Narrative:

1 On 02-20-17, about 2253 hours, Riverside Police officers were involved in an officer involved shooting in
2 the area of [REDACTED] in the City and County of Riverside. The subject fled on foot in a north
3 easterly direction and was believed to be armed. The area surrounding the shooting was contained by
4 patrol officers. While on scene, officers located a blood trail leading from the area of the shooting to a
5 property located at [REDACTED]

8 On 02-20-17, about 2342 hours, a full SWAT call out was initiated. I responded to the aviation hangar
9 located at 7020 Central Ave. and drove the SWAT tactical motorhome to the command post located at
10 Garfield St. and MacArthur Rd. I arrived at approximately 0020 hours on 02-21-17. I put on my tactical
11 gear and was designated the team breacher. At approximately 0120 hours, I was transported by the
12 Armored Rescue Vehicle (A.R.V.) to [REDACTED]. The A.R.V. stopped on the street near the front of
13 the primary residence and we exited the A.R.V. On the property there are two separate residences that are
14 connected by an open carport. The residence on the west side of the property uses [REDACTED] and the
15 residence on the east side of the property uses [REDACTED] (primary location).
16

17 A blood trail was seen leading to the east residence of the property. Based on the close proximity of the
18 west residence to the east residence and the suspect, S/Garcia, having shot at the police, the A.R.V. /
19 Emergency Response Team (E.R.T.) needed to evacuate occupants of the west residence. At
20 approximately 0141 hours, Sgt. Ortiz called the telephone of the occupants inside the west residence.
21 E.R.T. moved up to escort the occupants out of the residence. Officer Monreal and I provided a lethal
22 blocking force on the 1-2 corner of the east property to protect the residents being evacuated in case
23 S/Garcia came out to shoot at the police or residents being evacuated. While the evacuation was taking
24 place, I heard Officer Smith yelling at subjects behind a wrought iron gate north of the carport. He was
25 giving them commands to stop where they were and put their hands up. I did not see the subjects at this
26 time. I heard Officer Smith yell out that one of the subjects behind the wrought iron gate matched the
27 description of S/Garcia. He was with four other subjects. S/Garcia did not follow commands and walked
28 out of view on the 2 side of the residence. Four subjects remained and were given commands to exit from
29 behind the wrought iron gate to the officers. At this time the A.R.V. moved up into the driveway of the
30 property to provide hard cover. I moved from the 1-2 corner and took cover behind the A.R.V. The
31 subjects that remained behind the rod iron gate were given orders to walk out towards the officers. They
32 complied and were being escorted from the property when four additional adults came out the front door
33 on the 1 side with their hands in the air. They were told to stop and wait. When personnel at the A.R.V.
34 were ready to receive them, they complied and were escorted from the property.
35

36 I remained at the A.R.V. and continued to switch out with Officer Wilder as lethal cover on the 2 side of
37 the residence from the driver's door of the A.R.V. Sgt. Corbett told Officer Monreal and me to relieve two
38 containment officers from the backyard of [REDACTED] so they could assist with evacuating a residence
39 on Sage Rd. Once the evacuations were complete, we were relieved by two containment SWAT officers
40 (Officer Reeves and Payne). Officer Monreal and I went back to the A.R.V. to supplement lethal cover on
41 the residence. A while later, Sgt. Corbett called me over to assist with shutting off the water main at the
42 street that provides water to the primary residence. The water valve was seized and could not be shut off.

1 At approximately 0404 hours, Officer Soria and I began a scout of the entire property to put together a
2 plan for a chemical agent deployment. Officer Soria and I wanted S/Garcia to exit the garage on the 1 side
3 of the residence when the chemical agent was deployed. The plan was to insert a chemical agent canister
4 into the second story loft over the garage on the 1 side first, then simultaneously a chemical agent canister
5 in the far bedroom window on the 2-3 corner, a burn safe containing a chemical agent canister in a large
6 window located in the middle of the 2 side and a burn safe containing a chemical agent canister in a large
7 window on the 4 side. During a scout of the inside of the residence using the Avatar robot, Officer
8 Mercadefe observed a large quantity of blood on the bathroom floor on the 3 side of the residence. The
9 shower curtain was drawn and the robot could not see inside the tub. A bedroom door was also seen
10 closed on the 2-3 corner of the residence. Officer Soria and I believed S/Garcia was either in the bathtub
11 of the bathroom or inside the closed bedroom on the 2-3 corner. The "gas plan" was designed to introduce
12 a pre-determined concentration of Chlorobenzalmalononitrile (CS) chemical agent into the residence as a
13 less lethal measure of forcing S/Garcia out of the residence.

