1 On 02-21-17, at approximately 2340 hours, I was contacted via cell phone regarding a
2 SWAT call out. An Officer involved shooting occurred in the area of MacArthur and
3 Garfield with the suspect still outstanding. The suspect shot at the Officers as they
4 attempted to contact him, and they returned fire. The suspect fled the scene and was
5 possibly injured by a gunshot wound. The suspect left a blood trail eastbound Sage
6 from MacArthur.

7
8 I arrived on scene at approximately 0010 hours. I then met with Sgt. Corbett who was
9 on scene. Sgt. Corbett gave a brief of the incident to the personnel on scene, and
10 advised us the suspect, who was not identified at the time, was a heavy set Hispanic
11 male with possible facial hair. Sgt. Corbett also stated the blood trail led to [REDACTED]

12
13 As a member of the SWAT team, I was then assigned to the search team utilizing the
14 Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV). The designated search team was compromised of Sgt.
15 Corbett, Officer D. Smith, Officer Monreal, Officer S. Macias, Officer Wright, Officer
16 Allison, Officer Mercadefe, Officer Glover, K-9 Officer Larkin and I.

17
18 The objective for the search team was to conduct a yard to yard search beginning at
19 [REDACTED] to locate and apprehend the outstanding suspect. Due to the fact we
20 were conducting the operation at night in a dark environment, I was assigned to use
21 the Night Vision Goggles (NVG) to clear any areas to dark to visually clear without using
22 flash lights to compromise our position.

23
24 We first moved up to [REDACTED] to evacuate the residence. [REDACTED] is located
25 directly west of [REDACTED]. The occupants of [REDACTED] were safely evacuated from
26 the property, and moved to a safe location where patrol officers were staged.

27
28 I then transitioned to primary residence of [REDACTED]. I was staged on the east side of
29 the residence with Officer Smith. While waiting to move up to the door way to contact
30 the occupants of the residence, several subjects walked out to the rear yard of [REDACTED]
31 [REDACTED]. One of the subjects that walked into the backyard fit the description of the
32 suspect in the shooting. The subject was a heavy set Hispanic male adult, wearing a
33 dark shirt, white boxers, with a goatee and was walking with a severe limp. Officer
34 Smith and Wright gave the subject several commands to put his hands up and walk
35 towards us. The subject ignored the commands and walked back towards the
36 residence, at which point I did not see him again. At this point the ARV was summoned
37 to the driveway to provide cover for officers. Sgt. Corbett then gave the command to
38 immediate evacuate all civilians. All subjects were evacuated except for the subject
39 who fit the description of our suspect. His whereabouts were unknown, but it appeared
40 he went back into the residence.

41
42 A React Team was immediately set up at the ARV. I was then assigned to conduct a
43 safety sweep of [REDACTED] to ensure there was nobody left inside the residence. Sgt.

1 Corbett, Officer Macias, Officer Smith and I, conducted a safety sweep of the
2 residence and did not locate anyone else inside the residence. After the residence
3 was cleared, Sgt. Corbett established an Emergency Response Team (E.R.T.) behind the
4 ARV. Officer Macias, K9 Officer Larkin, Officer Smith and I remained at [REDACTED] as a
5 secondary arrest team. Sgt. Corbett then advised all SWAT personnel that S1/Garcia
6 was inside the residence armed with a handgun and refusing to surrender.

7
8 Sgt. Corbett advised all SWAT personnel to prepare for an armed barricade per our
9 S.O.P's.

10
11 At approximately 0330 hours, Sgt. Corbett, Officer Wilder and I, conducted a water shut
12 off mission. The water was located near the east side of the driveway. I attempted to
13 turn off the water several times, and was unsuccessful in turning off the water. The
14 water valve was stuck and I was unable to turn it off.

15
16 At approximately 0404 hours, Officer Allison and I conducted a scout of the residence,
17 to obtain a layout of the residence and property, and to identify the best approach for
18 deploying chemical agents (Gas). After conducting a scout of the residence, Officer
19 Allison and I determined it would be best to drive S1/Garcia out of the residence
20 through the garage located on the one side of the residence.

21
22 The course of action for the gas plan was to introduce CS gas
23 (Orthochlorobenzalmalonitrile) to the second story loft above the garage to drive
24 S1/Garcia away from the loft and/or deny him access into the loft. A Flameless Tri-
25 chamber CS canister would be deployed into the loft. After gas was introduced into
26 the loft, additional gas would be introduced simultaneous into the residence through
27 the two and four sides of the residence. A burn safe containing a CS Spede Heat
28 would be deployed into the number three window of the two side of the residence.
29 Based on the layout of the residence (drawn by the resident), the window appeared to
30 lead into a living room or kitchen. A second Flameless Tri-chamber CS canister would
31 be deployed on the number 1 window of the two side of the residence. Based on the
32 layout of the residence, this window appeared to lead into a bedroom the Avatar
33 Robot was unable to clear due to the door being closed. Lastly, a second burn safe
34 containing a CS Spede Heat would be deployed through the patio room window
35 located on the four side of the residence.

