On 02-20-17, at approximately 2340 hours, I was notified via cell phone regarding a SWAT call out. An Officer involved shooting occurred in the area of MacArthur and Garfield with the suspect still outstanding. The suspect had shot at the Officer's who attempted to contact him with the Officer's returning fire. The suspect fled the scene and was possibly injured by a gun shot wound. The suspect left a blood trail eastbound Sage from MacArthur. I arrived on scene at approximately 0015 hours and parked my vehicle on Castleman south of Garfield. I met with Sergeant Corbett who was already on scene at the corner of MacArthur and Garfield. The suspect was not identified at the time, however, he was a heavy set Hispanic with possible facial hair. As SWAT personnel arrived on scene, Sergeant Corbett gave a brief of the incident. The suspect blood trail led to [Redacted] and we believed he was still in the immediate area.

I was assigned to the arrest team and I rode in the back of the Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV) to the dead end of eastbound sage from MacArthur. I exited the ARV with SWAT personnel and roles and responsibilities were established. I was assigned as less lethal and carried the 40mm less lethal. We moved down the driveway at [REDACTED]. A plan was developed to contact the occupants of [REDACTED] and have them exit the residence.

After some of the occupants exited [REDACTED] and were escorted out to the street away from the area, several subjects were seen in the rear yard of [REDACTED] approximately 40-50 feet away from us. Officer D. Smith and I gave the subjects verbal commands using the vehicle as cover which was parked in the carport between [REDACTED]. The subjects complied and began walking toward us, however, one of the subjects, a heavy set Hispanic male wearing a black shirt, walked eastbound behind [REDACTED] out of our sight. We believed he was the suspect in the Officer involved shooting. We moved back to the ARV which was parked in the driveway shared by [REDACTED]. Roles and responsibilities were established if the subject were to exit the residence. I was still assigned with less lethal and had the 40mm multi purpose launcher. Commands were given to the subjects seen in the rear yard, which they complied with and walked south down the driveway toward our arrest team. The subjects were taken away from the incident and debriefed by assisting Officer's. Information was gathered from the debrief. The suspect was inside armed with a handgun.

I continued my role as the designated less lethal Officer on the Arrest Team. Commands were given for several hours from the PA of the ARV. On the one side (south side) of the residence, a security light was mounted just below the number one window (top window). The light contained two large bulbs and illuminated the driveway. The light would turn off and on for several minutes at a time. There was also a security camera mounted just below the eave on the 1/4 corner of the residence. The security camera appeared to be pointed towards the driveway. Due to the security light illuminating us and our position, the decision was made to deploy a 40 mm multi purpose launcher sponge round to disable the security light. I deployed three less lethal sponge rounds at the security light, from the rear of the ARV. I was approximately 25 feet away from the security light. The less lethal sponge rounds did not disable the security light. The less lethal sponge rounds did not disable security light so I switched to a wood baton less lethal round. Fearing the suspect could be watching our movement from a TV monitor inside the residence, I deployed two wood baton rounds from the 40 mm multi purpose launcher at the security camera. I deployed the wood baton rounds from the rear of the ARV from approximately 25 feet away. The security camera was struck by both wood baton rounds, however, was not disabled.

From the ARV, I rotated positions for the next several hours, being lethal cover from the rear passenger side of the ARV and lethal cover from the turret. I also rotated with operating the Avatar III Robot in the garage on the three side of the residence and positioned it near a staircase. Next to the staircase was a door which led to an outside corridor. I monitored the door and portion of the garage by watching the monitor attached to Avatar's controller. Officer Mercadefe was able to operate an Avatar Robot to a bathroom, where he saw blood stains and the shower curtain was drawn, however, the Avatar did not have the capability to clear the bathtub.

Throw phone mission was being planned, which called for the throw phone being deployed through the number one side top window. From the rear passenger side of the ARV, I deployed one wood baton round from a 40 mm multi purpose launcher at the upper right portion of the number one window. The round was effective and shattered the glass on the right side of the window.

I deployed another wood baton round using the 40 mm multi purpose launcher at the left upper portion of the number one window. The deployment was effective and shattered the glass on the left side. I assisted with the throw phone mission and I was assigned with holding a ballistic shield as we approached the one side of the residence. When we got close to the window, I took a few steps to the west, making way for the operator deploying the throw phone. Once the phone was deployed, we moved as a team and walked back to the ARV.

I continued to rotate positions as long cover from the turret and left rear passenger side of the ARV for the next several hours. A chemical agent plan was developed and I put on my gas mask. Sometime after the gas was deployed, gas team four advised the residence had caught on fire. Officer Monreal and I ran from the ARV to the corner of Sage and MacArthur to meet with RFD. When RFD arrived, I carried a Metro Pack from the fire engine to the ARV. Once the line was pressurized with water, I opened the line up and attempted to put the fire out with water and kept the fire from spreading to other structures. Monreal and I rotated positions focusing on aiming the water at the number one side of the residence as well as the roof. We operated the fire hose until RFD relieved us. It was determined the suspect was deceased in the bathroom, laying in the bathtub, on the three side of the residence.

Once the scene was rendered safe, I stayed with the ARV to the front of the residence. When evidence technician's arrived, I walked the scene and attempted to locate deployed munitions. After, I was instructed by Sgt. Corbett to clear the scene.
