**SUMMARY:**

This Supplemental Report covers my initial response to the command post and the interview with

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**BACKGROUND & SOURCE:**

I am a Detective with the Riverside Police Department assigned to the Centralized Investigations Bureau Persons Unit (Robbery/Homicide). On 02-20-17 at 2330 hours, I received a call requesting that I respond to the command post in the area of Garfield St. and MacArthur Rd., in the City and County of Riverside, to assist with the investigation of an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS). I arrived at the command post on 02-21-17 at 0030 hours.

Partner Detective Simons and I were assigned to interview [REDACTED] who had been detained at the crime scene. They were transported to the Magnolia Police Station for questioning. I arrived at the station at 0125 hours. Detective Simons and I interviewed [REDACTED] first then [REDACTED] (see Detective Simons' supplemental report for a summary of [REDACTED] interview). Both interviews were conducted in interview room #1, and were audio and video recorded.

**INVESTIGATION:**

**Interview with [REDACTED]**

The interview started at approximately 0150 hours. I told [REDACTED] that she was not under arrest, did not have to answer any of our questions, and she didn't have to talk to us if she didn't want to. She said she really didn't know anything but she continued to talk to us and answer our questions. She said she did know [REDACTED] and she had been outside talking to him. She had just got home from being out drinking. She was talking to him when she saw the cops. She told the cops that she lived across the street and she laid down in the middle of the street (when the shooting started). She said other than that, she didn't know what happened. She saw the guy running, but that was it. She said she was pretty wasted.

She said earlier that night she had been out drinking with her friend [REDACTED] I asked her where they were drinking and she said they were just out and about. [REDACTED] sent her a text that he was out in front of her house, so she went back home. She said [REDACTED] dropped her off at her house and then left. [REDACTED] had told her earlier that he was going to stop by and she told him to text her when

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1 he arrived. She said only the driver was with [REDACTED] but she didn't know his name or who he was.  
2 She had seen the driver before but never talked to him.  
3

4 She said it was just the three of them to the front of her house. [REDACTED] was going to hang out at  
5 her house. She was standing on the passenger side of the car (talking to [REDACTED]). That's when she  
6 saw the cops and the "guy" ran. She heard the shots and backed up and laid down on the ground.  
7 She said the car she was standing next to was parked across the street from her house facing  
8 towards California Ave. (Northbound). She was standing on the passenger side of the car and  
9 [REDACTED] was about to exit the vehicle when the cops pulled up.  
10

11 The cops approached them and told them to put their hands up. The other guy took off running.  
12 The three of them just stayed there. She said the other guy was standing in the street outside the  
13 car. I asked her if he was talking to anyone and she said she didn't know. She was wasted and  
14 just trying to go home. I asked her if she knew who the guy was, and she said she didn't know  
15 who he was. I told her I understood if she was reluctant to talk to us but I explained to her that all  
16 indications was that he was hurt and that we needed to know who he was so we could locate him  
17 because he may need medical attention. She repeated that she didn't know who the guy was.  
18

19 She said she was trying to go inside her house when she saw the cops coming around the  
20 corner. She had a 40oz beer bottle with her. She set it down and laid down because she didn't  
21 want to get shot. She said the guy was already standing by the car when the police arrived. She  
22 said when the cops told him to stop he took off running and that was all she could remember  
23 seeing. She said he wasn't in the car (with [REDACTED] and the unknown driver) when it showed up. She  
24 didn't see where he came from and stated that he wasn't with her.  
25

26 She said the cops showed up within five minutes of her walking out to the car to talk to [REDACTED]  
27 The guy in the street was already there when she walked out to the car. She again said she didn't  
28 know who he was. I asked her if she knew his nickname or moniker and she said no, and that she  
29 didn't really hang out with too many people like that. I reiterated to her that she wasn't in trouble

1 and that I just wanted her to be honest with us. She said she really didn't know anything and that  
2 she had been drinking all day.

