On 10-31-17, at approximately 1112 hours, I was assigned as part of the RPD METRO/SWAT team. I was driving a marked black and white police vehicle in the area of Adams St and the 91 FWY when I heard dispatch broadcast a call at 6201 Shaker Dr (Castleview Elementary). I heard dispatch and other officers advising that a parent, later ID'd as S-1/Luvelle Kennon, was on campus attacking staff.

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I began responding to the scene and continued to monitor the updates. I heard over the radio that the suspect had dragged a teacher into a classroom and was barricading himself and the hostage inside. I arrived on scene and parked to the front of the school on the street. I responded to the area of classroom A1 where the suspect was last seen entering. I joined up with officers already on scene and joined the crisis entry team.

I heard Officer's Park and Macias say over the radio that they had arrived on scene with the SWAT armored vehicle (ARV) on the S/W corner of the school. They requested that I leave my position with the initial ERT and move to the ARV. I moved to their location and entered the ARV. The ARV was driven from the S/W corner of the school to the front of classroom A1. I was assigned as part of ERT 1. My assignment was to act as the breacher in case a crisis entry needed to be made into classroom A1. I was provided a key for the classroom door by SRO Moulton. In case the key didn't work I was provided a pick tool to pry open the door if needed.

I stayed with ERT 1 behind the ARV for several hours while the incident unfolded. Eventually communications broke down, and I was provided information that the hostage was possibly in danger. I was told by Sergeant Dehdashtian that it had been almost an hour since the hostage negotiators had heard from the hostage and they believed she was in danger. A plan was made to make entry into the classroom and rescue the hostage.

I was assigned as a member of the secondary ERT. The plan was for the primary entry team to force their way through the sliding/retractable doors from the adjacent room. In the event the primary team was unable to breach the door my team was to make entry into the room via the front door of the classroom. The command to initiate our movement was if Sgt. McCoy (Sam 22) gave the command "failed breach" over the radio.

I heard "Sam 22 divert" over the radio. I heard the sound of a light sound diversionary device being deployed. I heard what sounded like several gun shots coming from inside the room. I heard Sgt. McCoy say "failed breach" over the radio. I moved from behind the ARV up to the front door of the classroom. I pulled on the outward opening door and discovered it was locked. I attempted to unlock the door with the key provided by SRO Moulton. The key turned inside the lock but the door would not open. I was unsure if the key did not work or if the door was being barred from opening on the inside. I set the pick inside the crack of the door between the lock and the door frame. I signaled for Officer Soria to use the ram to hammer the pick into the door crack. After the pick was hammered in I pulled back on it and forced the door open.

I made entry into the room after Officer Monreal. Once inside I could see the room was filled with gray, acrid smoke. I could see desks and chairs had been moved around in what looked like an attempt to barricade the room. There was a white powdery substance coating everything inside the room. It appeared to be fire extinguisher retardant. I began shouting to the other officers in the room "where is the victim?".

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I heard an unknown officer reply "She is out. The victim is out." I began clearing the room in an attempt to locate the suspect. I heard Officer Monreal say that the suspect was "over here". I moved to where Officer Monreal was at in the S/W corner of the classroom. I could see a black male adult (S-1) lying face down on the ground between the sliding/retracting wall and a pile of desks and chairs. The suspect was wearing jeans and a sweatshirt. I could see a pair of large metal scissors with a black handle on the ground directly to the left of S-1. The scissors were near S-1's head. I placed my left knee on the middle of S-1's back to control his movement and handcuff him. I placed S-1 in handcuffs and rolled him onto his side. I searched S-1 to ensure he did not have any weapons on him. I did not locate any weapons in S-1's waistband or pockets. While searching S-1 I could see a large bloodstain on the crotch area of his jeans. I unzipped S-1's sweatshirt to see if he was injured. I could see S-1 had a quarter-sized wound on his pelvis above his groin. I shouted "we need medics" and I heard an unknown officer request medical aid over the radio shortly after. SWAT/AMR Paramedic E. Vu responded and began treating S-1. I stayed with S-1 and Vu until the suspect was loaded onto a gurney and transported out of the classroom.

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..at we were clear t After the incident I gathered the pick and put it back into the rear of the ARV. I gathered up with the rest of the Officers on scene and was instructed to go to RPD Magnolia station to await further orders. I responded to the upstairs training room and waited with other officers for about an hour. I was eventually told by Sgt. McCoy that we were clear to leave the station and go home.
