62. Narrative of Supplemental Report
On 10/31/17, I responded to Castlevue Park to assist with the hostage situation at Castle View Elementary School. I assisted school administration in the release of students to the parents. It was determined that a teacher was being held hostage in her class room and the campus was evacuated.

While at the park, it was brought to my attention that V/Carlos Paredes Gallardo was also at the park. He had visible injuries to his face and hand and was holding an ice pack to his face. I asked Paredes Gallardo if he would go with me to Orange Street Police Station. He agreed. (He was previously interviewed by Officer Foster and also briefly spoke to Detective Corbett.) Paredes Gallardo received medical treatment at RCH. I audio recorded his statement and the recording was retained in police records.(See attached summary.)

[Redacted] responded to Castle View Elementary School to assist in the investigation of the officer involved shooting. I participated in the initial walk-through of the scene.

I then responded to Magnolia Police Station and assisted Detective Tillett with interviewing witness officers. (See supplemental reports for additional information.)

Interview with Carlos Paredes on 10/31/17 at Orange Street Police Station:

The following is a summary of my interview with Carlos Paredes Gallardo. The interview was audio recorded and the recording was retained in police records. The first segment of the audio is the conversation between Paredes Gallardo and me during the drive from the park to the police station. He spontaneously started talking about the incident and I activated my recorder.

Paredes Gallardo told me that he had never seen the parent (S/Kennon) before. He heard that he was a parent of a student and that that he was trying to get his daughter but did not have custodial rights. Paredes Gallardo said V/Linda Montgomery was Kennon's daughter's teacher and he doubted there was any other relationship between Montgomery and Kennon.

Paredes Gallardo described Kennon as an African American male that was about 6'2" tall. He described Montgomery as an old white lady that was probably close to retirement. Paredes Gallardo said that Montgomery didn't have a chance against Kennon unless the cops were able to convince him to let her go or they just busted in and took him down quickly.

Paredes Gallardo told me that he was a substitute teacher and was at the school volunteering to help his wife with a virtual reality lesson for her students. He helped her set up the lesson. They had lunch together and he planned to help her with a second lesson after lunch.

Paredes Gallardo said he thanked God that the parent (Kennon) came in all crazy during the perfect time of the day because all of the kids were at lunch. He (Kennon) otherwise would have walked into a class room full of 1st graders and the teacher. Paredes Gallardo told me that Kennon could have taken the kids hostage too. The kids were at lunch and then were evacuated.

Paredes Gallardo said he would hopefully be fine physically by next week. He hoped that the teacher (Montgomery) was okay. He said he didn't see her bleeding and didn't see Kennon hit her. Paredes Gallardo hoped that Kennon didn't hit women. He said Kennon dragged Montgomery back into the classroom. Paredes Gallardo told me that Montgomery probably was hurt a little bit when that happened. He described Montgomery as being so frightened and hoped that she stayed calm and saw that police officers were present.

Paredes Gallardo told me that he felt he now needed to take self-defense classes. He told me that he had never fought before and had never been a violent person or felt the need to fight. He told me he now realized that sometimes a person had to resort to violence or a physical means. (We then talked in general about him being caught off guard and having to react to the situation.)

Paredes Gallardo told me that Kennon was so mad and had a "look" in his eye. He felt Kennon already had an idea because he didn't attempt to just talk to the teacher and then get mad. Paredes Gallardo said Kennon wanted the kidnapping because when Paredes Gallardo distracted him, Montgomery escaped and went outside by the lunch tables. Kennon could have talked to her there but he chose to drag her back into the classroom and close the door. Paredes Gallardo felt Kennon wanted the kidnapping and maybe thought they were then going to give him his daughter. Paredes commented that it didn't make sense.

He said when he was at the hospital he saw the incident was on the news and saw the helicopter circling the school. He mentioned it was on split screen with an incident that occurred in Manhattan.

I asked Paredes Gallardo if he was in pain and he told me that it hurt a little. He said he was going to cry if he heard something happened to the teacher. He described himself as an emotional person. He said he made a split-second decision that he wouldn't forget. He told me that he would be okay with it but that he did choose self-preservation versus helping the old lady.

Paredes Gallardo said the Principal was really involved and mentioned that she was at the recent Las Vegas shooting and had survived but was still recovering mentally. He said her first name was Tiffany but he could not remember her last name. He thought it was her second year at the school and he said that she gave him a hug when she saw him with his injuries at the park.

Paredes Gallardo said that Kennon punched him. Paredes tried to go after Kennon and tried choking him. Kennon got Paredes off of him and punched him again.

We arrived at Orange Street Police Station and Detective Tillett joined us in the interview room.

Paredes Gallardo gave me his full name and date of birth. He said his wife was a second grade teacher. He was at the school (Castle View Elementary) to volunteer in helping her with a virtual reality lesson. He said he then brought back KFC to her classroom and they ate lunch. They heard the announcement (regarding the campus lock down.) He said his wife's classroom was adjacent to the involved teacher's classroom. They saw the principal and asked her what was going on. The principal told them that there was a teacher and a man inside a classroom and that the man had both doors closed. The principal told him that she couldn't get the door open and that she didn't know what was going on.

Paredes Gallardo told us that he tried to help. He opened the classroom door and saw that the man tried to barricade the door. He told us that the principal had not pushed hard enough to get the door open. Paredes Gallardo was able to push open the door. The man (Kennon)

looked surprised and came toward Paredes. Kennon asked Paredes Gallardo who he was and why he was there. Paredes Gallardo asked him if he needed help and what was going on. Kennon then "sucker punched" Paredes Gallardo in the face. Paredes Gallardo clarified that he opened the back door of the classroom. When Kennon hit Paredes, Montgomery walked out the front door to the lunch area. Kennon followed Montgomery and Paredes Gallardo followed him shortly after. He then saw Montgomery sitting down in front of Kennon. Kennon was on a bench and had his right arm wrapped around Montgomery's neck. Paredes Gallardo was scared Kennon was going to choke her out or snap her neck.

