Supplemental:

On Tuesday, February 21, 2017, I was at home when I received a phone call from the City of Riverside Police Department, reference a SWAT call-out. Almost simultaneously, I received text messages from members of the SWAT team reference the call-out which gave information as to the circumstances and where the team will meet. I got dressed and retrieved my patrol unit from Lincoln, prior to meeting with other members of the SWAT team at Garfield/MacArthur, where we were briefed with additional information/updates regarding the incident.

From there, I was directed to partner up with Ofc. Degruy, Ofc. Elliott and Ofc. Wilder in one of the METRO vehicles, and we followed the ARV (Armored Rescue Vehicle) as it made its way to the 9300 block of Sage Ave. Moments later, I was instructed to walk along the side the passenger side of the ARV as it drove the driveway entrance of [REDACTED]. I was assigned to keep eyes on/cover the common/shared wall of [REDACTED] while other team members extracted subjects from the western most residence/building of [REDACTED]. While this took place, team members advised they observed the suspect at the rear of the eastern most residence/building of Sage, and I walked along passenger side of the ARV as it drove up the driveway, towards the residence. The suspect went back into the eastern most residence and I was instructed to stand by at the rear of the ARV, as team members called subjects out of the eastern most residence. As subjects made their way to the rear of the ARV, I conducted safety pat downs on them before escorting them to patrol officers who were standing by at [REDACTED]. I returned to the ARV and escorted two more subjects to [REDACTED] after pat downs.

I then made contact with the Tactical Medics at Sage/MacArthur, and escorted them to the ARV. I stood by at the rear of the ARV momentarily before relieving Ofc. Wilder who had been holding a position on the driver side of the ARV with his long gun. He was covering two west facing windows and a portion of the backyard of the eastern most residence/building. I held this position for approximately 30 minutes before Ofc. Wilder relieved me and held the position for approximately 30 minutes. During this time, I stood by on the driver side of the ARV behind Ofc. Wilder, before relieving him. After approximately 30 minutes, Ofc. Kerr relieved me and I took over his position in the driver seat of the ARV. After approximately 30 minutes, Ofc. Kerr and I switched positions, and I held my position on the driver side door of the ARV for approximately 30 minutes before being relieved by Ofc. Wilder. I was then instructed to standby at the rear of the ARV while plans were made to deploy the throw-phone. After a few moments, I took a position as a cover officer and assisted officers as they approached the east residence of [REDACTED] and deployed the throw-phone.

After the deployment of the throw-phone, I stood by at the rear of the ARV for approximately 15 minutes before relieving Ofc. Wilder. He had taken a position at the rear of the ARV on the driver side with his long gun, and covered the two west facing windows and a portion of the backyard of the east residence of [REDACTED]. After approximately 1 hour, I was advised to put on my gas mask and stand by at the rear of the ARV while plans were made to deploy gas. I was assigned to hold the shield as officers approached the east residence of [REDACTED] and deployed gas. I returned to the ARV and stood by as other team members deployed gas into a different area of the same building. After gas deployments were made, I heard one of the team members advise

over the radio that a fire had started inside the residence. RFD had already been advised to stage and was now being requested to assist. RFD arrived on scene some short time after and supplied team members with water hoses. While team members began to fight the fire with the water hoses, I stood next to them with my long gun for cover. We moved away from the ARV and closer to residence and continued to fight the fire for approximately 1 hour until RFD suited up in ballistic gear and took over the hoses.

I was relieved from my position and assisted with taking the robots back to the equipment truck. I returned to the ARV which was now on the street, in front of [REDACTED] I stood by with other team members and awaited further instruction. RFD continued to fight the fire and after some time, the residence burned down until the fire was out. I stood by at the ARV while a few team members went to check for the suspect inside the residence. We were ultimately debriefed and cleared from the scene. NFI.
