#### **NARRATIVE:**

On 10-31-17 at about 1112 hours, I was assigned to the Riverside Police Department's METRO/SWAT Team. On the above date and time, I heard Riverside Police Dispatch broadcast a radio call of a subject at Castle View Elementary (6201 Shaker Dr.) causing a disturbance about staff not releasing his daughter to him. The subject was identified as S/Kennon. Shortly after the initial broadcast, Police Dispatch advised S/Kennon had made his way into the school, battered teachers and forced the victim into classroom A1. Police Dispatch advised S/Kennon had taken the victim hostage in classroom A1, was barricading the doors and deploying smoke inside the classroom. S/Kennon was described as a Black male adult, in his 20's, tall and thin, with short hair and tattoos on his arms. He was last seen wearing a dark colored shirt, dark pants and carrying two backpacks with unknown items inside.

Based on the above information, I responded to the school in a marked unit. I was followed by the ARV and equipment truck and assisted them by clearing intersections. I arrived on scene at about 1145 hours and met up with other members of the METRO/SWAT Team at the back gate to the school. Detective Serrato took over the operation of the ARV and he drove it into the school with METRO/SWAT personnel aboard. Detective Serrato positioned the ARV to the front of classroom A1.

As a member of the METRO/SWAT Team, I was assigned to the emergency react team (ERT) utilizing the Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) to the front of classroom A1. That designated emergency react team comprised of Sgt. Dehdashtian, Officer H. Park, Officer Monreal, Officer Soria, Officer Wright, Officer Pap, Officer Carmona, Officer Glover, Officer Weddle, Officer Moulton, K-9 Officer Larkin and I. Our objective for the emergency react team was to react to any exigent circumstances inside classroom A1, where S/Kennon had taken the victim hostage. Due to the nature of the crime and the potential for S/Kennon being armed, we utilized the ARV for ballistic cover during the incident. As a part of the ERT, I was tasked with being secondary operator to enter the location in the event a crisis entry needed to be made into classroom A1.

As the incident unfolded, Emergency Negotiators attempted to establish communication with S/Kennon. At about 1416, a throw phone mission was planned and put into effect. I was assigned to provide cover for Officer Monreal who was delivering the throw phone. After successfully deploying the throw phone just outside the front door to classroom A1, the team moved back to the ARV and transitioned back to a member of the ERT.

We were advised that communications with S/Kennon broke down and at about 1720 hours, I learned from Emergency Negotiators that it had been about an hour since the victim had been heard inside the classroom and they believed she continued to be in danger. As a result, a plan was made to make entry into the classroom and rescue the hostage from harm's way.

I was also assigned to the secondary ERT, in the event the other ERT had a failed breach. The secondary ERT was tasked with making crisis entry into classroom A1 through the front door in the event of a failed breach by the other ERT.

At about 1745 hours, Sgt. McCoy broadcast the command of "Divert," at which time Officer Park deployed a light and sound diversionary device towards the front door of classroom A1. I provided him

cover. Shortly after, I heard several gunshots coming from inside the room. I then heard Sgt. McCoy broadcast "failed breach" and we moved up to the front door of the classroom. Along with Officers Park, Monreal, Soria and Pap, I made entry into classroom A1. Once inside the classroom, I could see the room was clouded by smoke, and the desks and chairs had been moved around in an attempt to barricade the access points into the room.

I searched the room for the victim until I heard someone from the other ERT say, "The victim is out." At that point, I searched the room for the suspect and heard Officer Monreal say that he had located S/Kennon on the ground by the accordion wall separating classrooms A1 and A6. I observed Officer Pap take S/Kennon into custody and request medical aid over the radio.

n. Dehdashtian and Sgt. Due to the possibility of unknown devices S/Kennon may have brought into the room; we were order by Sgt. Warren to vacate the area and wait several yards away from the crime scene/ARV. I was later instructed by Lieutenant Dinco to go to RPD Magnolia Station for further instructions. At about 2030 hours, I was directed by Sgt. Dehdashtian and Sgt. McCoy that we were clear to leave the station and go
