On 07-20-18, at approximately 1946 hours I monitored a radio call from Dispatch requesting the Police Helicopter, Air1, to assist Riverside Sheriff's Department with a pursuit. Dispatch advised the pursuit was headed north on the 215 freeway approaching the City of Riverside. Dispatch advised the suspect had fire shots at the pursuing officers. I started to respond to the area of Trautwein and Van Buren in case the suspect exited the freeway. The pursuit was updated that the suspect had exited the freeway at Van Buren and was headed west on Van Buren. It was reported the suspect again shot at the pursuing Officers in the area of Van Buren and Barton. The suspect vehicle was described as a grey Chrysler convertible.

The suspect drove west on Van Buren and passed Trautwein at approximately 1953 hours. I joined the pursuit as the fourth vehicle. The suspect was driving at a high rate of speed reaching speed of approximately 110 m.p.h. and was driving on the wrong side of the road at times. The third Police Unit in the pursuit was a Riverside Sheriff's Department K9 Unit. They pulled out when I joined the pursuit and I became the third unit behind two Hemet Police units. I continued in the pursuit as it traveled the following course:

- Westbound Van Buren at speeds up to 110 m.p.h. and traveling on wrong side of the road at times.
- Eastbound Dufferin at speeds up to 100 m.p.h and running stop signs at the intersections with Jackson and Monroe
- Northbound Gratton
- Westbound Victoria on wrong side of the road and speeds up to 80 m.p.h
- Southbound Jackson with speeds up to 60 m.p.h.
- Westbound Dufferin
- Northbound Harrison and ran the stop signs at intersections of Victoria, Lincoln, and Glenbrook and ran the red light at Indiana
- Eastbound Indiana with speeds up to 70 m.p.h and ran the red light at Van Buren

As the pursuit approached Monroe the Hemet Police Units pulled out of the pursuit and other Riverside Police Units became involved in the pursuit. I became the second Police unit in the pursuit. The pursuit continued on the following course:

- Northbound Monroe
- Eastbound Magnolia Ave on the wrong side of the road.
- Northbound Adams
- Eastbound California
- Eastbound California onto the transition road to Eastbound Arlington. The suspect vehicle was blocked by other vehicles so it drove over the grass median and sidewalk onto Eastbound Arlington. At this point I became the fourth unit in the pursuit.
- Continued Eastbound Arlington on the wrong side of the road
- Northbound Palomar
- Eastbound Granada
- Southbound Arch
- Westbound El Molino
- Southbound Valencia
- Westbound Arlington

As the vehicle approached Streeter it drove onto the wrong side of the road into oncoming traffic. The suspect vehicle came to a stop and Air1 advised the door was opening. I came to a stop and started to get my Police Service Dog (PSD) out the car in case the suspect attempted to flee on foot. I heard a single gunshot

come from the area where the suspect vehicle was. Due to other Police vehicles between me and the suspect vehicle I did not see who shot.

I ran to the front Police unit with PSD "Rocco". I saw the suspect vehicle stopped facing west. It was against another vehicle facing east. The suspect vehicle's driver side door was open. I could see the left leg of the suspect but nothing else. Commands were given to the suspect to exit the vehicle but he was not responding. It was not known if the suspect still had the gun used to shoot at Officers during the pursuit.

On duty SWAT Officers arrived on scene with an armored vehicle. A tactical plan was devised to approach the vehicle to safely clear it. I maintained a position to the rear of the suspect vehicle using a marked police unit as cover. The SWAT Officers approached the vehicle in the armored vehicle to a position they could see into the vehicle. It was broadcast over the radio that they could see the suspect and he was slumped over with his hand tucked under him. They could not see his hand. A "Less Lethal" round was deployed and they advised he did not react. Sgt Dehdashtian requested I use PSD "Rocco" to contact the driver to see if he would react.

I determined it was safer for PSD "Rocco" to contact the suspect for the following reasons:

- S-1 had been involved in a high speed and dangerous pursuit endangering the public.
- He had shot at Police Officers during the pursuit.
- It was presumed S-1 still had the gun he fired at Officers.
- S-1 actively resisted by failing to yield in the vehicle and now was not responding to commands
- It was not known if the suspect was injured or acting injured to draw Officers out from cover to give him an opportunity to assault them.
- It would be dangerous for Police to move from a position of cover to approach the suspect, giving him the tactical advantage.

PSD "Rocco" was deployed into the car to apprehend the suspect. PSD "Rocco" entered the suspect vehicle from the open driver's side door. He jumped in and bit the suspect. From my position I could not see the suspect or where PSD "Rocco" bit him. The SWAT Officers advised over the radio that PSD "Rocco" had bit the suspect and there was no reaction from the suspect. At that point I gave PSD "Rocco" the command to release the bite and return to me which he did. The SWAT Officers then approached the vehicle and made contact with the suspect.

I cleared the scene at approximately 2210 hours.