36
37 We believed the suspect was either inside a bathroom on the three side of the
38 residence that was covered with blood on the floor, as seen by the Avatar Robot that
39 was deployed inside the house, or in a bedroom with a closed door located on the 2-3
40 corner. The "gas plan" was designed to introduce a pre-determined concentration of
41 CS chemical agent into the residence as a less lethal measure of forcing S/Garcia out
42 of the residence through the garage.

1 After approximately 5 hours of trying to contact S/Garcia through the ARV's P.A. system,
2 landline phone, cell phone, throw phone, and through the use of light and sound
3 diversionary devices , there was no response from S/Garcia. It was determined at this
4 point that S/Garcia was not going to exit the residence. The gas plan was approved by
5 Sgt. Corbett and the use of chemical agent was authorized by Lieutenant Blomdahl.

6
7 Officer Allison and I gathered the equipment and chemical agent that was going to be
8 used. Officer Allison assembled both burn safes with chemical agent canisters and
9 attached a rope to the handle of each burn safe. Officer Allison and I drove to [REDACTED]
10 [REDACTED] to supply Officer Serrato and Ouk their assembled burn safe with rope and
11 two shields, one large and one small. After giving them the equipment needed, Officer
12 Allison provided an access path to allow them to get from the rear yard of [REDACTED]
13 [REDACTED] to the patio room window on the 4 side of the primary residence. They
14 were obstructed by a 6 foot wooden fence. Officer Allison used a crowbar to loosen
15 and remove 5 wooden planks from the fence on the far northeast corner of the primary
16 residence. Officer Allison and I advised them of the plan along with Officer Waters and
17 Crocker that would be assisting them. Officer Allison and I drove back to the A.R.V. to
18 set up the remaining equipment for the chemical agent deployment. Officer Allison
19 pre-staged the remaining assembled burn safe and rope in the backyard of the west
20 residence.

21
22 At approximately 0646 hours, Officer Smith was tasked with breaking the bedroom
23 window on the 2-3 corner with wooden dowels to allow access for a gas canister to be
24 hand deployed into the bedroom. Officer Smith deployed two rounds of wooden
25 dowels successfully breaking the window.

26
27 At approximately 0701 hours, Sgt. Corbett broadcasted over the radio for personnel to
28 stand by for a George Mission (Gas Mission). All personnel donned their gas masks and
29 prepared for the mission. At approximately 0703 hours, Sgt. Corbett gave the command
30 to initiate the mission over the radio. The following is what occurred when the gas plan
31 initiated:

32
33 G1 (George Team 1) consisted of Sgt. McCoy (hand deploy chemical agent canister),
34 Officer Monreal and Glover (lethal cover) and Officer Newton (shield). G1 moved first
35 and deployed a chemical agent canister through the already broken window of the
36 loft on the 1 side of the residence. G2 (George Team 2) consisted of Officer Allison
37 (hand deploy burn safe), Officer Mercadefe, Macias and Glover (lethal cover) and
38 Officer Degruy (shield). G3 (George Team 3) consisted Officer Smith, Park (lethal cover)
39 and I, (I deployed the burn safe). Both teams entered the two side of the property
40 through the open make shift gate that was previously removed. G2 and G3 split. G3
41 approached the already broken bedroom window on the 2-3 corner and hand
42 deployed the chemical agent canister into the room. At the same time G2
43 approached the window in the middle of the residence on the 2 side and hand

1 deployed the burn safe through the window into the room. G4 (George Team 4)
2 consisted of Officer Serrato (hand deploy burn safe), Officer Ouk (shield / lethal cover),
3 Officer Crocker (lethal cover) and Officer Waters (shield). G4 made their way through
4 the opened portion of fence and approached the window on the 4 side of the
5 residence and hand deployed the burn safe through the patio room window. G4
6 completed their mission simultaneously with G2 and G3. All George missions were a
7 success. At approximately 0707 hours, G4 reported over the radio that a fire had started
8 in the room where the burn safe was deployed. RFD was advised and responded.
9
10 At approximately 0716 hours, I was assigned to the north side of the residence to assist
11 SWAT personnel in applying water on the residence. Minutes later, RFD arrived on
12 scene and took over fire-fighting efforts while SWAT personnel and I provided force
13 protection.
14
15 The fire was eventually extinguished and detectives from the Robbery / Homicide Unit
16 responded to the residence to take over the investigation. Members of the Forensic
17 Unit took photographs of the scene. After photographs were taken, Officer Allison
18 recovered the burn safe and rope that was deployed on the 2 side of the residence.
