

Notification:

On February 20, 2017 at approximately 2315 hours, I was contacted at home by Sergeant Troy Banks. He asked me to respond to a command post that was being set up at the intersection of Mac Arthur Road and Garfield Avenue to assist on an officer involved shooting incident that just occurred. I arrived on scene just after midnight on February 21, 2017. Assisting detectives from the Robbery/Homicide Unit assembled and we were all given an incident briefing by Lieutenant D. Hoxmeier, Sergeant S. Goodson, and Sergeant W. McCoy. During that briefing Sergeant McCoy made me aware that while they were following a blood trail searching for the suspect, they saw a pair of dark colored men's shorts with blood on them in the rear yard of [REDACTED]. After the briefing Detective J. Brandt and I were assigned to handle the crime scene investigations on Mac Arthur Road and Hawthorne Avenue. We were assisted by Crime Scene Technicians Selena McKay-Davis and Susan Lane.

Crime Scenes:

There were three individual crime scenes identified within the same residential neighborhood related to this incident. The first location was where the OIS occurred to the front of 4041 Mac Arthur Road. The second location was in the rear yard of [REDACTED] where the suspect left a blood trail. The third crime scene location was at [REDACTED] where the suspect was ultimately located inside the residence. Detective Brandt and I investigated the crime scenes on Mac Arthur Road and Hawthorn Avenue. Detective A. Tillett investigated the scene at [REDACTED]. Refer to Detective Tillett's supplemental police report for documentation on the Sage Avenue crime scene.

4041 Mac Arthur Road

is a single story residential duplex located on the east side of Mac Arthur Rd. in the city and county of Riverside. It's situated in the middle of a residential neighborhood with homes on both the east and

west sides of the street. Mac Arthur Road intersects with Hawthorn Avenue to the north and Garfield Avenue to the south. The incident began in the street and driveway area directly south of residence bearing the address numbers [REDACTED] and just north of address numbers 4041 Mac Arthur Road.

Immediately after the shooting there is evidence that suspect Marcelino Garcia fled on foot. A blood trail confirmed that he ran eastbound up the driveway at [REDACTED] and into the fenced rear yard of that location. Garcia then ran north through the rear patio and back west through the side yard of the same residence.

The visible blood trail confirmed that the Garcia then jumped a chain link fence from the side yard of [REDACTED] and into the rear yard of the neighboring residential property at [REDACTED]. I followed the blood trail north from the rear yard of [REDACTED] out onto the sidewalk to the front of the residence and street. It should be noted that I did not locate the bloody shorts I was advised about at the briefing.

The blood trail then went east on the sidewalk and onto the driveway of [REDACTED]. From there the trail lead me north into the middle of the street on Hawthorn Avenue. The blood trail in the street continued to move north onto Mac Arthur Road and then east onto Sage Avenue. The bloody shoe prints lead to the residence bearing the address of [REDACTED].

Observations, Scene Processing, and Evidence Collection:

We began processing the crime scene at approximately 0130 hours. Mac Arthur Road is a residential neighborhood with homes and duplexes on the east and west side of the street. On this night the streets were dry. It was dark but visibility was clear. The only lighting was provided by city street lights and a few residential porch lights that were left on. Evidence Tech Selena McKay Davis began processing both crime scenes by videotaping and photographing on Mac Arthur Road and on Hawthorn Avenue. (Refer to crime scene photos.) Detective Brandt and I walked the crime scenes and I noted the following:

Walking northbound on Mac Arthur Road I noted Patrol Unit #3545 was parked facing south. It was parked in the middle of the street with the driver side door opened. Parked on the curb just east of the patrol car was a [REDACTED] bearing license plate number [REDACTED]. The vehicle was not occupied at this time and the rear [REDACTED] was opened. The patrol unit was parked approximately slightly south of the [REDACTED]. There was a distance of approximately 10' between both vehicles.

I noted a 40 oz. beer bottle on the east parkway (grass) just south of where the [REDACTED] was parked. I noted several expended shell casings in the street by the [REDACTED] and also in the parkway where the beer bottle was lying. I then noted a blood trail leading east up the driveway of [REDACTED]. I followed the trail up the driveway and observed some more blood on the cement driveway. I saw a dark colored BB-cap and a cell phone in a small hidden dirt planter area to the south just off the driveway near some bushes.

