Notification and Response:

On Tuesday 10/31/17 at 1112 hours, I was on duty and working at my desk at the Magnolia Street Police Station. I monitored live radio traffic from my hand held radio. Dispatchers advised that a subject was holding a female teacher hostage in one of the classrooms at Castle View Elementary School located at 6201 Shaker Drive. I continued to monitor the incident for approximately another 20-30 minutes. First responding police personnel began evacuating grammar school students in buses from the school to nearby Castle View Park. At approximately 1230 hours, Sergeant Dan Warren requested assistance from the detectives in the Robbery/Homicide Unit. At approximately 1300 hours, Detective Jim Brandt and I arrived at Castle View Park to assist school employees with watching students until their parents could arrive and pick them up at the park. Once the students were safe and secure Detective Brandt and I continued to monitor the incident on the radio from a nearby location.

The Emergency Negotiation's Team (ENT), attempted to establish dialog or communications with suspect Luvelle Kennon for several hours. Based on the radio transmissions I personally heard, Mr. Kennon did not appear to be communicating with negotiators.


At approximately 1745 hours, the Riverside Police Department's METRO Team executed a plan to rescue the hostage (Linda Montgomery). They ultimately made entry into the classroom where she was being held. As a result of the operation Montgomery was successfully rescued but the suspect Luvelle Kennon was shot by law enforcement and later died at the hospital as a result of his injuries.

Part of my duties as a Robbery/Homicide detective is to investigate officer involved shootings. At approximately 1800 hours, Detective Brandt and I responded to Castle View Elementary School and met with several assisting detectives as they arrived. Detective Adrian Tillett was assigned as the Case Agent of the overall investigation. Detective Karla Beler was assigned to be his Co-case. Detective Jim Brandt and I were assigned to complete the crime scene investigation with assistance from Evidence Specialists Selena McKay-Davis and Liane Velin. The following report contains information related to the crime scene investigation and the collection of evidence.

The Crime Scene:

Castle View Elementary School is located at 6201 Shaker Drive in the city and county of Riverside. The school sits in the middle of a residential neighborhood with the entrance located on Shaker Drive. Shaker drive directionally runs North/South. The school property consists of three large single story hexagon shaped buildings used as classrooms. There is also a separate library, the administration building, several sidewalks connecting to all of the buildings, and a large concreted area with lunch tables designated as an eating area for the students.

The Crime Scene Continued:

The shooting occurred inside of Classroom A1 where the suspect held victim Montgomery. Room A1 is one of six (6) total classrooms that are individually labeled A1 through A6. They are all connected together under one common roof in the same building. This particular building is located to the far south of the school property. Each classroom can access another through a hinged, accordion style or folding wall which slides opens for accessibility.

Initial Walkthrough and Observations:

Prior to processing the crime scene, Sergeant William McCoy walked Detective Brandt and I through the crime scene. The following police personnel were also included in the initial otherse pro walkthrough. Detective James Mutuku documented a crime scene log listing who was present by name and ID number.

As I walked through the crime scene I noted an obvious blood trail on the sidewalk leading from the exterior door of room A1 (Victim Montgomery's classroom) and traveling eastbound through the campus. The blood trail led from the classroom all the way to the Administration office where it ended inside.

Classroom A6:

We entered the crime scene from the adjacent room A6. I noted the accordion wall leading into room A1 was located on the east side of the classroom. It was opened approximately 3' wide on the far south end of the wall and the opening led directly into classroom A1. I noted a video camera lying on a desk along with a hard plastic case that is used to contain the camera. I would later find out that this was a tactical camera owned and operated by an RPD Tactical team (PAC Team) used to assist them in gaining intelligence. This camera recorded video up to the time that entry was made by the METRO Team but the video was of no evidentiary value. However, the audio on the camera captured the sounds of the breech and the shooting as it occurred. I downloaded and retained the recordings as evidence. On 11/02/17, I returned the camera to Sergeant Ryan Wilson of the RPD PAC Team.

Accordions Doors From Inside A6 Looking Into A1





Classroom A1:

Entering classroom A1 I noted a child's blanket, (Peppa Pig) and a pair of scissors lying against the accordion wall. I also noted a red fire extinguisher on the floor just inside the doorway. There was evidence of white powder all over the room that appeared to be from the fire extinguisher after it was deployed. I recalled earlier over radio communications that the suspect was "Popping smoke," meaning doing something that was producing visible smoke inside of the classroom.



Inside of Classroom A1



Processing the Crime Scene:

Once the walkthrough was completed we began processing the crime scene. At approximately 1925 hours, Selena McKay Davis took video and still photographs of the entire scene. Upon completion of the photographs Detective Brandt and I identified the evidence for collection. The evidence items were marked with numbered placards for identification. Once all evidence was marked, the items were photographed and ultimately collected by Detective Brandt and Liane Velin. Among the items collected were;

(5) Spent .Hornady Nato 5.56 caliber casings A pair of scissors with black handles A child's "Peppa Pig" blanket A red Fire Extinguisher A small amount of marijuana A white Apple IPhone and charger (Suspects) A camouflage colored backpack (Suspects)

Crime Scene Sketch:

Selena McKay Davis took measurements of the buildings and of the interior crime scene to later complete a sketch for reference. She will also have the completed property report containing an itemized list of all evidence items collected. The property list will be included with her Crime scene report when completed.

All crime scene personnel cleared the scene on 11-01-17, at approximately 0015 hours.


Additional Information:

During the crime scene investigation, I noted numerous pieces of tactical equipment and gear left inside and outside of the school classrooms throughout the crime scene. This equipment is assigned to Riverside PD tactical personnel to perform their duties. Before clearing the crime scene we gathered this tactical equipment including a gas mask and several breaching tools and then released them back to SWAT personnel on scene.