Paredes Gallardo said he couldn't see waiting for help as a solution and decided to take action. Paredes Gallardo thought Kennon was vulnerable because his arms were around Montgomery. Paredes Gallardo put his arm around Kennon's neck. Kennon either pushed him or knocked him to the ground and hit him numerous times in the face. Paredes Gallardo was on the ground and covered himself with his arms. Kennon was focused on Montgomery and left Paredes Gallardo there on the ground. Paredes Gallardo said Kennon probably thought he would just stay on the ground.

Kennon then dragged Montgomery to her classroom. He estimated the distance to be approximately 25 feet. Paredes Gallardo got up and walked toward them trying to figure out what to do next. He saw a male custodian walking toward him and wanted to know if the custodian would help him. The custodian told Paredes Gallardo to let them go and that he couldn't do anything about it. He further advised Paredes Gallardo not to get involved. Paredes Gallardo said he was of no help and was not a physical match for Kennon. Kennon was taller, bigger and angrier. Kennon dragged Montgomery to the door and Paredes Gallardo was still right there. Kennon looked at Paredes Gallardo to measure if he dared to try again. Paredes Gallardo did not try again. Kennon got Montgomery into the room and closed the door. As far as he knew; they were still there.

Paredes Gallardo went to the nurse's office and cleaned himself up. He then went to the hospital.

I asked Paredes Gallardo to describe the announcement that was made. He said the teachers were directed to lock their doors and to get the children they were responsible for to safety. Paredes Gallardo said he was initially confused because he didn't know what it was about. He said if they had been in a different classroom they would not have known but they were right there.

Paredes Gallardo said he had never seen the custodian before. I asked him how he knew that Kennon was having a custodial issue with his daughter. He said he heard it from the administration staff. He said he heard that Kennon's daughter was there and that he was not the custodial parent and was not allowed the removal of his daughter from the campus. He said Montgomery was his daughter's teacher.

Paredes Gallardo said Kennon made his way through the front office. The people in the front office would have been the people to tell Kennon that he could not take his daughter. The teacher would not have told him. He said there were only a bunch of women in the front office. They didn't have weapons and they couldn't stop him. He said both his wife and the principal called the police. Kennon was already barricaded when the police arrived.

Paredes Gallardo said that before the first time Kennon punched him, he asked him who he was and why he was there. Paredes Gallardo responded and then was hit in the face by Kennon. Paredes Gallardo remembered hearing someone yelling for Kennon to let the teacher go and yelling at Kennon not to hit him. Kennon was not in a state to listen and didn't listen to anyone. He said he hoped Kennon came out peacefully. He said he knew there were professional negotiators there. He said it would mean the teacher and the staff would be safer if Kennon gave up. He said Kennon might decide to do something more drastic and more violent. Paredes Gallardo said that he didn't see Kennon with any weapons but that he was physically very strong. Kennon was wearing a brown hoodie and had tattoos on his collar bone. His clothing was baggy. He said he might have had a backpack but Paredes Gallardo did not see it. He thought it might be inside the classroom. Kennon made no threat to him with a gun or a knife. Paredes Gallardo didn't hear Kennon say anything to Montgomery.

Paredes Gallardo knew Montgomery taught the 1st grade. He said his wife didn't know her because they didn't work together and his wife taught 2nd grade. He said Kennon was at least 6' tall and had a medium build. He was a black male and he could see that Kennon had tattoos on his upper chest.

Paredes Gallardo said it seemed as if Kennon wanted to kidnap Montgomery. She was already outside and he could have hurt her there. He took the time and effort to drag her back into the classroom. He said Montgomery's butt was on the ground and her pants were pulling down from the friction from the ground. Kennon dragged her about 25 feet. When he punched Paredes Gallardo, Montgomery did not get up. Kennon had her in a choke hold and dragged her into the classroom. They were both facing him as she was dragged backward by Kennon and he backed into the doorway. She did not fight against him and appeared "frozen" with a terrified look on her face. Paredes Gallardo said Montgomery saw what Kennon did to him and probably realized she shouldn't fight. She knew her age and the physical difference between them. She knew he would not hesitate to use physical force and probably decided to wait for the police.

Paredes Gallardo said as soon as Kennon hit him in face he started bleeding. He said he bled a lot and the blood in the pod area was his blood. He also bled in the classroom. He did not see the teacher (Montgomery) bleeding. I asked him about the injury on his hand and he said it may have happened when he tried to put Kennon in a choke hold. Kennon may have grabbed his

hand and scratched him but he could not say for certain. Paredes Gallardo said he never punched Kennon. He didn't know Kennon's name and did not know his daughter's name.

Paredes Gallardo said that teachers usually photographed their rooms at the beginning of the school year and the police might be able to get the layout of her room from the photos. He also talked about the possibility that the doors to the classrooms may not be locking properly. He said he did notice that there was a flipped over desk and that there was a table on its side by the front door when he walked through the room.

Paredes Gallardo said he hoped the police could save the teacher. He said at this moment he didn't have much compassion for the guy (Kennon). Paredes Gallardo said if Kennon let her go that he would forgive him.

The interview was concluded.

Additional:

I spoke to Heather Pollack with Riverside County CPS. She told me there were no referrals regarding Kennon and his daughter.

On 11/1/17, I spoke to Paredes Gallardo's wife on the phone to ask about his welfare. She said they were going to their own doctor to get his nose checked as it appeared to be displaced approximately 5mm.
