to fit thru the gap. Based on the camera footage as well as sounds that we could hear through the wall it appeared that both the suspect and hostage were in the corner diagonally away from the front door (in the south/west corner of the room) and behind the smaller barricade of furniture. I eventually placed the camera on top of the wall, placed several foam discs under it (which were found in the classroom) and taped it to the wall so that it would remain in place without me holding it.

A plan was established by SWAT to open the moveable wall to make entry into the room at the same time as a diversion was made to the front of room A1. Just prior to the execution of the plan, I removed the camera from its position on top of the wall as I was concerned that it might become jammed between the moveable and stationary portions of the wall and thereby hinder the movement of the wall. Once the plan was executed, furniture in room A1 prevented the wall from folding properly and thus from opening more than a small amount. I tried to force the wall open by kicking it and ramming my shoulder into it (as did other personnel in the room) with no effect. I then heard gunfire and heard Officer Mowrey say something like "who is shooting". Officer Paes replied that he was and then said something similar to "he still has the hostage", followed by more gunfire.

The hostage was then pulled through the opening in the wall and passed to a tactical medic that was staged in room A6. The two then evacuated northbound through the school. Officer Lopez (who was in A6) broadcasted on the radio that the suspect was "down" (in A1). Officers made entry into room A1 through the front door and the wall was then opened more. When the wall opened I could see the suspect's lying on the ground with his head facing the classroom windows. I then exited the room and reported back to Magnolia Station.