The blood trail continued east up the driveway and into the rear yard of [REDACTED]. Immediately inside of the gate leading into the rear yard on the cement patio there was a Dallas Cowboy lanyard with a set of car keys. There was blood on the keys and on the lanyard. The blood trail continued around the north side of the residence and into the side yard. Bloody shoeprints continued over the north fence and into the joining rear yard at [REDACTED]. I followed the blood trail north through that yard and back out onto the main east/west sidewalk to the front of [REDACTED]. The bloody shoeprints continued north on Mac Arthur and then east onto Sage Avenue where they ultimately ended at [REDACTED] where suspect Garcia would later be found inside the residence.

I returned to 4041 Mac Arthur to walk the rest of the area for evidence. I noted several expended shell casings in the street along the west curb line north of the involved patrol vehicle. There were additional expended shell casings in the grassy parkway on the west side of Mac Arthur Road across the street from address 4041.

In addition to the expended shell casings we noted one empty 45 caliber handgun magazine on the east side of the street near [REDACTED]. There were (2) live 45 caliber rounds lying near the empty magazine. We also located (2) 40 caliber Glock handgun magazines along with several expended 40 caliber casings in the grass parkway to the front of [REDACTED]. A Streamlight flashlight was lying in the street in the same area. I then observed a second 40 oz. beer bottle sitting on the front passenger side fender of a gold colored Saturn bearing license plate number [REDACTED]. This car was parked in the driveway of [REDACTED].

Strike Marks:

Several investigators and I searched the residences, streets, cars, and the entire area for strike marks possibly caused by gunshots. We found several impact marks to a wrought iron fence to the front of 4041 Mac Arthur Road and to a blue trash can to the front of the same address. We also found one strike mark on each of the two security screen doors at [REDACTED]. Several bullet fragments and copper jacketing were located on the driveway, surrounding grass areas, and in the street. We did not locate any strike marks that penetrated the inside of any vehicles, residences, or occupied structures in the area.

Suspicious Female (Suspect's cousin):

Immediately after the shooting in question occurred, first responding officers detained [REDACTED] standing on Mac Arthur Road where the shooting occurred. She was identified as being S1 Garcia's cousin. [REDACTED] was transported to the Magnolia Street Police Station so Detectives could interview her as being an eye witness or possibly being involved.

After she was interviewed [REDACTED] was released from the police station and transported back to her residence at [REDACTED] residence is within the crime scene. I was still processing

the scene when she arrived and I watched her walk inside her home. S1 Garcia's gold Saturn bearing license number [REDACTED] was still parked in her driveway and the 40 oz. beer bottle marked for evidence collection was still on the hood of the car.

Assisting scene personnel and I continued to identify and mark additional evidence throughout the large crime scene. Detective Jim Brandt walked over to me and advised me that the beer bottle that was on top of Garcia's Saturn was now gone. Detective Brandt and I knocked on [REDACTED] door at [REDACTED]. An unknown H/F opened the door. I immediately saw the beer bottle in question sitting in plain view on a coffee table in the living room. I asked the female who went out to the car and removed the beer bottle. She raised both of her hands and shrugged her shoulders. I asked her if she was trying to get arrested for tampering with evidence. She said she had nothing to do with it and she pointed to the rear of the house.

At that moment [REDACTED] walked from a back hallway over to us at the front door. I asked why she took the bottle off of Garcia's car. She shrugged her shoulders, appeared nervous, and didn't respond to my question. [REDACTED] then invited me inside the house to collect the beer bottle from the table which is what I did. Detective Brandt and I left the residence without further incident.

Evidence Collection Summary:

We marked over 75 evidence items for collection throughout the crime scene. All of the items were subsequently documented and collected by Selena McKay Davis and Susan Lane with assistance from myself, Detective J. Brandt, and Detective J. Simons. The items listed below are only a summary of the items that were collected. For the itemized list of evidence items and the exact locations they were recovered from refer to the evidence logs and the supplemental report by Selena McKay Davis and Susan Lane.
