Narrative:

On November 6th, 2017, I asked Paramedic Richard Hanes if he would speak to me about the incident. I had learned Paramedic Hanes had treated S/Kennon, Luvelle at Castle View Elementary and then transported him to Riverside Community Hospital. Paramedic Hanes agreed to speak to me.

At about 1420 hours, I called and spoke to Paramedic Hanes and asked him to tell me about what he remembered. I recorded his statements on my Department Issued PUMA Audio Recorder. The following is a brief synopsis of that conversation.

Paramedic Hanes told me staged for several hours inside the school grounds at Castle View Elementary. He said they were able to see the SWAT Team staged outside the building. He was aware the suspect had a hostage in the class room. He told me he heard several loud sounds that he believed were "flash bangs" and "gun shots."

He said a SWAT Officer ran to his location and told him the suspect and hostage was coming out. He said they were waved by Law Enforcement to get closer to the incident with their ambulance. He was told he would be taking the suspect. He then made contact with Paramedic Vu who was starting to treat S/Kennon inside of the classroom. He said S/Kennon was near the farthest back wall of the classroom and was lying in a "right-lateral" position. He said S/Kennon was, "Up against the wall behind some what looked like desks or something that he kind of built up."

He said Vu did chest compressions on S/Kennon who then started breathing on his own. He said S/Kennon was moved off the floor to the gurney. He said S/Kennon's clothes were stripped off and he noticed several wounds. He said one wound was in the "supra-pubic area." He noticed another wound on the left upper leg. He said there was heavy bleeding on the leg and he believed the bone was fractured.

He said S/Kennon was breathing on his own when they got him into the ambulance. He said S/Kennon was moving around. Paramedic Hanes said they gave him oxygen and he started an "I.V." on S/Kennon. He said S/Kennon tried to talk. He said S/Kennon was trying to move the oxygen mask off his face with his tongue. He believed S/Kennon was trying to ask for something but he couldn't tell what he was asking for. He said they treated the injuries and monitored vital signs.

He said when they arrived at the Hospital S/Kennon continued to talk. He believed S/Kennon was given medication and a tube was placed down his airway. He said they started CPR about ten minutes later. He said at about 1832 hours they pronounced him deceased in the trauma room.

I asked Paramedic Hanes if he understood anything S/Kennon said. He said he could tell S/Kennon was asking something but he couldn't tell what it was.

He said after transferring care he collected the clothing left in the ambulance and separated it into paper bags with a Detective who was there. He said the clothing that was taken into the Emergency Room with S/Kennon was also collected and placed into a paper bag. Paramedic Hanes told me he has been a Paramedic for almost 3 years. He was an Emergency Medical Technician for almost 5 years before becoming a Paramedic.

I later downloaded the recording of the interview for preservation.
