Narrative:

On 07-20-2018, 1946 hours, Riverside Police Department (RPD) Dispatch advised patrol units that Hemet Police were currently involved in a vehicle pursuit on the 215-freeway heading towards the City of Riverside. An occupant of the suspect vehicle was shooting at pursuing officers during the vehicle pursuit. The suspect vehicle exited Van Buren Blvd. and headed west on Van Buren into our jurisdiction.

I began responding in the direction of the pursuit from Lime and 14th Street. Hemet Police requested that Riverside Police take over the pursuit. Sergeant Elliott began coordinating RPD units' response in joining the pursuit. Once RPD units were in position to take control of the pursuit, Sergeant Elliott requested Hemet units drop out of the pursuit.

I attempted to get into position to deploy spike strips at Monroe and Victoria. Due to the excessive speeds of the suspect vehicle, I was not able to make it to this location in time to deploy the spike strips.

The suspect continued to evade pursuing officers until he began traveling the wrong direction on Arlington Avenue at Streeter. An officer involved shooting (OIS) occurred on Arlington Avenue just east of Streeter. I arrived on-scene just a few minutes after the OIS occurred and approached the first police vehicle that was positioned directly behind the suspect vehicle. Officers began a felony car stop and were ordering the suspect to raise his hands in the air. We did not see any movement from the suspect. I went back to my police unit and obtained a ballistic shield for the contact officers to use during the felony car stop.

RPD SWAT-METRO Officers began arriving on-scene. Sergeant Dedhastian told me that the METRO armored vehicle was en-route to the location and requested I coordinate the removal of several police vehicles that were blocking the path of the armored vehicle. I began coordinating the removal of these vehicles just prior to the armored vehicles arrival.

Once in position, the METRO team and K-9 Officer Feimer rendered the suspect vehicle safe for approach. (Please see their supplemental reports for details)

Riverside Fire Department (RFD) Engine 5 arrived on-scene to provide medical aid to the suspect. Sergeant Pete Elliott and I escorted RFD Medic Kristen Johnson to the open driver side door of the suspect vehicle. The remaining RFD personnel from Engine 5 remained just outside the immediate crime-scene area on the opposite side of the center median in the westbound lanes of Arlington Avenue.

Medic Kristen Johnson observed the suspect seated in the driver's seat of the suspect vehicle while standing just outside the open driver's side door. Medic Kristen said she observed obvious signs that the suspect was deceased. Medic Kristen checked to see if the suspect was breathing or had a pulse. She did not locate a pulse and the suspect was not breathing. She pronounced the suspect deceased at 2059 hours. I then escorted Medic Kristen outside the immediate crime scene and back to their RFD unit.

I then contacted RPD Officer Anthony Watkins who was one of the initial RPD Officers to join in the pursuit. I asked Officer Watkins if he knew the location of where the suspect fired at pursuing officers during the pursuit. Based on information broadcasted by the initial Hemet Officer who was directly behind the suspect vehicle, Officer Watkins believed the suspect fired at officers in the westbound lanes of Van Buren Blvd. between Barton and Trautwein.

Officer Watkins, Officer McGuigan and I responded to Van Buren and Orange Terrace to begin the search for any evidence. While en-route to this location, I was contacted over the phone by Sergeant Lomeli. Sergeant Lomeli received information from the initial Hemet pursuing officer. The Hemet Officer believed the suspect fired a handgun at their pursuing units on Van Buren Blvd. near the Gless Ranch fruit stand. [REDACTED]

Officer Watkins, Officer McGuigan and I began the search for evidence on Van Buren Blvd. at Orange Terrace. We searched the #1 and #2 westbound lanes of Van Buren Blvd. We also searched the center island, which divides the eastbound and westbound lanes of Van Buren Blvd. We continued the search west on Van Buren Blvd. to the Jack in the Box restaurant located at [REDACTED]. The area we searched included the westbound lanes directly in front of and several hundred yards west of the Gless Ranch fruit stand. We did not locate any spent casings, bullet fragments or other items of evidence during the search.

I responded back to the scene of the OIS. Sergeant Pete Elliott provided a briefing of the incident to members of the Robbery-Homicide Unit. At the conclusion of the briefing, I cleared the scene.