3  
4 I asked her if she could describe him and she said she was just talking to [REDACTED] I asked her  
5 what the guy was doing in the street while she was talking to [REDACTED] and she said she didn't know,  
6 she wasn't paying attention to him. She was trying to get [REDACTED] to go back in the house. She  
7 assumed the guy in the street was talking to the driver. The cops pulled up and told them to put  
8 their hands up. She told the cops that she just lived across the street. That's when the other guy  
9 took off running. They all just stayed there. The police started shooting so she laid down to avoid  
10 getting shot.

11  
12 I asked her to describe what she saw and heard during the shooting. She said the guy ran  
13 towards California Ave. I asked how long after he started running did she hear the shots. She  
14 said it was instantaneous, and then said she didn't know. I asked her if the cops chased after him  
15 and then shot, or if they shot from where they were standing. She said she didn't know and it all  
16 happened so fast. She was lying down because she didn't want to get shot. When she heard the  
17 shots she laid down in the middle of the street.

18  
19 I asked her if she saw the officers shoot. She said she wasn't really paying attention. She  
20 heard the gunshots and got down on the floor, so she couldn't tell me who was shooting. I asked  
21 her how many shots she heard. She said it was a lot. I tried to ask her if the shots were  
22 continuous or if there were any breaks and she said she really couldn't remember. She's never  
23 been involved with anything like this before and her first instinct was to get down on the ground.

24  
25 We tried to clarify parts of her statement. She said the whole thing happened shortly after she  
26 got home. She got home, dropped of her purse, and then went right back outside to talk to [REDACTED]  
27 [REDACTED] was already there across the street. [REDACTED] dropped her off and left to go home. When she  
28 got home her brother [REDACTED] and cousin [REDACTED] were in the house. [REDACTED] was in  
29 this room and [REDACTED] was in the living room. When she pulled up to the house with [REDACTED] she didn't  
30 pay attention to see if the guy was already standing by the car [REDACTED] was in.

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1 She initially didn't know the car was associated with [REDACTED] but when she walked out of her house  
2 she saw [REDACTED] was in it. She first saw the guy when she walked across the street to talk to [REDACTED]  
3 The guy was standing in the street. We asked if she recognized the guy and she said she didn't  
4 know who he was. We confronted her about walking up to the car at 11:30 at night and not  
5 knowing who or why the guy was standing in the street next to the car that her friend was in. She  
6 continued to say that she didn't know the guy personally or why he was there. We again asked her  
7 who the guy was and she said she didn't know. We reminded her that she didn't do anything  
8 wrong and asked her why she would risk getting into trouble by not being truthful with us. She  
9 continued to repeatedly deny knowing the guy. I asked her if she knew who he was would she tell  
10 us, and she said she would have to.

11  
12 We asked her how she knew it was the cops that pulled up. She said because she saw the  
13 black and white car and told [REDACTED] that the cops were coming. She said the cops pulled up along  
14 the side of them. The guy was standing between the two cars. We drew a diagram to figure out  
15 where the vehicles and the people involved were located. She indicated that the police car came  
16 from the opposite direction (turned left onto MacArthur Rd. from Hawthorne Ave.) and stopped  
17 almost along the side of the car [REDACTED] was in. She couldn't tell us exactly where the police car  
18 stopped or which direction the guy ran.

19  
20 We asked her to at least describe the guy for us. She said he was Hispanic (based on his  
21 complexion). She really didn't pay attention to him to get his height or clothing. She didn't notice  
22 any tattoos. She didn't know what the guy was doing or if he was talking to the driver. We  
23 confronted her about being in such close proximity to the driver and the guy in the street to not  
24 know what the guy was doing or saying. She continued to say she didn't know because she  
25 wasn't paying attention. She said she told us everything she knew and she was done.

26  
27 She said she didn't see the shooting; she only heard it. The cops pulled up and told them to put  
28 their hands up and the guy took off running. The officers were wearing their normal uniforms.  
29 When she heard the shots she got down. She didn't know who was shooting, if it was the guy or  
30 the officers. She couldn't tell if there were different guns being fired or which directions the shots

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- 1 were being fired from. She said she honestly couldn't tell us. She ended the interview stating it
- 2 was possible she had seen the guy before in the neighborhood but she didn't recognize him.
