Sgt. Corbett told me two Riverside Police Department Officers were involved in an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS). Sgt. Corbett told me the Officer's were not injured, but the suspect (S1 Marcelino Garcia) had fled the scene. Sgt. Corbett told me assisting Officer's followed a blood trail left behind by S1 Garcia to [Redacted] located in the City of Riverside, Ca. The S.W.A.T Team was requested to assist with the search for S1 Garcia. Sgt. Corbett gave me the order to initiate a full S.W.A.T Team call out.

out 2342 hours, I contacted members of the Riverside Police Department S.W.A.T Team and initiated a full S.W.A.T Team call out. Upon our arrival we checked in with Sgt. Corbett at the Command Post, located at MacArthur Rd. and Garfield St. Continued.

NARRATIVE:

At the Command Post Sgt. Corbett briefed the S.W.A.T Team on the original incident and the tactical plan. Sgt. Corbett advised, Officer's followed a blood trail, believed to be from S1 Garcia leading to the East yard of [REDACTED]. Sgt. Corbett assigned a React Team to drive to [REDACTED] to make contact with the residents and ensure their safety.

Sgt. Corbett assigned the following personnel to the React Team

- Officer Smith
- Officer Park
- Officer Macias
- Officer Monreal
- Officer Allison
- Officer Soria
- Officer Mercadefe
- Officer Wright
- Officer Glover
- K9 Officer Larkin
- Officer Kerr (ARV Driver)
- Sgt. Corbett (Team Leader)

With the use of our Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV), the React Team drove to the front of [REDACTED] Ave. sits on the North side of the street and sits approximately 25 yards from the curb line. The residence shares an open carport with [REDACTED] that sits just West of the location. Upon our arrival we spoke with Sgt. Ortiz who was positioned west of the location. Sgt. Corbett spoke with Sgt. Ortiz who then contacted the residents inside [REDACTED] via cellular phone.

Sgt. Corbett gave the command to approach the residence to safely evacuate the residents of [REDACTED]. At the location, Officer Wright and I covered down on the carport that sits in between the two houses. Officer Allison and Officer Monreal covered the East driveway and rear yard. At the door, the residents of [REDACTED] were cooperative and agreed to exit the residence. While Sgt. Corbett was speaking with the residents, two Hispanic Female adults and two Hispanic Male adults appeared behind the pedestrian gate separating the two residences. The subjects appeared to come from [REDACTED]. Officer Wright and I asked them to step through the gate and walk towards us.

At that time, a Hispanic Male adult (S1 Garcia) appeared behind the subjects Officer Wright and I were talking to. S1 Garcia looked to be in his late 30's, heavy set and had a mustache and goatee. S1 Garcia was wearing white boxer style underwear, a dark shirt and was walking with a severe limp.

S1 Garcia began walking, hopping towards the North fence line. Officer Wright and I gave S1 Garcia commands to stop. S1 Garcia turned back towards us and began to comply. Suddenly S1 Garcia moved behind the wall just east of the pedestrian gate. I tried to maintain visual of S1 Garcia, but he entered the residence through the west door, out of my view. Sgt. Corbett gave the command to evacuate all civilians from the front of the residence. The React Team escorted the civilians to awaiting patrol personnel on Sage Ave. Officer Kerr drove the ARV up to the front of the residence to provide cover for the React Team.

Continued:

The React Team entered [REDACTED] to ensure there was nobody left inside the residence. After the residence was clear, Sgt. Corbett established and Emergency Response Team (E.R.T) behind the ARV. Officer Macias, Officer Soria, K9 Officer Larkin and I remained inside [REDACTED] as a secondary Arrest Team. At that time three Hispanic Male adults and one Hispanic Female adult appeared in the east yard of [REDACTED]. The E.R.T gave them commands, and all four subjects were detained without incident. Sgt. Corbett then advised all S.W.A.T personnel that S1 Garcia was inside [REDACTED] armed with a handgun and refusing to surrender.

Sgt. Corbett advised all S.W.A.T personnel to prepare for an armed barricade per our standing operating procedures (S.O.P's).

At approximately 0615 hours, Officer Soria entered [REDACTED]. Officer Soria advised they developed a chemical agent plan for [REDACTED]. Officer Soria advised I would be deploying (2) wooden batons, into the far north window on the west side of [REDACTED]. The (2) wooden baton rounds would be used to break the window. Once the window was broken, Officer Soria would be able to place a hand held chemical agent into the residence without delay. Breaking the window would also limit the amount of time the Team would be exposed during the mission. Officer Soria issued me a Defense Technology, 40 MM multi-purpose launcher #D30935. He also issued me (2) Safariland, Defense Technology 40MM Wood Baton rounds.

At approximately 0636 hours, Officer Soria, Officer Macias and I moved to the north fence line of [REDACTED]. From our position we were approximately 20 yards from [REDACTED]. At 0646 hours, I broadcasted I would be deploying less lethal from our position. I then deployed (1) wood baton round into the far north window at a 45 degree angle. The round went through the window, but the window remained intact. I then deployed a second wood baton round into the same window that caused the window to shatter. Officer Soria, Officer Macias and I then returned to our position inside [REDACTED].

At 0645 hours, Officer Soria advised we would be deploying chemical agents into two separate windows on the west side of the east residence. Officer Park and I were assigned to provide cover for Officer Soria who would be deploying chemical agents into the far north window. At the same time Officer Allison would be deploying chemical agents into the far south window on the west side of the residence. At 0703 hours, we approached the residence from the rear yard of [REDACTED]. At the window Officer Soria and Officer Allison successfully deployed their chemical agents into the residence. After the deployment, we returned to our position inside [REDACTED].

As we returned to the residence we heard Team members broadcast there was a fire on east side of the residence. At this time I was standing in the rear yard of [REDACTED] approximately 30 yards from [REDACTED]. I heard what I believed to be a single gunshot come from inside [REDACTED]. The gunshot came from the north side of the residence. I immediately broadcasted that I heard (1) gunshot come from inside the residence.

Sgt. Corbett contacted the Riverside Fire Department and arranged for members of our team to obtain fire hoses. From my position I observed members of our team attempting to contain the fire to [REDACTED] to prevent other structures from catching fire. Members of our Team continued to contain the fire until they were relieved by members of the Riverside Fire Department. Riverside Fire Department personnel advised due to smoke inhalation risks, members of our team needed to exit [REDACTED].