14
15 After approximately 5 hours of trying to contact S/Garcia by the P.A. system of the A.R.V., landline
16 phone, cell phone, throw phone, the use of light sound diversionary devices there was no response from
17 S/Garcia. It was determined he was not going to exit the residence.

18
19 Officer Soria and I gathered the equipment and chemical agent that was going to be used. I assembled
20 both burn safes with chemical agent canisters and attached a rope to the handle of each burn safe. Officer
21 Soria and I drove to [REDACTED] to supply Officer Serrato and Ouk their assembled burn safe with
22 rope and two shields, one large and one small. After giving them the equipment needed, I had to provide
23 an access path to allow them to get from the rear yard of [REDACTED] to the large window on the 4
24 side of the primary residence. They were obstructed by a 6 foot wooden fence. I used a crowbar to loosen
25 and remove 5 wooden planks from the fence on the far northeast corner of the primary residence. We
26 advised them of the plan along with Officer Waters and Crocker that would be assisting them. We drove
27 back to the A.R.V. to set up the remaining equipment for the chemical agent deployment. I pre-staged the
28 remaining assembled burn safe and rope in the backyard of the residence on the west. In the backyard
29 there was a barrier with a blue tarp and small fence with chicken wire separating the backyard of the
30 residence on the west from the 2 side of the residence on the east. Officer's Park, Smith and I came up
31 with a plan to safely approach the barrier. Officer Park and Smith provided lethal cover for me while I
32 detached the tarp from the wall and moved the fence far enough away from the wall to allow access to the
33 2 side of the property once the chemical agent operation began.

34
35 At approximately 0646 hours, Officer Smith was tasked with breaking the bedroom window on the 2-3
36 corner with wooden dowels to allow access for a gas canister to be hand deployed into the bedroom.
37 Officer Smith deployed two rounds of wooden dowels successfully breaking the window.

38
39 At approximately 0701 hours, Sgt. Corbett broadcasted over the radio for personnel to stand by for a
40 George Mission (Gas Mission). All personnel donned their gas masks and prepared for the mission. At
41 approximately 0703 hours, Sgt. Corbett gave the command to initiate the mission over the radio. The
42 following is what occurred when the gas plan initiated. G1 (George Team 1) consisted of Sgt. McCoy
43 (hand deploy chemical agent canister), Officer Monreal and Glover (lethal cover) and Officer Newton
44 (shield). G1 moved first and deployed a chemical agent canister through the already broken window of

1 the loft on the 1 side of the residence. G2 (George Team 2) consisted of Officer Allison (hand deploy burn
2 safe), Officer Mercadefe, Macias and Glover (lethal cover) and Officer Degruy (shield). G3 (George
3 Team 3) Officer Soria (hand deploy chemical agent canister), Officer Smith and Park (lethal cover). Both
4 teams entered the two side of the property through the open make shift gate that was previously removed.
5 G2 and G3 split. G2 approached the already broken bedroom window on the 2-3 corner and hand
6 deployed the chemical agent canister into the room. At the same time G3 approached the window in the
7 middle of the residence on the 2 side and hand deployed the burn safe through the window into the room.
8 G4 (George Team 4) consisted of Officer Serrato (hand deploy burn safe), Officer Ouk (shield / lethal
9 cover), Officer Crocker (lethal cover) and Officer Waters (shield). G4 made their way through the opened
10 portion of fence and approached the window on the 4 side of the residence and hand deployed the burn
11 safe through the window into the room. G4 completed their mission simultaneously with G2 and G3. All
12 George missions were a success. At approximately 0707 hours, G4 reported over the radio that a fire had
13 started in the room where the burn safe was deployed. RFD was advised and responded.

14
15 Once the fire had started, Officer Macias, Smith, Degruy and I remained in the backyard of the residence
16 on the west. We maintained lethal cover on the 2 side in case the S/Garcia presented himself. At
17 approximately 0709 hours, I heard a single shot coming from inside the residence. It was unknown if
18 S/Garcia was shooting outside the house at officers. A short time later I heard several more "pops" from
19 inside the residence. The fire began growing and I maintained lethal cover. Sgt. Corbett told me to remove
20 the burn safe from the 2 side of the residence before the fire consumed it. I grabbed the rope and pulled
21 the burn safe from the window and onto the ground approximately 10 feet from the window it was
22 deployed in. Once the burn safe was clear of the residence, I went back to providing lethal cover on the 2
23 side. After approximately an hour of the residence burning it was determined S/Garcia was not coming
24 out.

25
26 The fire was eventually extinguished and detectives from the Robbery / Homicide Unit responded to the
27 residence to take over the investigation. Members of the Forensic Unit took photographs of the scene.
28 After the photographs were taken, I recovered the burn safe and rope that I deployed on the 2 side of the
29 residence. NFI.
