7 **Narrative:**

8 On 02-20-17, at approximately 2342 hours, I responded to the area of MacArthur Road and Garfield
9 Street reference a SWAT callout. Upon my arrival, I was advised that an officer involved shooting had
10 occurred in the area and the suspect from the incident was still outstanding and possibly armed.

12 **Investigative Actions:**

13 I loaded into the department's Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) and responded to the 9300 block of
14 Sage Avenue. Patrol Officers advised that they had followed a blood trail that led to the front of [REDACTED]
15 [REDACTED] [REDACTED] are two separate houses, which share a driveway and are connected by a
16 covered carport. A plan was made to make contact with the residents at [REDACTED] and conduct a safety
17 check at the residence. I assisted in making contact, by holding lethal cover on [REDACTED] While making
18 contact with the residents at [REDACTED] I took a knee underneath the carport and kept watch on a shed
19 located in the south/east corner of the backyard. While covering down on the shed, SWAT Operators
20 advised that a subject matching the suspect's description had exited the rear of [REDACTED] That subject
21 failed to follow commands and fled out of view of the SWAT Operators.

23 After the residents from the [REDACTED] were safely removed, all SWAT Operators moved back to the
24 Armored Rescue Vehicle. The ARV was parked in the driveway, facing the covered car port,
25 approximately twenty five feet away from [REDACTED] I assisted in being part of the Emergency Response
26 Team (ERT). I took a position at the back of the ARV (passenger side) and held lethal cover on [REDACTED]
27 [REDACTED] While holding cover on the residence, approximately for subjects exited from the garage. I
28 continued to hold lethal cover on the residence while the subjects were safely detained. I later took a
29 position in the backyard of [REDACTED] and covered down on the #1 side of [REDACTED] I held a position
30 there while SWAT Operators safely removed the residents. Once all the residents were removed, I was
31 relieved by Officers Payne and Reeves. I took a position back at the ARV.

33 At approximately 0530 hours, I was tasked by Sgt. Corbett with developing a mission to deploy the
34 department throw phone into [REDACTED] The phone would be deployed into the second story living
35 quarters above the garage. Numerous announcements had been made over the ARV PA, for the suspect
36 to exit the residence, however no movement was seen. Attempts to contact the suspect via his cell phone
37 were met with negative results. Due to the fact that the suspect was possibly injured, believed to be
38 armed, and there was no line of communication, it was decided that a throw phone would be deployed.
39 The throw phone could be utilized as another means of communication with the suspect, to bring a
40 peaceful resolution to the situation.

41
42 At approximately 0547 hours, I took a six man team to the #1 side of the residence. The six man team
43 consisted of the following Operators: Monreal/Newton (lethal cover), Wright/Park (shield holders),
44 Wilder (throw phone) and Sgt. McCoy (rope manager). The team approached the #1 side of the residence
45 (garage) and successfully deployed the department throw phone into the second story window (window

1 A). The team then moved back to the ARV. Once at the ARV, Emergency Negotiator Flores advised that
2 the throw phone was ringing and operational in the room it had been deployed into.

3
4 For the next several hours, I assisted in holding lethal cover on [REDACTED] while utilizing the ARV for
5 cover. I rotated from the following positions: turret, rear passenger and driver side. At approximately
6 0701 hours, Sgt. Corbett advised all SWAT Operators to prepare for a "George" mission. I put on my
7 chemical agent mask and was advised that I would assist in the operation. I held lethal cover on the #1
8 side while operators deployed chemical agents into the #1 side, second story, window "A". Sometime
9 after the chemical agents were deployed, gas team four advised that the residence had caught fire. Officer
10 Wright and I ran from the ARV to the corner of Sage & MacArthur. There we met with RFD and took
11 hold of the Metro Pack and 2" hose line. I carried the hose line from the fire engine to the rear of the
12 ARV.

14 I assembled the main hose line with the Metro Pack and requested RFD pressurize the line. I then
15 assisted Officer Wright with attempting to put the fire out with water and prevent additional structures
16 from catching fire. Officer Wright and I rotated positions on the hose line and nozzle. We focused on
17 aiming water at the #1 side of the residence as well as the roof. We continued to man the fire hose until
18 being relieved by RFD personnel. I later took a position behind RFD personnel and held lethal cover on
19 the residence while they attempted to contain the fire. I assisted SWAT and RFD personnel visually clear
20 the residence from the outside. We walked around the outside of the residence (at a safe distance due to
21 the heat from the fire) and visually looked inside.

23 I conducted scene security while RFD personnel continued to contain the fire. I later was ordered by
24 Sgt. Corbett to clear the incident. NFI.
